CAROLINA PANTHERS (1-1) vs. NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (2-0)

CAROLINA HOSTS NEW ENGLAND FOR FIRST HOME GAME OF 2016 PRESEASON

CAROLINA VS. NEW ENGLAND

Carolina plays its first home game of the preseason when New England visits Charlotte on Friday. The teams are meeting for the third consecutive preseason.

New England comes to Carolina following a 23-22 victory over Chicago. Carolina is also coming off of a victory, a 26-16 win at Tennessee.

Against Tennessee, the Panthers got off to a fast start thanks to wide receiver Ted Ginn, Jr. who ran past the Tennessee secondary for a 61-yard touchdown on the Panthers first possession.

The Titans threatened to answer right back, but Panthers cornerback Bene Benwikere intercepted quarterback Marcus Mariota's pass in the red zone.

Late in the first quarter, Graham Gano converted a 41-yard field goal to make it 10-0. Tennessee reached the end zone in the second quarter when Mariota connected with Harry Douglas for a 23-yard touchdown.

Linebacker A.J. Klein deflected quarterback Matt Cassel's pass over the middle, and rookie cornerback Zack Sanchez came down with the interception that led to a 23-yard Gano field goal to make it 13-7 at halftime.

The Titans cut into the Panthers' lead early in the second half, as Ryan Succop converted a 48-yard field goal.

Later in the third quarter, safety Colin Jones forced Titans running back David Cobb to fumble deep in his own territory, and linebacker David Mayo recovered. Two plays later, Derek Anderson found wide receiver Kevin Norwood for an 8-yard touchdown. Gano missed the point after attempt, leaving the Panthers with a 19-10 lead.

The game was suspended for 30 minutes due to lightning in the area with 1:34 remaining in the third quarter.

Joe Webb connected with running back Jalen Simmons for a 6-yard touchdown to make it 26-10 with six minutes remaining the game. Titans tight end Alex Ellis scored a touchdown immediately after the two-minute warning and the two-point try failed.

The Panthers continue the preseason with the team's first home game as the New England Patriots visit Bank of America Stadium on Friday. The game marks the ninth preseason meeting between the teams and the third in as many years. The teams previously met in the preseason for four consecutive years between 1999-2002 and again in 2004, 2007, 2014 and 2015. The Panthers and Patriots have met six times in the regular season and playoffs, including Super Bowl XXXVIII.

THE HEAD COACHES



Ron RIVERA

NFL: 20th season

Ron Rivera became the fourth coach in Carolina Panthers history on January 11, 2011.

In five seasons, Rivera has guided the team to a Super Bowl appearance, an NFC Championship and three NFC South titles. He is a two-time (2013 and 2015) Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year award winner.

In 2015, Rivera led the Panthers to the second Super Bowl appearance in team history following a franchise-best 15-1 record and their third consecutive NFC South championship. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0, joining the 1972 Miami Dolphins, 2007 New England Patriots and 2009 Indianapolis Colts. Carolina's 18-game regular season winning streak was the longest in NFC history. In 2014, Rivera led the Panthers to their second consecutive NFC South championship and the team's first playoff win since 2005. The Panthers became the first team since 1970 to overcome a six-game losing streak and win their division. In 2013, Rivera directed Carolina to 12 wins, the NFC South title and its first playoff appearance since 2008.

Before joining the Panthers, Rivera was an assistant coach with the San Diego Chargers (2007-2010), Chicago Bears (2004-06, 1997-98) and Philadelphia Eagles (1999-2003). In 2006, the Bears defense led the NFL with 44 takeaways, helping propel Chicago to an appearance in Super Bowl XLI. He is just the third Latino head coach in NFL history, joining Tom Flores with the Oakland Raiders (1979-1987) and Seattle Seahawks (1992-94) and Tom Fears with the New Orleans Saints (1967-1970).

A second-round draft choice in 1984 by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he was a member of the 1985 Super Bowl XX winning team.

Rivera played linebacker at Cal (1980-83), where he finished as the school's all-time leader in sacks (22) and tackles (336).

Born January 7, 1962 in Fort Ord, Calif., Rivera and his wife, Stephanie, have two children—Christopher and Courtney.

Bill BELICHICK

NFL: 42nd season

Patriots: 17th season

Bill Belichick is in his 42nd season as an NFL coach and his 17th season as head coach of the New England Patriots.

Belichick has led the Patriots to 15 consecutive winning seasons (2001-14). The only other NFL coach to have at least 10 consecutive winning seasons with one team since the 1970 merger was Tom Landry, who led the Dallas Cowboys to 16 consecutive winning seasons (1970-1985).

Through 16 seasons with New England, Belichick has delivered four Super Bowl championships, six conference titles, 13 division crowns and 22 playoff victories.

Belichick won his fourth Super Bowl title in 2014 with the Patriots 28-24 victory over Seattle to match Pittsburgh's Chuck Noll for the most Super Bowl wins by a head coach.

He is one of five NFL head coaches to win four or more championships since the league began postseason play in 1933. Belichick is the only of those five to win three titles in a four-year span with Super Bowl wins in 2001 and back-to-back Super Bowl wins in 2003 and 2004.

With the victory over Indianapolis in the 2014 AFC Championship, Belichick collected his 21st career postseason win, the most postseason wins by a head coach. He expanded on that record with his 22nd postseason win in Super Bowl XLIX and in the 2015 AFC Divisional round to reach 23 career postseason wins.

Belichick launched his coaching career in 1975 with the Baltimore Colts and continued as an assistant coach with Detroit (1976-77), Denver (1978) and the New York Giants (1979-1990). Belichick was named head coach of the Cleveland Browns in 1991. Belichick then spent three seasons with the New York Jets from 1997 to 1999.

A few notes on Carolina's 2016 opponents:

- The Panthers will face six teams that qualified for the playoffs and will play 12 of their 16 games against teams that went 7-9 or better.
- The combined record of the opponents for Carolina's 16 games is 113-143, a .441 winning percentage that matches the New York Jets for the lowest in the NFL. Carolina's schedule would be more difficult than anyone else in the NFC South if not for the fact that the Panthers' 15-1 record means they contribute 30 victories versus two losses to the strength of schedule for Atlanta, New Orleans and Tampa Bay.
- The Panthers are 17-11 versus the NFC West since division realignment in 2002, highlighted by a 7-3 mark against the Cardinals.
- The Panthers are set to face the Seahawks in the regular season for the fifth consecutive year after facing them just three times in the franchise's first 15 seasons, including two playoff meetings.
- The Panthers are 7-5 against the AFC West since division realignment in 2002.
- In a rematch of Super Bowl 50, Carolina will visit Denver for the first time since 2004.
- Carolina will host San Diego for the first time since 2004.
- The Panthers are slated to fly across the country for games in Seattle, Los Angeles, Oakland and Denver.

NEW TO THE PANTHERS IN 2016

KEY PLAYER ACQUISITIONS

C GINO GRADKOWSKI — UFA '16 (ATL)

Gradkowski, 6-3 and 300 pounds, joins Carolina after one season in Atlanta. In 2015, he played in three games with one start for the Falcons. A fourth-round draft choice (98th overall) by Baltimore in 2012, Gradkowski spent three seasons (2012-14) with the Ravens. He has played in 43 career regular season games with 17 starts, including 16 for the Ravens in 2013.

S TRENTON ROBINSON — FA '16

Robinson spent the past three seasons with Washington, starting a career-high seven games and recording one interception in 2015. His season was cut short after a hamstring injury landed him on injured reserve, and he was later released. Originally a sixth-round draft choice of the San Francisco 49ers in 2012, Robinson's career totals include 38 games played, 88 tackles, two interceptions and four passes defended. He has also been a regular contributor on special teams.

P MIKE SCIFRES — FA '16

Scifres joins the Panthers after spending the previous 13 seasons of his career with the San Diego Chargers. He holds San Diego's franchise career records with a gross average of 45.2 yards and a net average of 38.6 yards. In 2012, he set the Chargers single-season record and ranked third in the NFL with a 48.3-yard gross average. Last season, Scifres generated a gross average of 45.3 yards and a net average of 38.2 yards with 15 punts inside the 20 and a long of 68 yards on 72 punts.

DT PAUL SOLIAI — FA '16

Solai, 6-4 and 345 pounds, joins Carolina after spending the past two seasons with Atlanta. In the 2015 season he played in 14 games with 10 starts at nose tackle for the Falcons, recording 22 tackles (17 solo), five quarterback hits, three tackles for loss and a fumble recovery. A fourth-round draft choice (108th overall) out of Utah in 2007 by the Miami Dolphins, Solai spent his first seven seasons in Miami, earning a Pro Bowl appearance in 2011. In his nine NFL seasons, Solai has appeared in 128 career regular season games with 86 starts, tallying 213 tackles, 5.5 sacks, two forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries.

2016 NFL DRAFT CHOICES

DT VERNON BUTLER, LOUISIANA TECH **D1 '16 (30)**

Butler played in 48 games with 28 starts at Louisiana Tech, gathering 170 tackles, 29.5 tackles for loss, five sacks, nine quarterback pressures, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries and three passes defended. Three of Butler's five career sacks came in his senior season in 2015 when he started 13 games and earned first-team All-Conference USA honors. A year prior, as a junior, Butler started 14 games, tallying 56 tackles, 13.5 tackles for loss - which stood second on the team - one sack, one quarterback pressure, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and one pass defended. He anchored a unit that stood 17th in the nation and led the conference in rushing defense, yielding 118.2 yards per game.

CB JAMES BRADBERRY, SAMFORD **D2 '16 (62)**

Bradberry began his college career at Arkansas State before transferring to Samford. At Samford, he was a three-time All-Southern Conference choice, tallying 128 tackles, eight interceptions and 27 passes defended. Bradberry ranked among the Bulldogs' team leaders in interceptions and passes defended in each of his four seasons. In his final season at Samford, Bradberry was a first-team All-Southern Conference selection, tying for second on the team with two interceptions and ranking first with 11 passes defended. His play helped the Bulldogs lead the conference in pass defense efficiency.

CB DARYL WORLEY, WEST VIRGINIA **D3 '16 (77)**

Worley entered the NFL following his junior season. In three seasons at West Virginia, Worley was a two-time All-Big 12 Conference choice and ranked among the Mountaineers' team leaders in interceptions and passes defended in every season. In his final season at West Virginia, Worley finished seventh in the nation with a team-high six interceptions and led the Big 12 with 12 passes defended, earning first-team all-conference honors.

CB ZACK SANCHEZ, OKLAHOMA **D5 '16 (141)**

Sanchez was a two-time All-Big 12 Conference choice with the Sooners and finished fourth in school history with 15 interceptions before leaving for the NFL after his junior season. He ranked in the top 10 in the nation in interceptions in each of his final two collegiate seasons. As a sophomore in 2014, Sanchez snared six interceptions, tying for ninth in the nation. As a junior in 2015, he nabbed seven interceptions, tied for fifth in the nation, and was named a second-team All-American.

TE BEAU SANDLAND, MONTANA STATE **D7 '16 (252)**

Sandland spent his final two years at Montana State after transferring from Miami (Fla.) and previously playing two seasons at Pierce College in Los Angeles. At Pierce, Sandland was rated the nation's top junior college tight end. After redshirting in 2014, Sandland was named a Football Championship Subdivision second-team All-American and was a first-team All-Big Sky Conference choice. He started 11 games for the Bobcats and led the team with 632 receiving yards and nine receiving touchdowns on 37 receptions, ranking second on the team with an average of 17.1 yards per catch.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2016

- The Panthers defense will look to rank in the top 10 for the fifth consecutive season. The Panthers are one of two teams (Seattle) to rank in the top 10 in each of the past four seasons.
- Kicker Graham Gano needs 27 points to pass Steve Smith (454 from 2001-13) for second on the Panthers all-time scoring list.
- With 996 passing yards, Cam Newton will pass Jake Delhomme (19,258 from 2003-09) for the most in franchise history. Newton also needs 252 attempts, 141 completions, four passing touchdowns and one 300-yard passing game to break Delhomme's other franchise records (2,669 attempts, 1,580 completions, 120 passing touchdowns and 11 300-yard passing games).
- Tight end Greg Olsen needs 16 receiving yards to pass Steve Jordan (6,307 from 1982-94) for 10th all-time in receiving yards by an NFL tight end. With four touchdown receptions, Olsen will move into the top 10 all-time in touchdown receptions among NFL tight ends.
- With 115 starts entering the 2016 season, linebacker Thomas Davis and center Ryan Kalil have the chance to move into the top five in franchise history for career starts. Julius Peppers ranks fifth with 120 starts.

FROM NC TO AUSTRALIA AND BACK

Tight end Eric Wallace signed with the Panthers just before training camp.

At 6-6, 260-pounds, Wallace had the look of an NFL player but he hadn't played the American version of football since high school, more than a decade earlier.

"Coming back, the decision was whether I'd play basketball again or continue along the football path and put pads on again," said Wallace, a former college basketball player who returned to his native North Carolina in November after playing Australian Rules Football for three years. "I hadn't played football since I was 14."

Wallace's decision to chase his dream, no matter how long delayed, paid off July 25 when the Panthers signed the tight end.

In early July, just months after putting on pads for the first time since high school, Wallace approached wide receiver coach Ricky Proehl at his training facility in Greensboro, N.C.

"I walked into his office and told him I wanted to play for the Carolina Panthers," Wallace said. "It was a short chuckle at first, and then he was like, 'Are you serious?' I was."

Wallace worked out for Proehl the next day, running the 40-yard dash in 4.6 seconds. Two days before players reported to training camp in Spartanburg, S.C., Wallace worked out for other Carolina coaches. Hours later, he signed.

Wallace stopped playing football at Glenn High School in Kernersville, N.C., more than a dozen years ago to concentrate on basketball. It paid off in the form of playing time at three different colleges - Ohio State, DePaul and Seattle. In the summer of 2012, Wallace was looking into the possibility of playing pro basketball overseas when he was approached about participating in an Australian Rules Football combine.

"August came, I was like, 'It's a free trip to L.A. Why not?'" Wallace said. "Out of about 35 of us, three of us got invited to the real combine in Melbourne, Australia. Out of those three, North Melbourne signed me."

Wallace ended up playing three seasons in Australia as a ruckman.

"The big guy who enforces things, kind of like a basketball center," he explained. "It's a very physical sport, with no pads. It's fast-paced, nonstop like basketball. Guys are clearing half-marathon numbers during a game. It's also highly skilled. Everybody has to be able to kick, run, catch."

"It's a different physicality. The AFL is more free flow where you've got a man and you guard him. The NFL, it's more head-to-head, trying to stop a 270-pound man running at you."

Wallace decided to return to American football after getting advice from some former NFL players he knows, among them defensive end Simeon Rice. Wallace got his foot in the door by scoring an invitation to the New Orleans Saints' rookie minicamp, and now he's come full circle by returning to play football in his home state.

NEWTON NAMED NFL MVP



Cam Newton

Quarterback Cam Newton was named the NFL's Most Valuable Player last season.

Newton, who also won Offensive Player of the Year, finished the 2015 regular season with a league-leading 45 total touchdowns, becoming the first player in league history to compile at least 30 passing touchdowns and 10 rushing touchdowns in a single season.

In addition to his career-high 35 touchdown passes, Newton posted 3,837 passing yards, 636 rushing yards and a 99.4 passer rating.

With Newton directing the unit, Carolina produced the top scoring offense in the NFL for the first time in franchise history with 31.3 points per game. He tossed five touchdown passes in three games this season – something he never accomplished in his first four years.

Newton orchestrated four game-winning drives in 2015, tied for the most in the NFL, and posted a 106.3 passer rating in the fourth quarter. He executed at an extremely high level in the red zone, tossing 24 touchdowns with zero interceptions.

Newton is the only quarterback in NFL history with 100-plus touchdown passes (117) and 25-plus rushing touchdowns (43) in his first five seasons.

He's also the only player in NFL history to record five seasons with at least 3,000 passing yards and 500 rushing yards.

RIVERA NAMED NFL COACH OF THE YEAR

Ron Rivera was named the 2015 NFL Coach of the Year after guiding the Panthers to an appearance in Super Bowl 50.

Under Rivera, who also won Coach of the Year following the 2013 season, the Panthers became just the seventh team in the Super Bowl era to go 15-1 or better in the regular season.

Prior to Rivera's arrival in 2011, the Panthers had never gone to the playoffs in consecutive years and no team had ever won the NFC South division twice in a row. Carolina earned its third consecutive NFC South title in 2015 and claimed the top seed in the conference for the first time in franchise history.

The Panthers started 14-0 this season, which, combined with four victories to close the 2014 regular season, gave Carolina an NFC-record 18-game winning streak.

Rivera's commitment to running the ball and playing stout defense has led to success. The Panthers have produced 27 consecutive regular season games with at least 100 rushing yards, the longest active streak in the NFL. Carolina's defense has finished in the top 10 for four straight years.

Carolina's 15-win season marks just the seventh time in NFL history a team has finished with 15 regular season wins. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0, joining the 1972 Miami Dolphins, 2007 New England Patriots and 2009 Indianapolis Colts.

The Panthers suffered their only loss of the 2015 regular season in Week Sixteen at Atlanta (12/27/15). The loss ended a streak of 18 consecutive regular season wins. The 18-game win streak is the longest in NFC history, surpassing the 15-game streak by the San Francisco 49ers from 1989-90 and the Green Bay Packers from 2010-11.

HOLD THE LINE

In 2014, Carolina started eight different offensive line combinations, one of five teams to start at least that many combinations, joining Indianapolis (11), Chicago (8), New England (8) and San Francisco (8).

The Panthers found offensive line consistency at the end of the season, starting the same line in the final five games of the regular season and both playoff contests. The consistency helped improve the offense as the Panthers rushed for an NFL-leading 975 yards in the season's final five weeks. The Panthers finished with a 4-1 record in those games.

In 2015, the consistency continued as the combination of tackles Michael Oher and Mike Remmers, guards Andrew Norwell and Trai Turner, and center Ryan Kalil started 12-of-16 games for Carolina. Kalil missed the Week Eight contest vs. Indianapolis (11/2/15) with an ankle injury, and Norwell missed three games from the Week Nine contest vs. Green Bay (11/8/15) to Week Eleven vs. Washington (11/22/15) with a hamstring injury.

With the protection provided by the offensive line, quarterback Cam Newton took the fewest sacks of his career (33) and the line opened holes for the Panthers to rank second in the NFL in rushing, averaging 142.6 yards per game.

BENJAMIN RETURNS TO THE LINEUP

Wide receiver Kelvin Benjamin, the Panthers first-round draft choice in 2014, returns to the lineup in 2016 after missing all of last season with a knee injury.

In 2014, Benjamin ranked third among NFL rookies with 1,008 receiving yards, 73 receptions and nine receiving touchdowns. Fifty of Benjamin's 73 catches resulted in first downs, second among rookies to only New York Giants receiver Odell Beckham, Jr. (57).

That season Benjamin and tight end Greg Olsen finished the year tied for the team lead with 1,008 receiving yards, becoming the first pair of Panthers to each gain 1,000 receiving yards in a single season since Muhsin Muhammad and Patrick Jeffers in 1999.

Benjamin's numbers are the best by a rookie in Panthers history, surpassing Keary Colbert's numbers in 2004 (47 for 754 and five).

Benjamin produced three 100-yard receiving games in his rookie season. The three 100-yard games were the most by a rookie in Panthers history.

In 2015, wide receiver Ted Ginn, Jr. led the Panthers with a career-high 10 touchdown catches. Ginn ranked second on the team with 44 receptions and 739 receiving yards. His 16.8-yard receiving average led the team and ranked eighth in the NFL.

It marked his best season catching the ball since he had 56 catches for 790 yards and two touchdowns in 2008, his second year in the NFL.

Eight of Ginn's 15 touchdown catches in two seasons with Carolina (2013, 2015) have gone for 25 or more yards, including five of 40 or more yards.

In 2014 with Arizona, Ginn totaled 14 catches for 190 yards and no touchdowns.

Ginn had one of his most productive seasons on offense in 2013 in his first stint with the Panthers. He recorded five receiving touchdowns, including a 25-yard game-winner vs. New England (11/18/13). Ginn ended 2013 with 36 catches for 556 yards.

In 31 career regular season games with Carolina (2013, 2015), Ginn has 15 touchdown catches. In 104 career games with other teams, Ginn totaled six touchdown catches.

FOUR MULTI-TD CATCH GAMES FOR GINN

Wide receiver Ted Ginn, Jr. reached a career-high 10 touchdowns in 2015. Ginn is the first Panthers wide receiver with double-digit touchdowns since Steve Smith had 12 in 2005.

Ginn has four games with multiple touchdowns in his career and all came in 2015. Ginn tallied three consecutive games with two touchdown catches from Week Thirteen at New Orleans (12/6/15) to Week Fifteen at the New York Giants (12/20/15). Ginn's six touchdown receptions during that span were the second-most in the NFL behind the seven from Seattle's Doug Baldwin.

Ginn recorded his first game with multiple touchdown catches in Week Four at Tampa Bay (10/4/15), when he recorded a 6-yard touchdown in the second quarter and a 12-yard touchdown in the third quarter.

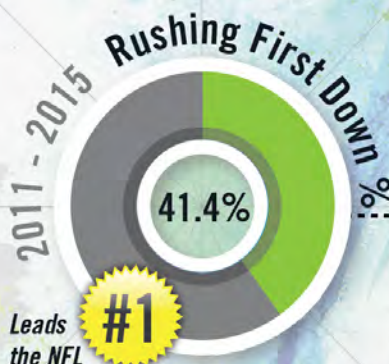

Newton is one of just three players in NFL history, along with Peyton Manning of the Indianapolis Colts from 1998-2002 and Andy Dalton of the Cincinnati Bengals from 2011-15, to have at least 3,000 passing yards in each of their first five seasons.

Newton rushed for 636 yards in 2015, his fifth consecutive of at least 500 rushing yards. Newton joins Randall Cunningham and Michael Vick (six each) as the only quarterbacks with five or more 500-yard rushing seasons in a career. He is the only player in NFL history to have five seasons with 3,000 or more passing yards and 500 or more rushing yards at any point in a career.

In Week Fifteen at the New York Giants (12/20/15), Newton became the first player in NFL history with 300 or more passing yards, five or more passing touchdowns and 100 or more rushing yards in a single game.

OLSEN MOVES UP RECEIVING CHARTS

Tight end Greg Olsen joined the Panthers in 2011 after a trade with the Chicago Bears in exchange for a third-round draft choice. Since then, Olsen has totaled 348 receptions for 4,311 yards and 29 touchdowns, putting him among the team's all-time leaders.

OLSEN LEADS THE WAY AT TIGHT END

In 2015, tight end Greg Olsen tallied a career-high 1,104 receiving yards, his second consecutive season with 1,000 yards. He is just the seventh tight end in NFL history with consecutive 1,000-yard seasons.

Olsen has tallied four consecutive seasons with at least 800 yards and has registered at least 500 yards in seven of the past eight seasons. This is also the third consecutive 70-catch season for Olsen and the sixth 50-catch season of his career. Olsen's seven touchdown catches in 2015 make him the only active NFL tight end with five or more touchdowns in every season since 2008.

Olsen owns the top four single-season reception totals and four of the top five single-season receiving yards totals by a tight end in team history. In 2014, Olsen totaled a career-high 84 receptions, a new Panthers tight end record, surpassing his own team record of 73 catches (2013).

Tight end Greg Olsen has been a consistent presence in NFL lineups since his rookie year in 2007. Olsen has played in 142 consecutive regular season games, the second-longest streak among active tight ends behind Dallas' Jason Witten (203).

A first-round choice (31st overall) by Chicago in 2007, Olsen missed the first two games of that season with a knee injury sustained in the preseason. He made his NFL debut vs. Dallas (9/23/07) and has not missed a game since.

Ealy became the first player to record multiple sacks and an interception in the Super Bowl and was the first player since San Diego's Leslie O'Neal vs. Kansas City (1/2/93) to finish a post-season game with multiple sacks, an interception and a forced fumble.

SHORT RACKS UP SACKS

In 2015, defensive tackle Kawann Short set a Panthers franchise record for sacks by a defensive tackle with 11.0, tied for the most in the NFL. Short produced four games of two or more sacks in 2015, only Houston's J.J. Watt (5) had more.

Short earned his first career Pro Bowl selection and was named NFC Defensive Player of the Week for Week Six, and was a two-time winner of NFC Defensive Player of the Month (October, December).

Short is the first player in franchise history to win multiple Player of the Month Awards in a season. Short is the first player to win multiple NFC Defensive Player of the Month Awards in a season since Green Bay's Charles Woodson in 2009 (September, November, December). He is the first defensive tackle in the NFL to win multiple Player of the Month Awards in a single season. Short joins Julius Peppers (three times) and Mike Rucker (two) as the only Panthers defensive linemen to be named Defensive Player of the Month.

Short earned the Defensive Player of Week award for his two sacks in a 27-23 win at Seattle.

In October, Short had five sacks, three passes defended and a forced fumble as the Panthers posted a 3-0 record. His five sacks were the most by a defensive tackle and tied for the second-most in the NFL during the month.

In December, Short had five sacks, five tackles for a loss, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery as Carolina went 4-1. His five sacks during the month led all defensive tackles and his two forced fumbles tied for the most.



DAVIS PERFORMING AT HIGH LEVEL

In 2015, linebacker Thomas Davis finished second on the team with 123 tackles and career-highs with 5.5 sacks and four interceptions. Davis was the only player in the NFL with five or more sacks and four or more interceptions.

Davis added four forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and six passes defended.

Davis' 123 tackles allowed him to set the Panthers all-time tackles record with 954, surpassing Mike Minter's 953 from 1997-2006.

KUECHLY IS A TACKLING MACHINE

Despite missing three games in 2015, linebacker Luke Kuechly finished 12th in the NFL with 118 tackles according to press box stats.

He led the NFL in tackles in 2012 and 2014. In 2012, he became the first rookie since San Francisco's Patrick Willis in 2007 to lead the NFL in tackles. He finished fourth in 2013 with 156.

Since entering the NFL in 2012, press box crews have credited Kuechly with 591 tackles, the most in the NFL.

After film review, Panthers' coaches have credited Kuechly with 684 career tackles in just four seasons. His eight tackles in Week One at Jacksonville (9/14/15), allowed him to pass Mike Rucker (553 from 1997-2007) for fifth-most all-time in team history. In Week Six at Seattle (10/18/15), Kuechly's 16 tackles allowed him to pass Chris Gamble (558 from 2004-12) for fourth-most in team history.

Kuechly has racked up his tackle totals by owning three of the top five single-season tackle totals in team history, including a team-record 205 stops as a rookie in 2012.

KUECHLY IS THE MAN IN THE MIDDLE

Luke Kuechly has been a fixture in the middle for the Panthers since taking over the starting middle linebacker position in Week Five of 2012.

Since then, Kuechly has been on the field for nearly every play for the Panthers defense. Kuechly has played in 3,463 of a possible 3,852 regular season snaps (89.9%) at middle linebacker, including three and a half games missed due to a concussion.

Kuechly has made a difference for the Panthers defense since arriving to the team as the ninth overall choice in the 2012 NFL Draft. Carolina is one of two teams to field a top 10 defense in each of the last four seasons (2012-15).

Since the start of 2012, Carolina ranks third in the NFL in total defense (323.5 yards per game), fifth in rushing defense (99.7) and fifth in passing defense (223.6).

GANO GETS HIS KICKS

Kicker Graham Gano set the Panthers franchise record with 146 points in 2015, surpassing John Kasay's previous record of 145 in 1996.

Gano has 428 points as a member of the Panthers and is third place on the team's all-time points scored list behind Kasay (1,482 from 1995-2010), and wide receiver Steve Smith (454 from 2001-13).

Gano's 146 points in 2015 ranked second in the NFL behind New England's Stephen

Gostkowski (151).

Gano kicked two game-winning field goals (final two minutes of the fourth quarter or in overtime) in 2015. The first came in Week

Eight vs. Indianapolis (11/2/15) when Gano kicked a 52-yard field goal in overtime to win the game. It was Gano's fifth career game-winning field goal and his first with the Panthers. Gano added his sixth career game-winning field goal in Week Fifteen at the New York Giants (12/20/15) when he kicked a 43-yard field goal as time expired.

Gano earned his first career Player of the Month Award, garnering NFC Special Teams Player of the Month for November after leading the NFL in scoring (62 points) and field goals (15) during the month. Gano was a perfect six-for-six on 48-plus yard field-goal attempts in November and had at least one successful 48-plus yard field goal in all five games. He converted both 50-plus yard field-goal attempts, including the game-winner against Indianapolis.

Gano joins John Kasay (two) as the only Panthers kickers to win Special Teams Player of the Month.

In addition to his field goal abilities, Gano has proved his worth in the field position game. Since the start of 2013, Gano leads the NFL with a 74.2 touchback percentage.

A former NFL linebacker and special teams standout, Chase Blackburn makes his coaching debut as assistant special teams coach with Carolina in 2016 after working with the Panthers as a coaching intern during the 2016 offseason.

In 10 seasons from 2005-14, Blackburn recorded 265 tackles, 4.5 sacks, four interceptions, 10 passes defended and four forced fumbles in 132 games with 45 starts. He also posted 123 tackles, two forced fumble and three fumble recoveries on special teams.

Originally signed as an undrafted rookie free agent by the New York Giants in 2005, Blackburn played eight seasons with the Giants and led the team in special teams tackles for six consecutive years from 2005-10. He earned two Super Bowl rings with the Giants, contributing to their victories in Super Bowls XLII and XLVI.

Blackburn played his final two seasons with the Panthers. In 2013, he was part of special teams units that improved to 13th in The Dallas Morning News special teams rankings one year after ranking last.

Long snapper J.J. Jansen, Blackburn's teammate with Carolina in 2013 and 2014, said, "Chase has always been a coach on the field, even when we played together."
