BILLS RETURN HOME TO TAKE ON PATRIOTS

The Buffalo Bills will return home to face the New England Patriots at Ralph Wilson Stadium on Sunday, October 12th at 1:00 p.m.

Buffalo and New England will meet for the 108th time in the regular season this week. The Bills are 41-65-1 all-time against the Patriots.

With a win over New England on Sunday, Buffalo will:

- *Have sole possession of first place in the AFC East entering Week 7 for the first time since 2008*
- *Start 2-0 against the AFC East for first time since 2005*

The Buffalo Bills announced that **CB Corey Graham**, **RB Fred Jackson**, **LB Brandon Spikes**, **DT Kyle Williams**, **DE Mario Williams** and **C Eric Wood** have been selected by their teammates as the Bills' captains for the 2014 season.

Kyle Williams and **Jackson** are fourth-time captains for Buffalo, while **Wood** is a second-time captain. **Mario Williams**, **Spikes** and **Graham** are all first-time captains for the Bills.

Each player will have a letter 'C' affixed to their uniform to signify this honor. Their responsibilities will include assisting in the on-field communication with the game officials.



LAST GAME: BILLS-LIONS

REGULAR SEASON WEEK 5- Bills 17, Lions 14
October 5, 2014 - Ford Field - 62,775

The Buffalo Bills snapped their two-game losing streak, defeating the Detroit Lions on the road by a score of 17-14. The Bills improve to 3-2 on the season.

QB Kyle Orton impressed in his first start with the team. He completed 308 passing yards on 30-of-43 passing, adding a touchdown pass to TE Chris Gragg in the fourth quarter. It was the first 300-yard passing game for a Bills quarterback since Ryan Fitzpatrick threw for 337 at New England on November 11, 2012.

RB Fred Jackson was once again a dual-threat on offense for Buffalo. He rushed 49 yards on 10 carries and added 58 yards through the air on a season-best seven catches. WR Sammy Watkins also hauled in seven receptions, tallying 87 yards receiving.

K Dan Carpenter connected on three field goals, including the game-winner from 58 yards. Colton Schmidt punted eight times, pinning the Lions inside the 20 three times.

The defense held dangerous Detroit team to just one offensive score and held Calvin Johnson to just one catch. In addition, RB Reggie Bush was allowed just 13 yards rushing. CB Stephon Gilmore intercepted his first pass of the season off of a high throw by Stafford. DT Marcell Dareus tallied a career-high three sacks, while Jerry Hughes turned in two for the game.

The Lions built a 14-0 lead after Matthew Stafford hit WR Golden Tate in the end zone and CB Reshean Mathis jumped in front of a Kyle Orton pass, returning it for a 41-yard touchdown. The Bills stayed alive thanks to two Dan Carpenter field goals, allowing Buffalo to enter the fourth quarter trailing 14-6. Orton led the Buffalo offense on a nine-play 74-yard drive, with a touchdown from Gragg and a Fred Jackson two-point conversion tying the score at 14. After Lions K Alex Henery missed a 50-yard field goal, Orton hit Sammy Watkins for a 20-yard gain that set up a 58-yard field goal attempt from Dan Carpenter. Carpenter split the uprights to send the Bills to 3-2 on the season on the heels of 17 unanswered points.

Leading the way for the Lions offense was WR Golden Tate. With Calvin Johnson forced to exit due to injury, Tate stepped up and hauled in seven catches a game-high 134 yards. The Lions were hurt by three missed field goals from K Alex Henery, along with two turnovers.

FORMER BILLS/PATRIOTS

- Bills linebackers coach **Pepper Johnson** served in several defensive coaching roles for the Patriots from 2000-13. Notably, he was the defensive line coach from 2004-11 and the linebackers coach from 2012-13.
- Bills LB **Brandon Spikes** was drafted by New England in second round (62nd overall) of the 2010 draft, playing for the team from 2010-13.
- Bills TE **Lee Smith** was the 159th pick of the 2011 NFL Draft the Patriots.
- New England LB **Chris White** spent his first two years in the NFL with Buffalo before being traded prior to the 2013 season. He was the team's sixth-round (169th) draft selection in 2011.

AREA CONNECTIONS

- Patriots tight ends coach **Brian Daboll** grew up just 5 miles from Ralph Wilson Stadium in Athol Springs, NY. He attended the University of Rochester, lettering in football and serving as a student coaching assistant.
- Patriots LB **Chandler Jones** was born in Rochester, NY and attended Syracuse University.

NFL CONNECTIONS

- Bills linebackers coach **Pepper Johnson** played under then Giants defensive coordinator **Bill Belichick** from 1986-90, winning Super Bowl XXI and Super Bowl XXV together. **Johnson** also played under **Belichick** with the New York Jets from 1997-98 while the current Patriots head coach was the Jets assistant head coach.
- From 2003-04, Bills special teams coordinator **Danny Crossman** was a special teams assistant under current Patriots special teams coordinator **Scott O'Brien** while he was in the same position for Carolina.
- Bills head coach **Doug Marrone** was in New Orleans as the Saints offensive coordinator from 2006-08, while Patriots LB **Rob Ninkovich** was also there
- Bills offensive line coach **Pat Morris** coached with Patriots wide receiver coach **Chad O'Shea** in Minnesota from 2006-08.
- From 2007-08 Bills T **Erik Pears** and Patriots special teams coordinator **Scott O'Brien** were with the Denver Broncos.
- Patriots WR **Danny Amendola** played for the Rams with Bills G **Chris Williams** in 2012.

COLLEGE CONNECTIONS

- Patriots DE **Chandler Jones** (2008-11) played at Syracuse, where current Bills HC **Doug Marrone** served the same position from 2009-12 and current assistant strength and condition coach **Hal Luther** served as director of strength & conditioning from 2000-12.
- Patriots DE **Chandler Jones** played with Bills WR **Mike Williams** for the Orange form 2008-09.
- Patriots S **Steve Gregory** played at Syracuse from 2002-05 while **Luther** was there.
- Patriots LB **Rob Ninkovich** and Bills QB **Kyle Orton** played at Purdue in 2004, leading the Boilermakers to as high as number five in the polls.
- Bills CB **Ron Brooks**, Patriots WR **Brandon LaFell** and Patriots RB **Stevan Ridley** competed together at LSU in 2008.
- Bills DT **Marcell Dareus** played with Patriots LB **Dont'a Hightower** at Alabama from 2008-09.
- Bills LB **Jerry Hughes** played with Patriots WR **Josh Boyce** and OT **Marcus Cannon** at Texas Christian in 2009.
- Bills S **Duke Williams** shared a locker room at Nevada with Patriots OL **Chris Barker** from 2009-12.
- Bills RB **Boobie Dixon** played at Mississippi State with Patriots LB **Chris White** in 2009.



BILLS PROJECTED STARTERS

OFFENSE

WR Robert Woods - Caught three passes for 37 yards against Detroit. For the season, Woods has 14 receptions for 156 yards. Has a reception in all 19 career games played. Became the 73rd player in franchise history with over 50 receptions in his career.

LT Cordy Glenn - Has started the first five games of the season at left tackle after starting all 16 last season.

LG Chris Williams - Has started three of the five games this season at left guard. Has started 57 of his 72 career games.

C Eric Wood - A team captain for the second time, Wood has started all five games at center. Has started all 68 of his career games.

RG Erik Pears - Made the switch from RT to RG and has started all five games this season. Has started in 75 of his 90 career games.

RT Seantrel Henderson - A seventh round draft pick, Henderson exceeded expectations in training camp and won the starting job at RT. Has started in all five games this season.

TE Scott Chandler - Had four catches for 21 yards against Detroit. Chandler now has a catch in 36 of his last 37 games. One of only eight TEs in Bills history with over 100 catches.

WR Sammy Watkins - Had seven catches for 87 yards against Detroit, including a 20-yard circus catch that setup the gamewinning field goal. For the season, Watkins has 24 catches for 284 yards and two touchdowns. His 24 receptions in his first five games is tied for the most ever by a Bills rookie along with Jerry Butler in 1979.

QB Kyle Orton - Completed 30 of 43 passes for 308 yards and one touchdown in his first start as a Bill against Detroit. With the 308 passing yards, Orton became the fifth NFL QB since 1960 to record 300+ yards in a game with five teams in his career.

RB C.J. Spiller - Ran the ball 10 times for 8 yards and had three receptions for 25 yards against Detroit. Leads the team with 214 yards on 61 carries this season and has averaged a club-record 4.97 yards per rushing attempt in his career.

FB Frank Summers - Had one reception for one yard against Detroit. On the season, Summers has three attempts for 11 yards and three receptions for eight yards.

KEY RESERVES

RB Fred Jackson - Had 11 rush attempts for 50 yards and caught seven passes for 58 yards against Detroit. First Bills RB ever with 6+ receptions in three straight games after recording 8, 6 and 7 in his last three games. Jackson is one of five undrafted players in NFL history with 5,000+ rushing yards in their career.

DEFENSE

DE Mario Williams - Recorded three tackles and a sack against the Lions. On the season, the first-time team captain has 13 tackles, 3.5 sacks and five tackles for a loss.

DT Kyle Williams - Was inactive against the Lions. Had two tackles, a tackled for a loss and a pass defended that led to Nigel Bradham's interception against the Texans. For the season, Williams has 11 tackles, one sack, one interception and four QB hits.

DT Marcell Dareus - Recorded a career-high three sacks against Detroit to go along with five tackles, two tackles for a loss and a forced fumble. Has 19 tackles, five sacks and seven tackles for a loss on the season.

DE Jerry Hughes - Had two sacks, five tackles and a forced fumble in the Bills victory over the Lions and now has 16 tackles and three sacks on the season. Broke through for a career-high 10 sacks in 2013.

LB Preston Brown - The rookie had three tackles against the Lions and now has 43 on the year. His 43 tackles rank second in the NFL amongst his fellow rookies.

LB Nigel Bradham - Was inactive against the Lions. Recorded the first sack and first interception of his career along with three tackles against the Texans. In his three games played on the season, Bradham has recorded 23 tackles.

LB Brandon Spikes - Led the team with six tackles against the Lions and has recorded 19 tackles and a sack so far this season.

CB Leodis McKelvin - Recorded five tackles and a pass defended against the Lions and now has 28 tackles on the season.

CB Stephon Gilmore - Had four tackles and an interception against the Lions. Now has 15 tackles on the season.

S Da'Norris Searcy - Recorded one tackle in the victory against the Lions. For the season, has recorded 14 tackles and one pass defended.

S Aaron Williams - Had four tackles in the victory against the Lions. Williams has 32 tackles and two passes defended on the season.

KEY RESERVES

LB Keith Rivers - Has 10 tackles for the season in his three games played.

S Duke Williams - Recorded three tackles against Detroit. For the season, the second-year man has 19 tackles and one pass defended.



NEW FACES AT ONE BILLS DRIVE

2014 VETERAN ADDITIONS

RB Bryce Brown acquired by Buffalo via trade with the Philadelphia Eagles on May 10, 2014 after being drafted by the Eagles in the seventh round (229th overall) of the 2012 NFL Draft. Has played in 32 career games with 5 starts and has carried the ball 190 times for 878 yards and six touchdowns. Brown also broke the Eagle's single-game rookie rushing record with 178 yards in his first NFL start vs. Carolina on November 26, 2012.

RB Boobie Dixon signed by the Bills on March 15, 2014 after being drafted by the 49ers in the sixth round (173rd overall) of the 2010 NFL Draft. He's played in 69 career games with one start and has carried the ball 155 times for 521 yards and eight touchdowns.

K Jordan Gay signed with the Bills on August 26, 2014. He spent part of the 2013 season and 2014 offseason with the New York Giants. Has played in five career games and has 21 touchbacks on 26 kickoffs.

CB Corey Graham signed by the Bills on March 12, 2014 after playing the last two seasons with the Baltimore Ravens. Originally selected by the Bears in the fifth round (168th overall) of the 2007 NFL Draft. The 2011 Pro Bowler has played in 114 career games with 25 starts and has recorded 246 career tackles and 11 interceptions.

QB Kyle Orton signed with the Bills on August 29, 2014. Has completed 30-of-43 pass attempts for 308 yards, one touchdown and one interception on the season. He has started 71-of-76 career games over a nine-year career that has spanned five teams. He has accumulated 15,327 passing yards, 84 touchdowns and 1,356 completions. Orton owns a 36-35 record as a starter.

LB Keith Rivers entered the NFL as a first-round (ninth overall) draft selection of the Cincinnati Bengals in 2008 and spent his first four years with the Bengals before joining the Giants in 2012. He has 272 tackles (178 solo) and three sacks in 65 NFL career games (49 starts).

P Colton Schmidt signed with the Bills on August 30th. He spent the 2014 preseason with San Francisco. Schmidt entered the league as an undrafted free agent in 2013 with the 49ers. Has played five games and has pinned 12 of his 31 punts in the opponent's 20.

LB Brandon Spikes signed with the Bills as a free agent on March 15, 2014 after originally entering the NFL as the second-round (62d overall) pick of the Patriots in the 2010 NFL Draft. Has started 41 of his 56 career games and recorded 303 tackles (184 solo), 2.0 sacks, 13 pass break-ups, two interceptions, six forced fumbles and 16 tackles for a loss.

G Chris Williams signed with the Bills on March 12, 2014 after playing two seasons with the Rams. Was drafted by the Bears in the first round (14th overall) of the 2008 NFL Draft. Has played in 72 career games with 57 starts.

WR Mike Williams was acquired in a trade with the Buccaneers on April 4, 2014. Originally selected in the 4th round (101st overall) in the 2010 NFL Draft by the Buccaneers. Has 223 receptions for 3,089 yards and 26 touchdowns in his NFL career.

DE Jarius Wynn signed by Buffalo on April 8, 2014 after previously spending time with the Cowboys, Chargers, Titans and Packers. Has started 6 of his 63 career games played and has 53 tackles and 8.5 sacks.

2014 ROOKIE DRAFT CLASS

WR Sammy Watkins (1st, 4th overall) played three seasons at Clemson (2011-13) and finished his collegiate career with 240 receptions for 3,391 yards and 27 touchdowns. Set the school record for receptions and receiving yards and tied the school record for receiving touchdowns. Added 1,376 yards on 60 kickoff returns (22.93 avg) and totaled 5,129 all-purpose yards for his career. He ranks second in ACC history for career receptions and third in conference history for receiving yards and his 5,129 all-purpose yards rank second in school history behind fellow Bill C.J. Spiller. Has started all five games in his NFL career and has 24 receptions for 284 yards and two touchdowns.

T Cyrus Kouandjio (2nd, 44th overall) played at the University of Alabama for three years (2011-13) and started 27 of his 35 career games played while a member of the Crimson Tide. He registered 244 knockdowns during his two seasons in the starting lineup and was a consensus 2013 All-American and a two-time National Champion (2012-13).

LB Preston Brown (3rd, 73rd overall) played four years at Louisville (2010-13) and started 37 of 52 career games played while finishing his career with 301 tackles, seven sacks, 26 tackles for a loss, three forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, five passes defensed and one in-terception. He became just the 12th player to lead the team in tackles in multiple seasons since the Cardinals officially started compiling defensive records in 1962. Has started all five games and ranks among all rookies with 43 tackles.

CB Ross Cockrell (4th, 109th overall) attended Duke University for five years (2009-13) and started all 49 career games played at Duke finishing his career with 233 tackles, seven sacks, 12 interceptions and 42 passes broken up. He was a team captain in 2012 and 2013. Named a two-time first team All-ACC selection in 2012 and 2013 and received an honorable mention All-America selection in 2012. Over his collegiate career, he was a four-time All-ACC Academic honoree and finished ranked first in passes defensed and passes broken up in school history.

G Cyril Richardson (5th, 153rd overall) attended Baylor University for five years (2009-13) and started 42 of his 51 career games played as a Bear. A two-time All-American offensive lineman and the only player to be a two-time Big 12 Offensive Lineman of the Year, he won the 2013 Jim Parker Award and was a finalist for the 2013 Outland Trophy. Played predominantly left guard in college, but also spent time at left tackle. Has started the past two games at LG.

LB Randell Johnson (7th, 221st overall) attended Florida Atlantic for five years (2009-13) and saw action in 42 games and amassed 195 tackles and matched the school record for tackles for a loss (30.5). Has played in three games and has one fumble recovery on special teams.

T Seantrel Henderson (7th, 237th overall) played at the University of Miami for four years (2010-13) and started 26 of his 43 career games played as a Hurricane. A two-time All-ACC honoree, he finished his collegiate career with 211 knockdowns and 25 touchdown-resulting blocks. Has started all five games at right tackle.



MARRONE IN YEAR ONE

Doug Marrone was named the 16th head coach in Buffalo Bills history on January 7, 2013 and he quickly went about establishing a new culture at One Bills Drive.



Marrone instilled a coaching philosophy in his first year that is centered around the phrase ‘What it means to be a Buffalo Bill,’ a belief he and his coaching staff share that holds players accountable and prepares them to be mentally and physically tough.

Buffalo accomplished several feats under Marrone in 2013 as the team finished the season with a 6-10 mark. The offensive unit paced the AFC and finished second in the NFL with an average of 144.2 rushing yards per game and led the league with a 95.5-percent red zone efficiency mark. The Bills’ defense established a team record with 57.0 sacks – second-most in the NFL and an AFC-best – while recording 23 interceptions, also a conference high and second in the League.

Four players earned Pro Bowl recognition honors following the 2013 campaign under Coach Marrone – FS Jairus Byrd, DT Marcell Dareus, DT Kyle Williams and DE Mario Williams – to mark the first time since 2004 that more than four Bills defenders were selected to the annual game.

Marrone also saw extensive contributions from several members of the team’s 2013 rookie class. QB EJ Manuel made 10 starts and set team rookie records for passing touchdowns (11) and completions (180). WR Robert Woods finished fifth in the NFL among the 2013 rookie class hauling in 40 catches for 587 yards and three touchdowns. LB Kiko Alonso started each of the team’s 16 games and led the team with 159 tackles – third-most by an NFL defender.

2014 COACHING CHANGES

Head Coach Doug Marrone made several changes to his coaching staff during the 2014 offseason. In addition to promoting Jason Rebrovich from Defensive Quality Control coach to Assistant Defensive Line coach, Marrone also brought some new faces to the staff.

Marrone tabbed Jim Schwartz to be the Defensive Coordinator, Thad Bogardus as Defensive Quality Control coach, Todd Downing as the Quarterbacks coach, Jim Hostler as Senior Offensive Assistant, Pepper Johnson as Defensive Line coach, Rob Moore as Wide Receivers coach and Fred Pagac as Linebackers coach.

Jim Schwartz will enter his 21st year in the NFL coaching ranks and ninth as a defensive coordinator. He served in the same capacity with the Tennessee Titans from 2001-08, overseeing a defense that finished in the top 10 in both rushing yards allowed per game (5th-103.5) and third down conversion rate (6th-36.1%) during his tenure. He served as the Head Coach of the Detroit Lions for the last five seasons, leading them to the playoffs in 2011.

Thad Bogardus will enter his first season in the NFL coaching ranks after spending the past three seasons with Ball State as a graduate assistant. He began his time with the Cardinals in 2011 as a football operations graduate assistant before working as a defensive graduate assistant in 2012 and 2013.

Todd Downing will enter his 12th year in the NFL coaching ranks and fourth as a quarterbacks coach. He served in the same capacity with the Detroit Lions from 2011-13, helping Lions QB Matthew Stafford become the Lions’ franchise leading passer (17,457 career passing yards) in 2013.

Jim Hostler comes to Buffalo with 15 years of NFL coaching experience, including the past six seasons as the Baltimore Ravens’ wide receivers coach. During his time with the Ravens, Hostler oversaw a receiving corps that played an integral role in the team’s 2012 Super Bowl championship. During the 2012 campaign, the Ravens’ wideouts finished second in franchise history for most receiving yards during a single season with 3,996

A five-time Super Bowl champion, **Pepper Johnson** will enter his 15th year coaching in the NFL in 2014. Johnson has spent the past 14 seasons working for the New England Patriots, serving in a variety of roles including eight seasons (2004-11) as the team’s defensive line coach. During his 13-year playing career, Johnson was a part of two championship teams and has been a member of three championship teams since joining New England’s coaching staff in 2000.

Rob Moore will enter his first season in the NFL coaching ranks after spending the past four seasons as the wide receivers coach for Syracuse University. As a player, in 153 games played (146 starts), Moore registered 628 receptions for 9,368 yards and 49 touchdowns en route to earning Pro Bowl honors in 1994 and 1997, in addition to All-Pro honors during the 1997 season.

Fred Pagac comes to Buffalo after spending the past eight seasons with the Minnesota Vikings. During his time with the Vikings, Pagac helped lead the Vikings’ defense to four top 10 finishes in total defense including three straight top-10 finishes from 2008-10.



SCHWARTZ BRINGING A NEW LOOK

After five years as the head coach of the Detroit Lions, new defensive coordinator is returning to his roots on the defensive side of the ball.

While with Detroit, the Lions defense saw marked improvement and turned in impressive numbers each year.



- In 2013, the Lions' D finished first in the NFL in third down efficiency by limiting opponents to a 30.3 percent (64-of-211) conversion rate. They were also first in goal-to-go defense by holding opposing teams to just a 77.3 percent conversion rate.
- In 2012, the Lions finished at least 16th or higher in both rush (16th) and pass (14th) defense for the first time since 1993.
- The Lions returned seven fumbles or interceptions for touchdowns in 2011, which is a franchise record

Schwartz made his reputation on defense while serving as the defensive coordinator for the Tennessee Titans from 2001 to 2008. Schwartz's defense in Tennessee thrived in two major categories, rushing defense and third down conversions.

Over the course of his eight seasons running the Titans defense, the team ranked fifth in rushing yards allowed per game (103.3) and sixth in third down conversion rate at a percentage of 36.1.

- The Titans allowed just nine rushers over 100 yards in 64 home games under Schwartz
- Schwartz was a defensive assistant/quality control coach on the 1999 Titans team that went to Super Bowl XXXIV
- Started his career as a college and pro scout under Bill Belichick with the Cleveland Browns

CROSSMAN ON SPECIAL TEAMS

Danny Crossman enters his second year as the Bills special teams coordinator looking to continue garnering positive results from all four phases.

- K Dan Carpenter had the most productive season of his career under Crossman last year as he tied a Bills record with 33 field goals and set a career-high with 131 points. Carpenter's field goal conversion rate of 91.67 percent was the second highest percentage in team history
- WR Marcus Easley flourished as a gunner under Crossman as he led the NFL with 23 special teams tackles

HACKETT MIXING IT UP

In his first year as an NFL offensive coordinator with the Bills in 2013, the offense was highlighted by the explosive backfield duo of RBs Fred Jackson and C.J. Spiller.

RB Fred Jackson had 11 rush attempts for 50 yards and caught seven passes for 58 yards against Detroit. First Bills RB ever with 6+ receptions in three straight games after recording 8, 6 and 7 in his last three games. Jackson has 202 yards on 43 rush attempts, which is good for 30th in the NFL.



Jackson tied a career-high with eight receptions for 78 yards and the 35th touchdown of his career in the Week Three loss to San Diego.

Jackson joined 24 other players as he is now one of 25 undrafted players to score 35 or more career touchdowns.

Jackson produced the highlight play of the season opening win when he took a handoff from EJ Manuel and bruised his way 38 yards down the field to the Chicago one-yard line before Dan Carpenter hit the game-winning 27-yard field goal. Overall, Jackson had 61 yards on seven carries.

The return was Spiller's 20th touchdown of his career and 2nd of the season. 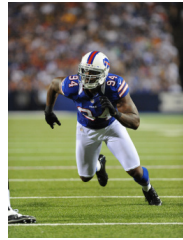

DE Mario Williams, a captain for the first time in his career, has gotten his third season as a Buffalo Bill off to a good start by recording 3.5 sacks and 13 tackles through the first five games. DT Kyle Williams - who was voted to be a captain by his teammates for the third time - has continued his dominating play so far in the 2014 season before picking up an injury in Week Four. Williams was inactive against Detroit. In the loss to Houston, Williams had two tackles, one tackle for a loss and one pass defended before leaving with an injury. Against Miami, Williams recorded the 30th sack of his career.

Williams made a big impact in a way he never had before during the Bills season opening victory over the Chicago Bears.

Late in the 4th quarter, Williams recorded the first interception of his Pro Bowl career when he stepped in front of Bears QB Jay Cutler's pass intended for TE Martellus Bennett. The Bills kicked a field goal on the ensuing drive to take a 20-17 lead.

DT Marcell Dareus has been absolutely dominant this season through the first five games. After recording a career-high 3.0 sacks against Detroit, he has 5.0 sacks, 19 tackles, seven tackles for a loss and one forced fumble on the season.

HUGHES BREAKS OUT

Hughes was acquired via trade with the Indianapolis Colts prior to the 2013 season. GILMORE ON THE CORNER

CB Stephon Gilmore had four tackles and an interception in the Bills game against Detroit in Week Five, after recording three tackles against Houston in Week Four. He recorded six tackles and one tackle for a loss in the Bills 22-10 loss to the Chargers. Gilmore had two tackles on the day in the 29-10 victory against Miami. He was inactive for the season opener at Chicago.

Gilmore played in 11 games (nine starts) in the 2013 season after returning from a wrist injury and recorded 35 tackles and 10 passes defended - his second straight season with double-digit pass break-ups.

Since entering the NFL as the team's first-round (10th overall) selection in 2012, Gilmore has been credited with 26 passes defended, tying for fourteenth among AFC cornerbacks since his rookie season.

Gilmore is also known for his physical style of play which has helped lead him to force three fumbles so far in his career, which ties for the eighth most amongst all NFL cornerbacks since he entered the league:

Bradham recorded the first sack and the first interception of his NFL career in the Bills Week Four loss to Houston.

Bradham was the first Bill with a sack and an interception in one game since Jairus Byrd had 1 sack and two interceptions against the Jets on 11/17/13. Bradham is the first linebacker with the interception-sack combo since Kiko Alonso did it against Carolina on 9/15/13.

MCKELVIN BOASTS CAREER HIGH

CB/PR Leodis McKelvin had five tackles and a pass defended against the Lions. For the season, McKelvin has 28 tackles and three passes defended.



McKelvin recorded a career-high 13 tackles in the season opening victory against Chicago on Sunday. McKelvin also chipped in with a forced fumble in the 2nd quarter which led to a FG that gave the Bills a 10-7 lead. He also had one punt return for 14 yards.

McKelvin had a career year in 2013. The six-year veteran led the Bills with a personal best 20 passes defended and set a career mark with 71 tackles in 15 games played (13 starts).

His 20 passes defended in 2013 were nine more than his previous best of 11 in 2010. McKelvin finished tied for third in the NFL in the defensive category and tied for second most in a single season by a Bill since 2000:

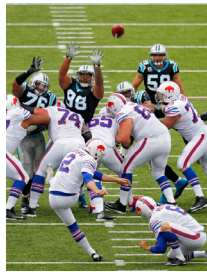
Graham made his Bills debut at Chicago and recorded three tackles, three passes defended, and recorded the 11th interception of his career.

Against his former team, Carpenter tied a career-high with five field goals and set a career-high with 17 points. Against Chicago, Carpenter was named the Special Teams Player of the Week for hitting all three of his field goal attempts and both extra points. Carpenter nailed the game-winning 27-yard field goal in OT and also hit a 50-yard field goal earlier in the game. Carpenter hit his lone field goal attempt in the windy conditions during the Bills 22-10 loss to the Chargers. Hit both of his extra points and a 31-yard field goal against Houston. With those five points, Carpenter surpassed 700 for his career.



Carpenter currently is tied for fifth in the NFL with 46 points after going 13/15 on field goals and converting all seven of his PATs through the first five weeks.

The Buffalo Bills defeated the Chicago Bears in overtime by a score of 23-20 in their 2014 regular season. The Bills improved to 1-0 for the season with the win.

QB EJ Manuel proved prepared in his sophomore campaign. He went 16-for-22 for 173 yards and one touchdown, while adding another score on the ground. RB CJ Spiller was a true dual-threat for the Bills, recording 53 yards rushing and bringing in a seven-yard touchdown pass.

Leading the way on the ground was RB Fred Jackson with seven rushes for 61 yards. His 38-yard run in overtime set up Dan Carpenter for the 27-yard game-winning field goal.

The Bills defense picked up where they left off last year, recording two sacks and three turnovers. CB Leodis McKelvin led all players with 13 tackles, while DT Kyle Williams recorded his first career interception.

Veteran CB Corey Graham had a tremendous game against his former team, recording three passes defended and interceptions Jay Cutler in the second quarter.

The Bills built a 17-7 halftime lead before the Bears tied things up at 17-17 heading into the fourth goal. The teams swapped field goals in the final quarter, forcing the NFL's first overtime of the 2014 season. K Dan Carpenter won the game as he converted his third field goal on the heels of a 20-yard pass from Manuel to WR Mike Williams and Jackson's 38-yard burst.
