NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (12-3) at MIAMI DOLPHINS (5-10) Sunday Jan. 3, 2016 • Sun Life Stadium (64,982) • 1:00 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots will conclude the 2015 regular season this Sunday when they travel to face the Miami Dolphins at Sun Life Stadium. The Patriots will be looking for their 10th series sweep of the Dolphins (1986, 1987, 1988, 1997, 2003, 2007, 2010, 2011 and 2012). The Patriots beat Miami, 36-7, in the first meeting of the year on Oct. 29 in a Thursday Night Football game at Gillette Stadium.

With a win on Sunday, the Patriots can secure the number one seed in the AFC Playoff field for the second consecutive season. New England has earned the number one seed five times (2014, 2011, 2010, 2007 and 2003).

The Patriots clinched a bye in 2015 for an NFL-record sixth-straight season and lead the NFL with 11 first round-round byes since the current NFL playoff format was instituted in

PATS AIM FOR SIXTH NO. 1 SEED

The Patriots have earned five number one seeds (2014, 2011, 2010, 2007 and 2003) in the postseason since 1990, the most in the NFL under that system. A win this week will secure the team's sixth top slot. The NFL began playoff seeding in 1975 and the current playoff format was instituted in 1990.



SERIES HISTORY





The New England Patriots and Miami Dolphins will square off for the 101st time, including three playoff games, in their 50th year as division foes and for the second of two meetings in 2015. The Patriots beat Miami, 36-7, in the first meeting on Thursday Night Football on Oct. 29, at Gillette Stadium.

The Patriots will also be looking for their 10th series sweep of the Dolphins [1986, 1987, 1988, 1997, 2003, 2007, 2010, 2011 and 2012].

The Patriots have had the upper hand at home against Miami, holding a 32-17 record in games played in New England in the regular-season, including a 12-2 record at Gillette Stadium. But the Patriots are only 15-35 all-time in Miami, including two postseason games. Miami beat the New England at Gillette Stadium for the first time in the final game of the 2005 season, 28-26, when Patriots starting QB Tom Brady was pulled out of action after the first quarter. Miami also beat the Patriots, 38-13, at Gillette Stadium, on Sept. 21, 2008.

The Dolphins and Patriots met for the first time in 1966 and began playing twice a year during the regular season in 1967, except in 1982 during the strike year. The Patriots have swept the series nine times.

The two have played three times in the postseason with New England holding a 2-1 advantage.

- ★ Tom Brady owns a 19-8 record when playing against Miami. While he is 13-1 against Miami in home games, including wins in the last eight games, Brady is just 6-7 in games played in Miami.
- ★ Brady's only home loss to Miami was on Jan. 1, 2006 in the final game of the 2005 season when the Patriots had already locked up the AFC East title and Brady played in the first quarter before being relieved by backup Matt Cassel.

PASSING PERFORMANCES

Tom Brady is scheduled to start at quarterback against Miami for the 28th time and has compiled a 19-8 record in his previous 27 starts against the Dolphins. Brady is 67-17 in his career as a starter in the regular-season against AFC East opponents, with eight of the 17 losses coming to the Dolphins. One of those losses was in the final game of the 2005 season when Brady was pulled after the first quarter.

Patriots QB Tom Brady threw for 356 yards and four touchdowns to help lead the New England Patriots to a 36-7 victory over the Miami Dolphins at Gillette Stadium on Thursday Night Football. With the victory, the Patriots improved to 7-0 for the second time in team history and for the first time since 2007

The Patriots have now gone 15 straight seasons without being swept by a division opponent after beating each of the AFC East teams in 2015, extending the longest such streak since the 1970 NFL merger.

Brady had some help on offense. TE Rob Gronkowski recorded 113 yards receiving, including a 47-yard touchdown reception on the first drive of the game. WR Julian Edelman had two fourth-quarter touchdown receptions, and RB Dion Lewis caught six passes for 93 yards, including a 16-yard touchdown in the second quarter.

The Patriots defense limited Miami to just 15 yards on the ground on 13 attempts for a 1.2-yard average and produced five sacks, including two by DE Chandler Jones. The Dolphins had just 76 total yards at halftime. Miami had a sequence of five straight drives in the second quarter that were limited to -9, 0, 2, O and -3 yards.

K Stephén Gostkowski connected on two field goals, including one from 52 yards, to set a Patriots team record with 26 consecutive field goals made.

The Patriots built a 19-0 halftime lead. After Gronkowski put the Patriots on the board with his touchdown connection from Brady for a 7-0 first quarter lead, Miami was backed up at their own 9-yard line when a snap out of the shot gun sailed out of the end zone for a safety that gave New England a 9-0 lead. Gostkowski drilled a 52-yard field goal after an interception from CB Logan Ryan midway through the second quarter to extend the Patriots lead to 12-0. After the Patriots defense held Miami on three straight plays, a 19-yard punt return by Edelman helped the Patriots begin a drive at their own 49-yard line with 1:41 to play in the half. The Patriots moved to the 16-yard line where Brady threw a 16-yard touchdown pass to Lewis to make it 19-0 at halftime.

Miami got on the board by taking the second half kickoff and moving 80 yards in seven plays before scoring on a 1-yard run. The Patriots responded with an 11-play, 62-yard drive that ended with a 36-yard field goal by Gostkowski for a 22-7 third quarter lead.

Safety Duron Harmon intercepted a Miami pass and returned it 30 yards to the Miami 15-yard line early in the fourth quarter. That turnover helped set up a 10-yard touchdown pass from Brady to Edelman for a 29-7 lead. Brady and Edelman connected on a 16-yard touchdown on the next offensive series to make it 36-7.

The New England Patriots dropped a 26-20 overtime game at the New York Jets at MetLife Stadium and will need a win in the season-finale to secure the top seed in the AFC Playoff field.

Tom Brady rallied the Patriots from a 17-3 deficit to tie the game at 20 with 1:55 to play in regulation on a 9-yard touchdown pass to RB James Whte. The Patriots won the overtime coin toss and elected to kick. A 48-yard pass play from Jets QB Ryan Fitzpatrick to WR Quincy Enunwa and a 20-yard pass to WR Brandon Marshall helped get in position for Fitzpatrick's game-winning 6-yard touchdown pass to WR Eric Decker.

Brady and TE Rob Gronkowski connected on two big fourth-down plays to help set up the game-tying touchdown. Faced with a fourth-and-1 from the Jets 44-yard line, Brady hit Gronkowski for an 8-yard pass for the first down. Then in a fourth-and-9 from the Jets 35-yard line, Gronkowski and Brady hooked up on a 26-yard pass to set up a first down at the 9-yard line. On the next play, Brady hit White for the game-tying touchdown.

After building a 17-3 third-quarter lead, the Patriots answered with 10 points. First, K Stephen Gostkowski drilled a 44-yard field goal to make it 17-6. Then, DL Jabaal Sheard forced a fumble on a 9-yard sack that was recovered by LB Jamie Collins and returned 14 yards for a touchdown to make it 17-13 heading into the fourth quarter.

A nine-play, 49-yard Jets drive ended with a 49-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter to extend their lead to 20-13.

The Jets scored the game's only first-quarter points on a 30-yard field goal. The Patriots tied the game at 3 in the second quarter after kicking a field goal when a drive stalled at the New York 17-yard line.

The Jets answered with a 13-play, 80-yard drive that culminated with a twoyard pass from Fitzpatrick to Marshall for a 10-3 halftime lead.

The Patriots took the second half kickoff, but the drive ended when Brady was intercepted by CB Darrelle Revis on a deep pass at the Jets 21-yard line. The Jets converted the turnover into a 61-yard drive that ended on a 33-yard touchdown pass to Marshall for a 17-3 lead.



DEFENSE SCORES AGAIN

LB Jamie Collins scored on a 14-yard fumble return that was caused on a sack by DL Jabaal Sheard in the third quarter. It was the second straight week that the Patriots defense has scored a touchdown. Last week in the win vs. Tennessee, DE Chandler Jones forced a fumble that was recovered in the end zone by DE Akiem Hicks for a touchdown. It was the first touchdown of Collins' career.

SACK STREAK CONTINUES

The Patriots have recorded at least one sack in every game so far in 2015. The Patriots finished with a sack in every game in 1979, 1977, 1973 and 1963. They had one sack against the Jets. The Patriots have a streak of 28 straight games with at least one sack, the longest streak in the NFL. The last time the Patriots did not have a sack was vs. Oakland on Sept. 21, 2014.

MOST SACKS UNDER BELICHICK

The Patriots defense has 48 sacks in 2015 through 15 games. It ties the 48 the Patriots had in 2013 for the most sacks under Bill Belichick. The Patriots' record for most sacks in a season is 66 in 1963.



BRADY TIES FAVRE TD RECORD

Tom Brady's 9-yard touchdown pass to RB James White in the fourth quarter was his 481st overall touchdown with the Patriots, tying Brett Favre for the most touchdowns overall with one team in NFL history.







Seven members of the New England Patriots have been selected to the 2015 NFL Pro Bowl. Quarterback Tom Brady, CB Malcolm Butler, LB Jamie Collins, K Stephen Gostkowski, TE Rob Gronkowski, DE Chandler Jones and

WR Matthew Slater (special teams) have been selected to represent the New England Patriots in the 2016 NFL Pro Bowl on Sun., Jan. 31, 2016, at Aloha Stadium in Honolulu, Hawaii. The Patriots have now had at least five players selected to the Pro Bowl in each of the last seven seasons - (2009-5, 2010-8, 2011-8, 2012-7, 2013-5, 2014-7 and 2015-7).

Brady was named to the Pro Bowl for a franchise record 11th time in his 16-year career. This is Brady's seventh consecutive selection to the all-star game. He was voted to the Pro Bowl after each of the following seasons: 2001, 2004, 2005, 2007, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 and now, 2015. Brady heads into this week with an NFL-leading 4,636 yards and 36 touchdown passes. He joined Drew Brees (10) and Peyton Manning (14) as the only NFL players to have at least nine seasons with 4,000 passing yards. He joined Manning as the only NFL quar-

terbacks with four seasons with 35 or more touchdown passes. Brady also guided the Patriots to their 13th division title of his career, the most by a guarterback in NFL history.

Butler was named to the Pro Bowl for the first time. He is in his first year as a starter after joining the team as rookie free agent out of West Alabama in 2014. Butler made his first career interception when he sealed the Patriots' Super Bowl XLIX win vs. Seattle with an interception in the end zone with 26 seconds to play. Butler has started all 15 games so far in 2014 and has totaled 65 tackles, two interceptions and a team-leading 15 passes defensed.

Collins was named to his first Pro Bowl. A second-round draft pick out of Southern Mississippi in 2013, Collins moved into the starting lineup midway through his rookie season. He is leading the team with 84 total tackles, has 5½ sacks, one interception, tied a team record with five forced fumbles, a blocked extra point, and a fumble return for a touchdown, despite missing four games earlier in the season.

Gostkowski was named to the Pro Bowl for the fourth time in his career and for the third straight season. He enters this week with an NFL-leading 147 points. He has led the NFL in points in 2008, 2012, 2013 and 2014, and if he leads the NFL in 2015, he will join Don Hutson [5] and Gino Cappelletti [5] as the only players to lead the league in scoring in five seasons. Gostkowski also surpassed Adam Vinatieri this year to become the team's all-time leader in field goals and enters this week with 275 career field goals.

Gronkowski was named to the Pro Bowl for the fourth time after being selected in 2011, 2012 and 2014. He enters this week with 70 receptions for 1,158 yards and 11 touchdowns. He eclipsed 1,000 yards receiving and 10-plus touchdowns in a season for the third time in his career and is the only tight end in NFL history with three 1,000-yard and double-digit touchdown seasons. He is also the first tight end in NFL history with five 10-plus touchdown seasons.

Jones earned his first Pro Bowl berth after registering a career-high $12\frac{1}{2}$ sacks through the first 15 games of the season. A first-round draft pick out of Syracuse in 2012, Jones now has two 10-plus sack seasons after totaling $11\frac{1}{2}$ sacks in 2013. Jones' 36 total sacks in his first four seasons are second only to Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett's $43\frac{1}{2}$ sacks in his first four seasons with the Patriots.

Slater earned his fifth consecutive Pro Bowl selection as a special teams player. The former fifth-round draft pick out of UCLA earned a roster position with the Patriots as a rookie in 2008 with his contributions on special teams. Entering the 2011 season, teammates elected him as their special teams captain. That year, he was also selected to his first Pro Bowl. Since then, he has earned special teams captain honors to start each season and been voted to the Pro Bowl at season's end. He has led the Patriots in special teams tackles for three of the last four seasons and enters this week with a team leading 13 special teams tackles.

News & Notes

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 22nd season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.) and logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft



announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (15), conference crowns (7) and Super Bowl championships (4) than any other NFL team. Super Bowl XLIX was the seventh Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's 22 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 17 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

Since the team played its inaugural regular-season game at Gillette Stadium against the Steelers in September 2002, the Patriots organization has continued to renovate and install new amenities to ensure that fan satisfaction remains at the forefront of the venue. In 2015, the Kraft family has made some of its most significant and innovative capital improvements to date, with the addition of three new facilities within the stadium: the Optum Field Lounge, the Cross Insurance Pavilion and Business Center and the DraftKings Fantasy Sports Zone, as well as a major expansion to the signature bridge and the addition of more in-bowl LED ribbon boards.

OPTUM FIELD LOUNGE

Offering a game day experience unlike any other, the Optum Field Lounge brings its members closer to the action than ever before with an on-field, outdoor patio and lounge located in the south end zone. Inside, members will enjoy an upscale, climate-controlled space featuring a 9-foot-by-32-foot high-resolution media wall, HD screens, premium food and bar service and private restrooms. On game days, Patriots season ticket members, who have also paid an Optum Field Lounge membership fee, can come and go between their seats and the venue throughout the game. Members can access the lounge beginning three hours prior to kickoff and stay one hour after the game. On non-game days, the space will be utilized for a variety of events, functions and parties, including dinner receptions and business meetings.





CARMAX BRIDGE

Since opening Gillette Stadium in 2002, the iconic bridge and lighthouse have stood to represent the home of the Patriots while paying homage to its deep New England roots. The newly expanded CarMax bridge is four times wider and gives fans plenty of room to gather on game days to hang out and watch the action while improving the concourse's foot traffic.



CROSS INSURANCE PAVILION

A first of its kind function facility, the Cross Insurance Pavilion & Business Center will be utilized on game days for exclusive pregame hospitality events 2 ½ hours prior to kickoff on Patriots game days. Then, 30 minutes prior to kickoff, the venue will transform into a gathering area open to all ticketed fans inside the stadium. On non-game days, the space and open floor plan will host a variety of functions, from trade shows, car displays and business meetings to proms, galas and diner receptions. The new venue features a pre-function mezzanine area, outdoor terrace and access to the stadium's main concourse. Inside features 24-foot high ceilings, state-of-the-art audio visual capabilities with Bose sound system, a 24-foot video screen and LED HDTVs and classic furnishings with mahogany finish.



DRAFTKINGS FANTASY SPORTS ZONE

Among the most innovative amenities offered at the stadium is the DraftKings Fantasy Sports Zone located in the southwest corner of the main concourse. This high-tech sports bar offers excellent food choices, DraftKings beer selections of the day and an impressive array of nearly 40 HDTVs to capture all of the NFL and fantasy football action in real time. This venue will keep football and fantasy sports fans up to date with live fantasy scoring updates and the NFL RedZone. Additionally, when the weather is nice, the sports zone is open to the field. During inclement games, the glass front wall closes to keep the space warm and dry while still connecting fans to the action on the field. The Draft-Kings Fantasy Sports Zone is open to all ticketed patrons inside the stadium.



LED RIBBON BOARDS

Information is power! With the addition of more LED ribbon boards, Patriots fans will be the most powerful in the league. Fantasy information, scores from around the league and real-time stats are just some of the information to which fans will have access. Taking it to the next level, starting in 2015 fans will know things like who is the fastest player on the field at any given time and which players are lined up for the start of plays.

THE NUMBERS

DE Chandler Jones set a career high with 3 sacks in the win at Buffalo on Sept. 20, 2015. He has nine career multi-sack games and four in 2015.

Stephen Gostkowski executed a successful onside kick vs. Washington [11/08/15] and vs. Philadelphia [12/06/15] It is his third [Cleveland -12/8/13) and the fourth in team history. The first came when Jim Lee Hunt recovered a Gino Cappelletti kick at the end of the first half in a 26-10 win vs. the NY Jets (9/27/64).





Said Bolden about his grandfather, "I remember being six years old, him popping in a highlight film of Super Bowl I and IV. I've seen that tape at least 500 times."

Brandon Bolden blocked his first NFL punt in the second quarter at San Diego [12/7/14] to give the Patriots a first down at the Chargers 25-yard line. It was the Patriots first blocked punt since Patrick Chung blocked a punt at Miami on Oct. 4, 2010.



OVERCOMING ADVERSITY

On April 20, 2011, just days before Texas Christian offensive line prospect Marcus Cannon was to enter the NFL Draft, he was diagnosed with non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, a treatable form of cancer found in lymph tissue. A little more than one week later, the Patriots selected Cannon in the fifth round [138th overall] of the draft with the knowledge of his illness. The Patriots placed Cannon on the Reserve/Non Football Injury list to start the 2011 season while he received treatment and recovered. Cannon was activated to the 53-man roster later that year and is now in his fifth season with the team. Cannon made a full recovery and was named the Patriots 2011 Ed Block Courage Award winner - an annual award presented to select players in the National Football League who are voted by their teammates as role models of inspiration, sportsmanship and courage.

FROM STANDOUT QB TO WR

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo (Calif.) before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56 percent of his passes (153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003. Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edelman: "He played the quarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL - covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver, outside receiver, slot defender - he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is.'

"I'm still constantly trying to learn," Edelman told *The Boston Herald.* "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. 

ELECTED TEAM LEADER

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater has been named to five straight Pro Bowls (2011-15) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the fifth straight season in 2015.

The special teams ace was willing to share his advice on being a great captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe*. "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."

SLATER ON BILL BELICHICK

"Guys have really bought into what we're trying to do here and believing in the goals that we've set to accomplish. We try not to acknowledge all the noise and hype surrounding ballgames. We prepare ourselves to have success by the way we work day-in and day-out on the field and in the meeting room, but it definitely starts with our leadership on this team."



WHITE HAS CAREER DAY

James White set career highs with 10 receptions and 115 receiving yards vs. Philadelphia (12/6/15). White's 115 receiving yards are the second-highest such total for the Patriots running back since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, trailing only Shane Vereen's team-record 153 receiving yards vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013. 








JAMIE COLLINS' JOURNEY



The road to the NFL has been anything but easy for linebacker and 2013 second-round draft pick Jamie Collins. The youngest of five siblings growing up in Meadville, Miss., Collins lost both of his parents when he was six years old and was raised by one of his sisters, who was in her mid 20s.

Collins turned to football as an outlet to help him through the tough times. "It means a lot. It's my living." Collins told *The Boston Herald.* "It kept me on track." Collins' resiliency in dealing with adversity has made a lasting impact on fellow Mississippi native Stevan Ridley, who grew up 30

miles west of Meadville in Natchez, Miss., and got to know Collins through a family friend. "What I've known about him, he really has been a strong person," Ridley told the *Herald*. "Anybody that's gone through the things that he's gone through and can still find a way to be successful on the football field, you have to be mentally tough. That's what he's kind of done as a teammate here. He's come in here and accepted his role and did a pretty good job as a rookie."

COLLINS RECORDS FIRST INT

LB Jamie Collins intercepted a Kyle Orton pass in the win at Buffalo (10/12/14), marking his first regular-season interception. He had his second of the year at the Jets on Dec. 21, 2014. His first career pick came in the 2013 AFC Divisional Playoff vs. Indianapolis (1/11/14).

COLLINS SETS CAREER HIGH

LB Jamie Collins set a career high with 2 1/2 sacks in the win at Buffalo on Sept. 20, 2015. It was his second career multi-sack game. He registered his first NFL two-sack game with at San Diego (12/7/14).

TEAM LEADER

Collins had a standout second season in 2014. He led the team in total tackles (109), forced fumbles [4] and fumble recoveries [2], and tied for the team lead in interceptions [2].

COLLINS BLOCKS FIRST XP SINCE 2008

LB Jamie Collins blocked a fourth quarter extra point at Indianapolis (10/18/15). It was the Patriots first blocked extra point since Vince Wilfork blocked a PAT at Oakland on Dec. 14, 2008. It is Collins' second blocked kick. He blocked a field goal attempt vs. Miami on Dec. 14, 2014.






WEARING BRUSCHI'S JERSEY #54

As a first round draft pick, Dont'a Hightower is used to high expectations. Hightower went to training camp with jersey #45 but was switched to jersey #54 prior to the start of his rookie year in 2012. Former LB Tedy Bruschi wore #54 for 13 seasons.

Hightower understands the importance of the number and hopes to live up to its legacy. "I definitely feel honored to be able to wear this number," Hightower said. "I've read that Tedy didn't want it to be retired and he hoped another



linebacker would come in and be able to wear this number and be able to play as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number."

JONES ACHIEVES TRIFECTA

DL Chandler Jones blocked a second-quarter Minnesota [9/14/14] 48-yard field goal attempt, recovered the loose ball and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown. It was the fifth blocked field goal returned for a touchdown in Patriots history and the first returned for a touchdown since S Patrick Chung blocked a field goal attempt that was returned 35 yards for a touchdown by DB Kyle Arrington at Miami on Oct. 4, 2010. It is the second field goal block by Jones. He blocked a 39-yard attempt vs. Miami on Oct. 27, 2013. It was Jones' second career touchdown. He recovered an errant shotgun snap squibbed into the end zone at Baltimore on Dec. 22, 2013.

JONES SNAPS A SELFIE

When training camp practice ends at Gillette Stadium, the first wave of players quickly head into the locker room to shower and recover from the tough workout, but Chandler Jones is almost never among them. He is autographing footballs, snapping selfies and chatting with as many fans as he can before he makes his way into the building to rest his body and escape the heat. The Super Bowl Champion defensive end enjoys engaging his fans because he remembers a time when he was the one cheering from a distance.

"I feel like it was just yesterday when I was one of those fans," Jones said to ESPN's Mike Reis. "I didn't have access to an NFL team, but I was the guy that was on Twitter that was like, 'Oh my God, he tweeted me' or 'He shouted me out.' I was that person. So for me to have an opportunity to do that to people, I try to do that whenever I can. You see fans out there, they're sitting in the rain, they're sitting in the heat, sweating, they're drenched, and they're just yelling your name the whole practice. The least I can do is go over there and say hi and take some selfies and sign a few things. I love it. It's great."

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Chandler Jones was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Patriots' 30-7 victory at Minnesota on Sept. 14, 2014. It was the first time in Jones' career that he has received an AFC Player of the Week honor. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Month for November last season and NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month in September 2012.

Jones blocked a 48-yard field goal attempt and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown to give New England a 24-7 halftime lead at Minnesota (9/14). He also finished the game with eight total tackles and his fifth career two-sack game.

The last time the Patriots earned an AFC Defensive Player of the Week honor was Week 10 of the 2011 season when Andre Carter tied a team record with four sacks at N.Y. Jets [11/13/11].



SURE TACKLER

Jerod Mayo had his fifth straight 100-tackle season and his second season with over 180 total tackles after finishing the 2012 season with 184 tackles, the fifth-highest single season tackle total in franchise history. Mayo registered at least 10 tackles in 10 games, including a season-high of 20 vs. the New York Jets (10/28/12).

DOUBLE TROUBLE: DB DEVIN McCOURTY

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, DB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of two active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

Ninkovich has more opponent fumble recoveries [14] over the last six seasons [2010-2015] than any other NFL player. J.J. Watt is second during that time with 11 opponent fumble recoveries.



CAREER DAY IN BUFFALO

Ninkovich finished with a three-sack game for the first time in his career in the win at Buffalo (10/12/14), He has had two two-sack performances - vs. Miami (1/2/11) and at Carolina (11/18/13).

WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifth-round pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over three seasons. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.





CRAZY EIGHTS

Ninkovich raised his 2014 total to a team-high of eight sacks in 2014. Ninkovich has had at least eight sacks in three consecutive seasons (8.0 in 2012, eight in 2013 and eight in 2014), becoming the first Patriots player to have at least eight sacks in three consecutive seasons since Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett achieved the feat from 1985-87 (1985, $16\frac{1}{2}$, 1986, $9\frac{1}{2}$ and 1987, $12\frac{1}{2}$).

NINKOVICH SCORED AS A TE IN COLLEGE

Ninkovich played some at tight end in college at Purdue and caught two touchdown passes with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Buffalo QB Kyle Orton and a 1-yard touchdown pass from former New York Giants and Indianapolis QB Curtis Painter.

DB LOGAN RYAN AND DB DURON HARMON

CLASSMATES REUNITE IN NEW ENGLAND

Defensive backs Logan Ryan and Duron Harmon are used to working together. Ryan and Harmon began their college football careers together as members of the same recruiting class at Rutgers University and developed a close friendship during their four years in Piscataway, N.J. As fate would have it, Ryan and Harmon would begin their NFL journeys together as well when the Patriots selected the two defensive backs just eight picks apart in the third round of the 2013 NFL Draft.

Reunited once again, the former Scarlet Knights are excited and eager to make their mark, just as they did at Rutgers. "We talked before the draft and said how good it would be to play on the same team again, and for it to happen again, it's exciting and it's a blessing," Harmon told *The Boston Globe.* "It's great [we're contributing], because at the end of the day you want to play, and to contribute to a team like this, it's fun."

RYAN RETURNS... TO SCHOOL

When Logan Ryan decided to leave Rutgers and enter the NFL Draft after his redshirt junior season in 2012, he made a promise to his parents that after his rookie year, he would return to school and earn his degree.

Ryan kept his promise and graduated in the spring of 2014 with a degree in labor relations and a minor in psychology.

"I committed to Rutgers, not only as a football player, but as a student, so I was going to make sure I finished that end too," Ryan told NJ.com.

"It's a big accomplishment in my life. I held my word to my parents and stuck with it and I'm fortunate. It took a lot of work, but I was able to go back and finish and walk in graduation."

RYAN'S FIRST PICK FOR SIX

Ryan returned his first NFL interception 79 yards for a touchdown N.Y. Jets on Oct. 20, 2013. The last Patriots player to return their first career interception for a touchdown was Kyle Arrington in 2010. SHEARD ON MCGINEST

Jabaal Sheard may be a new face in the Patriots locker room, but he's certainly familiar with Patriots legend, Willie McGinest. Sheard, who is typically soft-spoken around the microphones, was very excited to express his admiration for McGinest following the veteran linebacker's induction to the Patriots Hall of Fame on August 5.

"That's a guy that I watch film on still to this day," Sheard said to the Boston Globe. "How he used to rush, how he'd attack, how he was relentless. It's amazing to be out here with him. The heart he had, that dog. He would get after the quarterback, get after the run. He was so into the team, whatever they asked him to do, he would do it."

It makes sense that Sheard would feel a connection to McGinest, given the players' similarities. Before coming to New England as a defensive lineman, Sheard played outside linebacker for Cleveland in Mike Pettine's hybrid 3-4 system. By adding Sheard to his roster, Bill Belichick brings flexibility and, hopefully some of that McGinest magic, back to the Patriots front seven.



GOSTKOWSKI BREAKS HIS OWN TEAM RECORD

Gostkowski led the NFL in 2014 with 35 field goals, the third-highest field goal total in team history. Gostkowski tied for the NFL lead with Baltimore's Justin Tucker with 38 field goals in 2013, breaking his own franchise record for most field goals in a season. Gostkowski was 5-of-6 on 50 yard field goals in 2013, the most by a Patriots player in a single season. Gostkowski is 4-of-5 from 50 yards out so far in 2015. The NFL record for most successful 50-yard field goals in a season is 10 by Blair Walsh in 2012 with Minnesota.

AFC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE MONTH

Gostkowski was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Month for September by the National Football League in 2015. It is the third time in his career that he has received the AFC Special Teams Player of the Month honor, Gostkowski was a perfect 7-of-7 on field goal attempts and 14-for-14 on extra points. He also finished the month of September first in the NFL with 35 total points and 18 touchbacks.

KICKING A CAREER HIGH

Stephen Gostkowski made five field goals vs. Cincinnati (10/5/14), setting a new career high for most field goals in a game. His previous career high was four field goals. Gostkowski's five field goals tie the second highest single-game total in Patriots history, trailing only Gino Cappelletti's six successful field goals on Oct. 4, 1964. The last time a Patriots player had five field goals in a game was on Nov.14, 2004, when Adam Vinatieri had five field goals vs. Buffalo.

TWO FROM 50-PLUS

Gostkowski drilled a 51-yard field goal and a 53-yarder vs. Arizona (9/16/12) and connected on two 53-yard field goals at Houston on (12/1/13). He is the first Patriots player to have two 50-yard field goals in the same game.

GOSTKOWSKI KICKS CAREER-LONG FG

Gostkowski connected on a career-long 57-yard field goal at Dallas on Oct. 11, 2015 to tie a franchise record. Adam Vinatieri kicked a 57-yarder at Chicago on Nov. 10, 2002. Gostkowski's previous long was a 54-yader vs. New Orleans (10/13/13).

SCORING FLURRY

The Patriots scored three touchdowns in a 57-second span during the final two minutes of the first half against Chicago on Oct. 26, 2014 to turn a 17-7 lead into a 38-7 cushion. - ★ Rob Gronkowski got the scoring started by hauling in a 2-yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady with 1:57 left in the first half to make the score 24-7 and cap off a 10-play, 80-yard drive.
- ★ After the Patriots defense forced a quick three-and-out, a 42-yard Julian Edelman punt return gave New England possession at the Chicago 9-yard line, and Brady found Brandon LaFell for a 9-yard touchdown on the next play to give the Patriots a 31-7 lead with 1:07 left in the first half.
- ★ On the Bears' first play following the LaFell touchdown, Zach Moore forced a Jay Cutler fumble that was recovered by Rob Ninkovich and returned for a 15yard touchdown and a 38-7 Patriots lead with 55 seconds left in the first half.

A COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

The Patriots came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime.

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (9/16/84). The Patriots also came back from 22 points down to win at the New York Giants, 23-22 (12/21/96). The Patriots have come from 21 points down to win four times, most recently vs. Buffalo (1/1/12).





PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 23 times in their 56-year history. Seventeen of those playoff berths have come in the 22 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence.
