NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (12-3) vs BUFFALO BILLS [8-7] Sunday, Dec. 28, $2014 \cdot$ Gillette Stadium $[68,756]$ • 1:00 p.m. ET
The New England Patriots will close out the 2014 regular season when they host the Buffalo Bills on Sunday. It is the fourth time in the last seven seasons and the second straight season that the Patriots will end the regular season against Buffalo.

The Patriots are assured of being the top seed in the AFC playoffs as a result of the Denver Broncos' $37-28$ loss to the Cincinnati Bengals on Monday night. It is the fifth time the Patriots have earned the top seed (2003, 2007, 2010, 2011 and 2014).

The Patriots have won their last 13 home games against the Bills, including a perfect 12-0 record at Gillette Stadium. Additionally, Tom Brady is 23-2 all-time against Buffalo.

The Patriots are 7-0 at home in 2014 and will attempt to finish a perfect 8-0 at Gillette Stadium for the seventh time in team history. New England has finished perfect at home in 2003 , 2004, 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2013. The only other teams that are undefeated at home in 2014 are Denver and Green Bay.

The Patriots have won 35 straight games at home against AFC opponents, marking the longest such streak in NFL history (following the 1970 merger). The Miami Dolphins are second in NFL history with 21 straight conference wins (1971-74). The Patriots last loss at home against an AFC opponent was a 33-10 defeat vs. Pittsburgh on Nov. 30, 2008.

Since 2001, the Patriots are 67-18 (.788) against AFC East opponents, compiling the best intra-division record of any team in the NFL. Indianapolis is second with a 62-23 (.729) record in its division.

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast by CBS and can be seen locally on WBZTV Channel 4 in Boston. Spero Dedes will handle play-by-play duties with Solomon Wilcotts as the color analyst. The game will be produced by Victor Frank and directed by Chris Svendsen.
LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 FM, The Sports Hub, is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. Play-by-play broadcaster Bob Socci will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback Scott Zolak, who will provide color analysis.

## PATRIOTS EARN FIRST-ROUNDEYE

The Patriots earned a first-round bye in the 2014 NFL playoffs and lead the NFL with 10 firstround byes since the current NFL playoff format was instituted in 1990. New England has earned a first-round bye for the fifth consecutive season, becoming the first team with five straight byes. Dallas and San Francisco earned four straight byes from 1992 through 1995.

## SERIES HISTORY



The Patriots and Bills will meet for the 110th time and for the second of two 2014 meetings．The Patriots traveled to Buffalo for the first meeting on Oct． 12 and pulled out a 37－22 victory

New England holds a 67－41－1 edge in the series following series sweeps in 2012 and 2013 and a win in the first meeting in 2014
New England has swept the series 23 times and have won 26 of the last 29 games overall，dating back to the 2000 season．

The Patriots are 35－19 all－time in home games against Buffalo，including $12-0$ at Gillette Stadium．

The series between the AFC East rivals began in 1960．The Patriots＇ 67 wins over the Bills are their highest victory total over any opponent，nine more than they own over the New York Jets［58］．
After seven straight series sweeps and 15 straight Patriots wins，Buffalo end－ ed the streak with a 34－31 victory at Ralph Wilson Stadium in the first meeting in 2011 （ $9 / 25$ ］．The 15－game win streak is the third longest winning streak over a single opponent in NFL history．The Patriots avenged that loss in the 2011 regular－season finale on Jan．1，2012，by overcoming a $21-0$ first quar－ ter deficit and scoring 49 unanswered points en route to a 49－21 victory．

The teams have had many memorable matchups over the years，including a five－game span from 1999 to 2001 where four of the five contests were decided in overtime．

In a battle for first place in the AFC East, the New England Patriots prevailed. The Patriots and the Bills met at Ralph Wilson Stadium with identical 3-2 records in a tie for first place. Tom Brady passed for 361 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Patriots to a 37-22 victory. Brady improved to 23-2 against the Bills, including six straight. Brady threw for over 300 yards and became the fifth NFL player with at least sixty 300-yard games.

The Patriots defense helped take command of the game in the second quarter with three turnovers that were turned into 13 points for a 13-7 halftime lead. New England scored on their first four second-half drives, including two touchdown throws from Brady to WR Brandon LaFell in the fourth quarter.

After a scoreless first quarter, LB Jamie Collins recorded his first regu-lar-season interception when he picked off Buffalo QB Kyle Orton at the New England 39-yard line. Brady moved the Patriots 61 yards in five plays and connected with TE Tim Wright for a 1-yard touchdown and a 7-0 lead.

A 28-yard pass from Orton to TE Scott Chandler on a third-and-two helped the Bills on a 10-play, 67-yard drive that tied the game at 7-7 when Orton hit WR Robert Woods for a 7-yard touchdown.

New England converted two field goals off turnovers in the final $2: 15$ of the first half. DE Chandler Jones forced and recovered a fumble on a 3-yard sack of Orton at the Buffalo 24-yard line. The Patriots converted that turnover into a 42-yard field goal for a 10-7 lead. On the ensuing possession, DB Devin McCourty forced a fumble on a hit to RB C.J. Spiller that was recovered by DL Zach Moore at the Buffalo 42-yard line with 14 seconds to play in the first half. That turnover led to a 53-yard field goal by K Stephen Gostkowski for a 13-7 halftime lead.

Following halftime, the Patriots scored on their two third-quarter drives, sandwiched around a touchdown drive by Buffalo for a 23-14 lead heading into the final quarter. The Patriots took the second half kickoff and drove into Buffalo territory before Brady connected with WR Brian Tyms for a 43-yard touchdown and a 20-7 lead.

Buffalo answered with an 80-yard drive that ended with a 1-yard touchdown run by RB Fred Jackson to close the gap to 20-14. The Patriots scored on a

40-yard field goal by Gostkowski on the ensuing drive for a 23-14 lead
The fourth quarter was similar to the third with the Patriots scoring on two touchdown drives sandwiched between a touchdown drive by Buffalo. The first of Brady's two fourth quarter touchdown passes to LaFell came on the first drive of the fourth quarter when Brady culminated an 80-yard drive with an 18yard touchdown pass to LaFell for a 30-14 lead. On that drive, Brady converted on a third-and-one at the Buffalo 33-yard line.

After Buffalo scored on their next drive and added a two-point conversion to make it a one score game at 30-22, Brady connected with LaFell for a 56-yard touchdown pass with three minutes to play to make it 37-22.

DE Rob Ninkovich added a single-game career-high three sacks against Orton. LB Jerod Mayo and RB Stevan Ridley both suffered season-ending injuries in the game.

## ERADY IMPROVES TO 19-1 WITH 4 TDS

Tom Brady threw four touchdowns in the win at Buffalo and is now 19-1 when he throws four or more touchdowns in a game for his career. Brady has thrown exactly four touchdowns in a game 16 times overall. The last time he threw four touchdowns in a game was vs. Pittsburgh on Sept. 25, 2013.

The previous week, Gronkowski caught three touchdown passes from Tom Brady to set a franchise record for most touchdown connections between a quarterback and receiver in the team's $51-23$ win vs. Chicago [10/26]. The jersey and gloves he wore for both games are on display at The Hall.


## STEPHEN GOSTKOWSKI

Stephen Gostkowski became the Patriots all-time leader in points, passing Adam Vinatieri $[1,158$ ), with a 35-yard field goal in the Week 15 win vs. Miami [12/14] His game-worn jersey and the ball he kicked to become the Patriots all-time leading scorer are on display at The Hall.

## TOM BRADY

Tom Brady became the sixth player in NFL history to reach 50,000 career passing yards after completing $23-0 f-35$ passes for 292 yards and two touchdowns in the win vs. Cincinnati [10/5] on NBC's "Sunday Night Football." BILL BELICHICK
Bill Belichick earned his 200th regular season victory as a head coach after the Patriots' 30-7 win at Minnesota on Sept. 14, 2014. The New England Patriots improved to a 12-3 record and in the process earned a first-round bye with a 17-16 victory over the New York Jets at Metlife Stadium. The Patriots became the first team to earn five straight first-round byes.

The victory over the Jets was the 250th win under Robert Kraft, in just 368 total games, tying Chicago's George Halas for the fastest an owner has reached 250 victories.

Additionally, Bill Belichick earned his 230th career win to pass Curly Lambeau for sole possession of fourth-place for most wins by an NFL coach.

Down 13-10 late in the third quarter, LB Jamie Collins intercepted a QB Geno Smith pass to give the Patriots a first down at the New York Jets 38-yard line. That turnover helped lead to RB Jonas Gray's go-ahead touchdown on a 1-yard run early in the fourth quarter to give New England a 17-13 advantage. The Jets answered with a 12-play, 59-yard drive that ended in a 37-yard field goal by K Nick Folk to close to within 17-16 with 7:53 left to play.

The Jets had a chance to take the lead with $5: 21$ left, but Folk's 52-yard field goal attempt was short after being tipped by DL Vince Wilfork. The Jets were in scoring position after CB Marcus Williams intercepted a QB Tom Brady pass that tipped off the hands of WR Brandon LaFell. The pick gave the Jets a first down at the New England 31-yard line. The Jets moved to the 24-yard line before LB Dont'a Hightower sacked Smith for a 10-yard loss on a third-down play to force the long field goal attempt. The Patriots took over and converted two third downs to help run out the clock and secure the victory.

After a scoreless first quarter, New England got on the board first when WR Danny Amendola returned a punt 39 yards to the Jets 36-yard line. Brady moved the Patriots to the 3 -yard line before connecting with TE Rob Gronkowski on a touchdown and a 7-0 lead.

The Jets answered by driving to the New England 20-yard line where Smith completed a touchdown pass to TE Jeff Cumberland to tie the game. After stopping the Patriots on three straight plays, the Jets drove to the New England 8 -yard line with 52 seconds to play and kicked a 26-yard field goal to take a 10-7 halftime lead.

The Jets extended their lead on their first possession of the second half when Folk kicked a 23-yard field goal for a 13-7 advantage. The Patriots drove to the 6-yard line on the ensuing drive, but were forced to settle for a 24 -yard field goal to make it 13-10 heading into the final quarter.

The Jets had three drives inside the New England 20-yard line, but were forced to settle for field goals on all three drives. New England was 2-for-4 in the red zone.

## MILESTONE WIN FOR KRAFT

The victory over the New York Jets was the 250th win under Robert Kraft. He has 250 wins in 368 total games, tying Chicago’s George Halas for the fastest an owner has reached 250 victories.


## PATRIOTS EARN FIFTH STRAICHT BYE

The Patriots earned a first-round bye in the 2014 NFL playoffs and lead the NFL with 10 first-round byes since the current NFL playoff format was instituted in 1990. ## TEAM NOTES



Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 21st season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (. 238 pct.) and logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994,


Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles [14], conference crowns [6] and Super Bowl championships (3) than any other NFL team. The Patriots have made six Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's 21 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 16 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

The Patriots scored 34 points against a Lions (11/23) defense which entered the game allowing an NFL-low 15.6 points per game. Prior to the Patriots-Lions game, the highest point total allowed by the Lions was 24 points to the Carolina Panthers on Sept. 14. Entering the game, Detroit also allowed an NFL-low 290.3 yards per game, and New England totaled 439 yards in the victory.

## SCORING FLURRY

The Patriots scored three touchdowns in a 57-second span during the final two minutes of the first half against Chicago on Oct. 26 to turn a 17-7 lead into a 38-7 cushion. Said Bolden about his grandfather, "I remember being 6 years old, him popping in a highlight film of Super Bowl I and IV. I've seen that tape at least 500 times."

CONNOLLY SETS NFL RECORD
Dan Connolly was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week after he returned a kickoff 71 yards to the 4 -yard line in the second quarter of the Patriots win vs. Green Bay (12/19/10) According to the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the longest kickoff return by an offensive lineman in NFL history. The run by Connolly topped the 48-yard touchdown return by Atlanta's Mal Snider in 1969. Previously, the longest kickoff return for a Patriots offensive lineman was a 27yard return by G Stephen Neal vs. Pittsburgh (11/30/08). Connolly's previous best was a 16-yard return vs. Miami (11/8/09).


IVY LEACUE JOURNEY
An Ivy League defensive lineman standout at Brown, James Develin graduated in 2010 with a degree in chemical engineering and began lining up interviews with companies he felt might be best suited for the technical skills. However, Develin wanted to give football one last shot, and play in the NFL.
"Football is something that is not around your entire life," Develin told The Boston Globe. "I knew if I didn't give it my best shot to play football as a career, that l'd always regret it." Develin made the most of his opportunity by switching positions to fullback. Following stints in the Arena Football League and the now defunct United Football League, Develin caught on with the Cincinnati Bengals practice squad and eventually worked his way to the Patriots 53-man roster full-time in 2013.

WR Julian Edelman set a franchise record with his fourth career punt returned for a touchdown when he returned a punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. Denver on Nov. 2. ## EDELMAN TAKES HIS FATHER'S ADVICE

If there is one thing Julian Edelman has never lacked, it's athletic ability. A dual-threat quarterback at Kent State and former baseball standout in high school, Edelman once wowed Toronto Blue Jays players with his impressive footwork while fielding ground balls in an appearance at batting practice in 2011

This natural ability may have been overlooked by NFL scouts, who let him fall to the Patriots in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Edelman remains focused on the lessons his father, Frank Edelman, taught him at a young age. "I'm still constantly trying to learn," Edelman told the Boston Herald. "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."

## EDELMAN HITS THE CENTURY MARK

Edelman finished the 2013 season fourth in the NFL with 105 receptions to join Wes Welker [2007-09, 11-12] and Troy Brown [2001] as the only Patriots to reach 100 receptions in a season. Edelman averaged 6.4 receptions per game in 2013.

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater has been named to three straight Pro Bowls (2011-13) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he has been elected a captain by his teammates for the fourth straight season in 2014.

The special teams ace was willing to share his advice on being a great captain with high school football players in a story published by The Boston Globe "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice - putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

## SLATAR ON BILL BELICHICK

"Guys have really bought into what we're trying to do here and believing in the goals that we've set to accomplish. We try not to acknowledge all the noise and hype surrounding ballgames. We prepare ourselves to have success by the way we work day-in and day-out on the field and in the meeting room, but it definitely starts with our leadership on this team."


## FIRST NFL TD

WR Brian Tyms scored his first NFL touchdown on a 43-yard reception from Tom Brady in the win at Buffalo (10/12). He entered the game with two career receptions for 12 yards in seven games.


## 2011 FIRST ROUND PICK NATE SOLDER

It only took a day for Nate Solder to decide to change from his lifelong position of tight end to tackle after playing his freshman year at Colorado as a tight end. "My coaches came to me and said, 'You'd be an all right tight end, but you'd be an even better tackle,"' he told the Boston Globe. "I've always wanted to be great, so that's why I moved to tackle."

He added over 30 pounds after his redshirt freshman season and was named the team's starting left tackle. He played in 2,540 of 2,542 offensive plays over the next three seasons at Colorado and became an immediate contributor on the Patriots offensive line at right tackle as a rookie before moving to left tackle.

Shane Vereen had 12 receptions for 153 yards vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013, setting a single-game franchise record for most receptions and most receiving yards by a running back.

## VEREEN SETS CAREER HICHS

Shane Vereen caught a 12-yard pass at N.Y. Jets [12/21] to set a new sin-gle-season high for receiving yards with 433 receiving yards for the season. His previous high was last season with 427 receiving yards. Vereen has now set career highs in receptions [49] and receiving yards [433] in 2014. His previous best for most receptions was 47 in 2013.


RYAN WENDELL LEADS THE NFL IN PLAY SNAPS IN 2012
Ryan Wendell played a league-high 1,249 snaps in 2012 and it helped earn him a spot on the USA Today All-Joe team. Said Wendell: "I think first it says a lot about the organization, our training staff and our strength training coaches, that they do everything they can all season and all off-season and during the spring to keep us healthy throughout the whole season. I think it says more about them than it does about me individually."


WHAT'S IN A NUMEER?
When Arrington was first making the transition from Hofstra to the NFL in 2008, he was assigned jersey No. 42. At that point in his career, he was cut by both the Eagles and Buccaneers. When Arrington first arrived in New England as a practice squad player in 2009, he initially donned No. 27. But when No. 24 became available, a result of Jonathan Wilhite leaving in free agency after the 2010 season, Arrington pounced on it.

The reason is that it reflects how he's flipped his NFL fortunes - from a No. 42 struggling to hang on to a No. 24 who has carved out a role on a winning team. Arrington moved from 24 to 25 in an agreement with Adrian Wilson in 2013 to accommodate the veteran's desire to keep the same jersey he had worn during his 12 -year NFL career.

DB Kyle Arrington has two touchdowns in 2014. He returned a Cincinnati fumble [10/5/14] forced by Brandon Bolden on a third-quarter kickoff 9 yards for a touchdown and returned a blocked field goal 62 yards for a touchdown vs. Miami (12/14). he has four career touchdowns. He returned a blocked field goal 35 yards for a touchdown at Miami (10/4/10) and returned his first career interception 36 yards for a touchdown vs. Green Bay (12/19/10).


JAMIE COLLINS' JOURNEY
The road to the NFL has been anything but easy for linebacker and 2013 second-round draft pick Jamie Collins. The youngest of five siblings growing up in Meadville, Miss., Collins lost both of his parents when he was six years old and was raised by one of his sisters, who was in her mid 20s.

Collins turned to football as an outlet to help him through the tough times. "It means a lot. It's my living," Collins told The Boston Herald. "It kept me on track." Collins' resiliency in dealing with adversity has made a lasting impact on fellow Mississippi native Stevan Ridley, who grew up 30 miles west of Meadville in Natchez, Miss., and got to know Collins through a family friend. "What l've known about him, he really has been a strong person," Ridley told the Herald. "Anybody that's gone through the things that he's gone through and can still find a way to be successful on the football field, you have to be mentally tough. That's what he's kind of done as a teammate here. He's come in here and accepted his role and did a pretty good job as a rookie."

LB Jamie Collins intercepted a Kyle Orton pass in the win at Buffalo [10/12], marking his first regular-season interception. He had his second of the year at the Jets on Dec. 21. His first career pick came last year in the AFC Divisional Playoff vs. Indianapolis (1/11/14).

LB Jamie Collins registered his first NFL two-sack game with a 9 -yard sack in the first quarter and a 9 -yard sack in the second quarter against San Diego [12/7]. ## DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Chandler Jones was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Patriots' 30-7 victory at Minnesota on Sept. 14, 2014. It is the first time in Jones' career that he has received an AFC Player of the Week honor. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Month for November last season and NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month in September 2012.

Jones blocked a 48-yard field goal attempt and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown to give New England a 24-7 halftime lead at Minnesota [9/14]. He also finished the game with eight total tackles and his fifth career two-sack game.

The last time the Patriots earned an AFC Defensive Player of the Week honor was Week 10 of the 2011 season when Andre Carter tied a team record with four sacks at N.Y. Jets $(11 / 13 / 11)$.

## JONES ACHIEVES TRIFECTA

DL Chandler Jones blocked a second-quarter Minnesota 48-yard field goal attempt, recovered the loose ball and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown. It is the fifth blocked field goal returned for a touchdown in Patriots history and the first returned for a touchdown since S Patrick Chung blocked a field goal attempt that was returned 35 yards for a touchdown by DB Kyle Arrington at Miami on Oct. 4, 2010. It is the second field goal block by Jones. He blocked a 39-yard attempt vs. Miami on Oct. 27, 2013. It is Jones' second career touchdown. He recovered an errant shotgun snap squibbed into the end zone at Baltimore on Dec. 22, 2013.

## MULTIPLE SACKS FOR JONES

Jones finished with his fifth career two-sack game at Minnesota [09/14/14] He had three two-sack games in 2013 .


## THIRD TEAM'S A CHARM

Chris Jones had an early introduction to failure in the NFL. Taken behind 37 other defensive linemen in the 2013 NFL Draft, the defensive tackle was cut by two teams over a span of just 11 days. After selecting him in the sixth round with the 198th overall pick, the Houston Texans cut Jones on Aug. 31. Jones signed with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on Sept. 1, but lasted only 10 days, as the Buccaneers released him on Sept., 10. Rather than be deterred by these early disappointments, however, Jones maintained a positive outlook when he signed with the Patriots on Sept. 11, and it has paid off in a big way. Thrust into a starting role after key injuries to the defensive line, Jones finished his rookie season with six sacks.

Jones' sudden success may have come as a surprise to some, but not to Dave Clawson, Jones’ college coach at Bowling Green. Jones was part of Clawson's first recruiting class and blossomed into an All-American and two-two time captain for the Falcons. "It's hard to talk about Chris without getting a little bit emotional," Clawson told the The Boston Herald, "because he was that special of a player and person in our program."

## JONES SAVES THE DAY; EARNS AFC HONORS

Chris Jones blocked a 58-yard field goal attempt by the Jets on the final play of the game to preserve New England's 27-25 win. It was the first blocked field goal for the Patriots since Chandler Jones blocked a 48-yard try by Minnesota's Blair Walsh earlier this season. He was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance in the victory.


After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, DB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 19982000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of two active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

A NOSE FOR THE FOOTBALL
Ninkovich has more opponent fumble recoveries (13) over the last five seasons [20102014) than any other NFL player. J.J. Watt is second during that time with 11 opponent fumble recoveries.


CAREER DAY IN BUFFALO
Ninkovich finished with a three-sack game for the first time in his career in the win at Buffalo (10/12), to add to two two-sack performances vs. Miami [ $1 / 2 / 11$ ) and at Carolina ( $11 / 18 / 13$ ).

WHERE DID HE COME FROM?
Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifth-round pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over three seasons. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

CRAZY EICHTS
Ninkovich raised his 2014 total to a team-high of 8.0 sacks in 2014 . Ninkovich has had at least 8.0 sacks in three consecutive seasons ( 8.0 in 2012, 8.0 in 2013 and 8.0 in 2014], becoming the first Patriots player to have at least 8.0 sacks in three consecutive seasons since Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett achieved the feat from 1985-87 [1985, 16 1/2, 1986, 9 1/2 and 1987, 12 1/2].

NINKOVICH SCORED AS A TE IN COLLECE
Ninkovich played some at tight end in college at Purdue and caught two touchdown passes with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Buffalo QB Kyle Orton and a 1-yard touchdown pass from former New York Giants and Indianapolis QB Curtis Painter.


HOMETOWN PATRIOTS CONNECTION
Darrelle Revis and former Patriots CB Ty Law are close friends, having both grown up in Aliquippa, Pa., Revis considers Law a close family friend. He sees Law as somewhat of an adviser.
"Ty has been a mentor through my whole life. He's a very close friend to my family. I talk to Ty all the time - about life and football. I'm just happy he's on my side and I can bounce questions off of him and ask him certain things because he has a lot of experience. Ty's always there in my corner to help me whether it's football or life. I thank Ty for that."

Reunited once again, the former Scarlet Knights are excited and eager to make their mark, just as they did at Rutgers. "We talked before the draft and said how good it would be to play on the same team again, and for it to happen again, it's exciting and it's a blessing," Harmon told The Boston Globe. "It's great [we're contributing], because at the end of the day you want to play, and to contribute to a team like this, it's fun."

When Logan Ryan decided to leave Rutgers and enter the NFL Draft after his redshirt junior season in 2012, he made a promise to his parents that after his rookie year, he would return to school and earn his degree.

The play marked the second time in as many weeks that a Ryan turnover led to Patriots points.
