JUST THE FACTS

• Fresh off their bye week and winners of three-straight games, the Baltimore Ravens (5-2) host the undefeated New England Patriots (8-0) in a primetime showdown from M&T Bank Stadium. This matchup features the NFL's Top 2 scoring offenses, with New England averaging 31.3 points per game and Baltimore owning a 30.6 ppg mark. The Patriots boast the NFL's top scoring defense (7.6 ppg allowed), while the Ravens stand No. 2 in total offense (434.9 ypg).

• New England leads the regular season series, 8-1, which includes a 3-1 mark in Baltimore. However, the postseason series between these teams is tied, 2-2. Under John Harbaugh, the Ravens are 3-6 (includes postseason) overall against the Patriots.

• In Week 7's 30-16 victory at Seattle, QB Lamar Jackson ran for 116 yards and a TD, while Baltimore's defense scored on 2 takeaways (CB Marcus Peters' 67-yard pick-six & CB Marlon Humphrey's 18yard FR-TD). The Ravens limited surging QB Russell Wilson to just 241 yards and 1 TD on 20-of-41 passing (65.2 rating), producing 8 QB hits and 7 TFL overall. Baltimore rushed for 199 yards and received 3 FGs from K Justin Tucker, en route to its first-ever victory in Seattle.

• Under Coach Harbaugh, Baltimore owns the NFL's fifth-most total wins (119) since his 2008 Charm City arrival. The Ravens have appeared in three AFC title games (2008, 2011 & 2012) with "Harbs" at the helm, and in 2012, won Super Bowl XLVII.

COACH HARBAUGH SAYS

ON THE ADDED EXCITEMENT OF PLAYING THE PATRIOTS IN PRIMETIME:

"You only get to play 16 [games], so to say that any of them aren't exciting is definitely not true, because they're just so valuable. Then, *these* are even more exciting, because you're playing the defending champs. That gets you fired up. That's what you're in this business for. We'll be excited for it, but for us, it's really more about just taking care of our business day to day and getting ready to play the game."

INJURY UPDATE

Starters WR Marquise Brown (ankle) and ILB Patrick Onwuasor (ankle) missed the past two games, while CB Jimmy Smith (knee) has not played since Week 1. Starters SS Tony Jefferson (knee, Week 5) and OLB Pernell McPhee (triceps, Week 7) will miss the rest of the season on IR, as will slot CB Tavon Young (neck injury, training camp).

NOTE THE QUOTE

The Ringer's Robert Mays on QB Lamar Jackson:

"Jackson is currently on pace to finish the season with 3,770 passing yards and more than 1,300 rushing yards. No player in NFL history has ever cracked 3,000 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards in a single season, let alone come close to the numbers that Jackson is putting up right now. He's affecting the game in a way we've never seen before, and his ability to slice through defenses with his arm and his legs has given the Ravens a [2-] game lead in the AFC North."

The Ravens traded for CB Marcus Peters prior to their Week 7 game at Seattle. In the contest, Peters produced a 67-yard INT-TD off QB Russell Wilson. Here are several fast facts about Baltimore's newest CB:

- Since entering the NFL in 2015, Peters' 5 INT-TDs rank No. 1 among all defenders.
- Peters' 25-career INTs rank as the most among all players since he entered the league in 2015. (Next best is 16 picks by two players.)



- Peters has scored 6-career defensive TDs (5 INT & 1 FR), which stand as the NFL's most since 2015.
- Peters also leads all NFL DBs in fumble recoveries (6) since entering the league in 2015. He has produced an amazing 31 total takeaways (25 INTs & 6 FRs).

Franchise Connections

• Ravens **CB/RS Cyrus Jones** was originally selected by the Patriots in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft and spent two full seasons (2016-17) and part of one (2018) in New England.

• Baltimore **DB Jordan Richards**, who the Ravens signed on Oct. 24, was originally selected by the Patriots in the second round of the 2015 NFL Draft. Richards played three seasons in New England from 2015-17 and returned to the team in 2019, seeing action on special teams in Weeks 5-7.

• The Ravens also signed **DE Ufomba Kamalu** off the Patriots' practice squad on Oct. 25. Kamalu played in two games for New England in 2018, notching 1 tackle.

• Patriots **CB Justin Bethel** spent Weeks 1-7 of 2019 with the Ravens before being signed by the Patriots. He posted 3 special teams tackles, 1 defensive tackle and 1 FR in Baltimore.

• New England **OL Jermaine Eluemunor** was originally selected by the Ravens in the fifth round of the 2017 draft. Eluemunor spent two seasons (2017-18) with Baltimore and played in 17 games (three starts) before being traded during the 2019 training camp.

• Patriots **TE Benjamin Watson** spent two years (2016-17) with the Ravens. He spent the 2016 season on Injured Reserve and then played all 16 games (12 starts) in 2017, posting 61 receptions for 522 yards and 4 TDs.

• Patriots **DL Lawrence Guy** played in Baltimore for three seasons (2014-16) before joining New England as a free agent. Guy saw action in 43 games (17 starts) with the Ravens, recording 90 tackles (45 solo), 5.5 sacks, 1 FF, 2 FRs and 2 PD.

• New England **DE John Simon** was originally selected by the Ravens in the fourth round of the 2013 NFL Draft and spent his rookie season with Baltimore, tallying 3 special teams tackles.

• Patriots **DB Terrence Brooks** was originally selected by Baltimore in the third round of the 2014 NFL Draft. Brooks played in 23 games over two seasons (2014-15) for the Ravens, registering 26 tackles (22 solo), 1 FR and 3 PD.

• New England head coach **Bill Belichick**'s first NFL coaching job was with the Baltimore Colts in 1975 as a special assistant to then-head coach Ted Marchibroda.

• Baltimore executive vice president **Ozzie Newsome** began his front office career as a special assignment scout with the Browns in 1991, when Patriots head coach **Bill Belichick** was at Cleveland's helm.

Local Connections

• Several Ravens hail from Massachusetts: EVP & GM Eric DeCosta (Taunton), D-line coach Joe Cullen (Quincy), LBs coach Mike Macdonald (Boston), player personnel coord. Mark Azevedo (Plymouth) and NE area scout Joey Cleary (Boston).

• Baltimore **FB/DL Patrick Ricard** is a native of Spencer, MA, and attended the University of Maine.

• Baltimore D-line coach **Joe Cullen** was a four-year starter at NG at UMass from 1986-89, and, upon graduating, coached the UMass running backs (1990) and defensive line (1991).

• Patriots head coach **Bill Belichick** was raised in Annapolis, MD. Belichick played football and lacrosse at Annapolis HS, where he is currently enshrined in the Hall of Fame. His late father, Steve, coached at the U.S. Naval Academy for 33 years.

WEEK 7 AT SEATTLE

RAVENS 3D, SEAHAWKS 16 CenturyLink Field • Oct. 20, 2019 • Week 7

QB Lamar Jackson ran for 116 yards and a TD and even inspired a play call in a hardfought, impressive 30-16 victory at Seattle. With 1:24 left in the third quarter and the game tied at 13, the Ravens faced a fourthand-2 at the Seahawks' 8-yard line. John Harbaugh then sent the FG unit from the sideline. As he came off the field, Jackson told the coach, "Let's go for it!"



Harbaugh called a timeout, and Jackson rewarded the decision to "go for it" with an 8-yard TD run through the right side of the line for a 20-13 lead. Jackson then directed a 13-play, 86yard, 9-minute drive that ended with a K Justin Tucker 22-yard FG. During that fourth-quarter drive, Jackson ran for 30 yards on a third-and-8 from the Ravens' 12. He also scrambled for 13 yards for another first down a few plays later. The defense had standouts also, scoring TDs on 2 takeaways. The first came when CB Marcus Peters, whom the Ravens had acquired in a trade (from LAR) just five days earlier, intercepted QB Russell Wilson and raced 67 yards to the end zone. The score helped the Ravens tie the Seahawks at 13 at the half and was the first INT off Wilson this season. Fellow CB Marlon Humphrey picked up a WR DK Metcalf fumble and sprinted 18 yards for the game's final TD with 3:37 remaining. Baltimore opened the contest with a Tucker 25-yard FG to lead 3-0 at the end of the first quarter. A Wilson-to-WR Tyler Lockett 8-yard TD gave the Seahawks a 7-3 margin that was reduced to 7-6 on another Tucker FG (28 yards). Two K Jason Myers FGs (34 & 31 yards) completed the first-half scoring. Along with his 116 rushing yards (14 carries for an 8.3vard average), Jackson completed 9 of 20 passes for 143 more. Wilson, meanwhile, was 20-of-41 for 241 vards, including 5 to Lockett for 61 yards. The victory was the Ravens' third in a row and the first time in team history that they won in Seattle.

In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

HARBAUGH FAST FACTS

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in seven (2008-12, 2014 & 2018) of his 11 full seasons, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under "Harbs," the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

• The Ravens are one of only six teams (NE - 10; GB - 8; Bal., Ind., Pit. & Sea. - 7) to earn at least seven postseason berths in the last 11 years. (Baltimore has won at least one game in six of those seven playoff campaigns.)

• The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 16.

• "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.

• John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.

• Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.

• In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.

• Harbaugh owns the fourth-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first 11 seasons all time. (See chart at left.)

• With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.

• Of coaches to make the playoffs in at least seven of their first 11 years, "Harbs" is one of four active coaches to do so (Pete Carroll - 8, Andy Reid - 8 & Mike Tomlin - 8).

• Harbaugh, Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) own the most road playoff wins (7) by a HC in NFL history.



He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. Following the 2018 season, the Ravens named Greg Roman their offensive coordinator. Roman is a 21-year NFL coaching veteran who spent 2018 as the team's assistant head coach/TEs coach. He re-joined the Ravens in 2017 as a senior offensive assistant/TEs coach after his first stint with the team as an assistant O-line coach from 2006-07.

Previously, Roman was a successful "0" coordinator with the Buffalo Bills (2015-16) and San Francisco 49ers (2011-14). With each team, Roman worked with QBs who totaled their highest single-season passer ratings under his guidance: Tyrod Taylor (Bills - 99.4 in 2015), Colin Kaepernick (49ers - 98.3 in 2012) and Alex Smith (49ers - 104.1 in 2012).

In his first year (2018) as Baltimore's D.C., Don "Wink" Martindale led the Ravens' unit to a No. 1-overall ranking, allowing an NFL-best 292.9 yards per game. Baltimore also permitted the league's second-fewest points per game (17.9), just behind Chicago's 17.7. For his coaching efforts, Martindale was recognized by SI/MMOB as the Assistant Coach of the Year and was the AP NFL runner-up (then-Bears' DC Vic Fangio) for the same award.

The 2019 campaign marks Martindale's 15th season in the NFL, where he has also spent time with Oakland (2004-08) and Denver (2009-10). In 2010, he was Denver's D.C.

EVP & GM ERIC DECOSTA

Eric DeCosta's loyalty, love and pride for the Baltimore Ravens are unmatched. A pillar of the organization's well laid foundation, DeCosta has been with the franchise since Day One, first beginning as an intern during the inaugural 1996 season and then ascending to the personnel department's chief decision-maker in 2019.

Prior to being named executive vice president and general manager this past January – succeeding the legendary Ozzie Newsome – DeCosta, 48, received GM interview offers annually from multiple teams in recent years. However, he never seriously considered leaving Baltimore. Simply put, Eric's respect for – and thorough understanding of – the Ravens' culture aligned perfectly with his pursuit of a dream job.



LAMAR JACKSON NOTES

JACKSON'S HOT START TO 2019

- Jackson is the only QB in league history to pass for 1,600 yards (1,650) and rush for 500 yards (576) through the first seven games of a season.
- In Week 6's victory over Cincinnati, Jackson became the first player ever to pass for 200 yards (236) and rush for 150 yards (152) in a regular season game. (Colin Kaepernick also accomplished this feat in a 2013 playoff game.)
- X Jackson's 6.94 yards-per-carry rushing average stands No. 1 among all NFL players. (Raheem Mostert is second at 5.72.)
- X Jackson's 576 rushing yards rank as the NFL's most among QBs this season and stand 10th among all NFL rushers.
- X Jackson and Robert Griffin III (both 21 games) are the fastest QBs in NFL history to reach the 1,000-yard rushing milestone. (Jackson accomplished the feat in Week 5 at Pittsburgh.)
- Michael Vick (8), Russell Wilson (4) and Jackson (4) own the most "double-triples" (at least 100 rushing and passing yards in the same game) in league history.

WITH JACKSON AT THE HELM

Since making his first regular season start in Week 11 of 2018 (Nov. 18), QB Lamar Jackson has led the Ravens to an 11-3 record. *During this span, here's where Baltimore ranks in several key offensive categories:*

- X Baltimore ranks first in total yards per game (410.3).
- The Ravens have rushed for 216.9 yards per game, by far the NFL's best average. (Seattle is second at 148.7.)
- X Baltimore stands fourth in third-down conversion percentage, posting a 45.8 success mark.
- The Ravens have scored 27.9 points per game, ranking fourth best in the NFL.
- Baltimore has scored 18 rushing TDs, tying New England and Green Bay for second in the NFL. (LAR are first, 20.)
- Jackson has produced 1,132 rushing yards, ranking seventh best among all NFL rushers. Among QBs, he stands first, with Josh Allen (711) in second place.
- Baltimore's 119 "big plays" (any 10+ rush or 20+ pass) stand second only to Seattle's 120.







2016: PERHAPS THE BEST SEASON EVER

- In 2016, All-Pro K Justin Tucker connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best pct. in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are facts about his remarkable season, arguably the best ever by a kicker:
- Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- In Week 12 of 2016 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)

"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter "S." He's debuted a "boomerang" punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return. ... Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."


