- Tom Brady improved to 14-3 as a starting quarterback on opening day, the best winning percentage and the most wins among any quarterback on opening day in the Super Bowl era.
- WR Julian Edelman became the fifth Patriots player to reach 500 career receptions with his 9-yard completion from QB Tom Brady in the second quarter. He entered the game with 499 career receptions and finished with six receptions.
- Edelman entered the game needing 82 yards to move past Ben Coates (5,471) into sixth place on the franchise's all-time receiving yards list. He finished with 83 yards to move past Coates.
- WR Phillip Dorsett had his first two-touchdown game of his career after scoring on a 25-yard pass from Tom Brady in the second quarter and a 58-yard pass from Brady in the third quarter. The 58-yard pass is the longest of his Patriots career and the second longest of his career.
- 2018 first-round draft pick T Isaiah Wynn played in his first NFL game with a start at left tackle. He missed his entire rookie season due to an injury.

- The Patriots picked up their second win of the 2019 season and their 115th regular-season win of this decade (2010-present), tying the Indianapolis Colts (2000-09) for the most regular season wins in a single decade. The Patriots hold the mark for most total wins in a decade with 131 (2010-present).
- The Patriots returned two interceptions for touchdowns in the fourth quarter – a 54-yard interception return by CB Stephon Gilmore and a 69-yard interception return by LB Jamie Collins. It marked the 10th time that the Patriots have returned to picks for scores in the same game and the first time they have done so since returning two picks for scores vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 18, 2012.
- WR Julian Edelman's 8-yard reception from Tom Brady in the first quarter moved him past Irving Fryar for fifth all-time on the New England all-purpose yards list. He entered the game needing 5 yards to move past Fryar.
- Rookie DL Chase Winovich combined with LB Jamie Collins on a 7-yard sack of Miami QB Ryan Fitzpatrick in the third quarter and then recorded his first solo sack when he dropped QB Josh Rosen for an 8-yard loss in the fourth quarter.

- The Patriots picked up their third win of the 2019 season and their 116th regular season win of this decade (2010-present) to move past the Indianapolis Colts (115 - 2000-09) for the most regular season wins in a decade. The Patriots hold the mark for most total wins in a decade with 132 (2010-present).
- The Patriots have not allowed a first half point in five straight games, after holding the Jets to zero points in the first half. The Patriots are the first to have a five-game streak in the Super Bowl era. The Patriots took a 14-0 first half lead in the AFC Championship Game vs. Kansas City (1/20/19), a 3-0 lead in Super Bowl LIII vs. LA Rams (2/3/19), a 20-0 lead vs. Pittsburgh (9/8/19), a 13-0 lead at Miami (9/15/19) and a 20-0 lead against the Jets today.
- Tom Brady moved out of a tie with Drew Brees for sole possession of second place on the NFL's all-time touchdown list with his two-touchdown performance against the Jets.
- Three of the Patriots 2019 NFL Draft picks played in their first NFL game. Second-round Pick DB Joejuan Williams, fourth-round pick QB Jarrett Stidham and third-round draft pick RB Damien Harris saw their first action. Williams and Harris were inactive for the first two games. Stidham's first pass completion was an 11-yard pass to WR Phillip Dorsett.

- The Patriots now have victories against all of their division opponents in 2019 and will avoid a series sweep by a division opponent for the 19th straight season to extend their NFL record. It is the longest such streak since the 1970 merger.
- Since Tom Brady became a starter in 2001, no quarterback has more wins at Buffalo than he does with 16.
- DB Devin McCourty picked off Buffalo QB Josh Allen in the first quarter and now has one interception in all four games of the 2019 season, tying a team record for most consecutive games with at least one interception. Mike Haynes set the original mark with a pick in four straight games in 1976.
- CB J.C. Jackson blocked his first career punt and Matthew Slater returned the blocked punt 11 yards for his first career touchdown.
- J.C. Jackson is the first player to have two interceptions and a blocked punt in the same game since New York Jets DB Erik McMillan did it in Week 1 of the 1989 season.
- RB James White moved past Tony Collins (261) into second place on the Patriots all-time reception list for a running back after catching eight passes. He now has 264 career receptions.

- The Patriots had one interception when DB Jason McCourty picked off a pass in the second quarter and now have 11 for the season, and are on pace to finish with 35 interceptions. The most interceptions in the modern era was the 1986 San Francisco 49ers with 39. The franchise record is 31.
- Tom Brady moved past Brett Favre (71,838) with an 11-yard pass to WR Julian Edelman in the third quarter. Brady entered the game needing 264 yards to move past Favre and finished with 348 yards for 71,923 total passing yards.
- WR Julian Edelman entered the game with 520 career receptions and caught eight passes to move past TE Rob Gronkowski (521) into fourth place on the Patriots all-time reception list with 528 receptions. Stanley Morgan is third with 534 receptions.
- Rookie DL Chase Winovich has now had at least a half of a sack in four straight games, tying a team mark for a rookie. He sacked Redskins QB Colt McCoy for an 8-yard loss in the first quarter. The last Patriots rookie with at least half a sack in four straight games was Brent Williams in 1986. Garin Veris also had a stretch of four straight games with at least a half a sack as a rookie in 1985.

- Rookie DL Chase Winovich returned a first quarter blocked punt by RB Brandon Bolden 6 yards for a touchdown. It marks the second time in 2019 that the Patriots have scored on a blocked punt.
- LB Kyle Van Noy returned a fumble 22 yards for a touchdown on a fumble forced by LB Jamie Collins in the fourth quarter. It is the first fumble returned for a touchdown for the Patriots since Van Noy returned a fumble 46 yards for a touchdown vs. NY Jets on Dec. 30, 2018.
- Tom Brady moved past Peyton Manning (71,940) into second place on the NFL's all-time passing yardage list on a 19-yard pass to RB Sony Michel on his first pass attempt of the game. He entered the game 18 yards behind Manning. Brady passed for 334 yards and now has 72,257 career passing yards.
- RB James White moved past Tony Collins (2,356) into third-place on the Patriots' all-time receiving yards list for a running back after his 46-yards against the Giants increased his totals to 2,388 receiving yards. He entered the game needing 15 yards to move past Collins.
- Edelman entered the game with 528 career receptions and caught nine passes to move past WR Stanley Morgan (534) into third place in franchise history with 537 receptions. He passed Morgan on a 7-yard pass from Tom Brady in the third quarter.

- RB Sony Michel found the endzone on a 3-yard run in the first quarter, a 1-yard run in the second quarter and a 1-yard run in the fourth quarter, giving the back three touchdowns on the night. Michel's three rushing touchdowns became the highest regular season mark of his career.
- The Patriots recorded a safety in the third quarter when the Jets fumbled the snap out of the end zone. It is the first safety the Patriots recorded since DL Eric Lee tackled QB Bryce Petty in the end zone vs. N.Y. Jets on Dec. 31, 2017.
- Tom Brady completed 31 passes to mark his 38th career game with at least 30 pass completions, third all-time. He has had back-to-back 30 completion games after completing 31 against the N.Y. Giants. This is the fifth time Brady has had back-to-back 30 completion games.
- With his 26-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter, WR Phillip Dorsett hauled in his fourth touchdown catch of the season, setting a new career high for a single season mark. Dorsett had three touchdown receptions in 2018.
- TE Ben Watson lined up in a Patriots uniform for the first time since 2009. Watson played his first six seasons with the Patriots and caught three passes for 18 yards in his return.

LaCrosse scored his first touchdown as a Patriot on the play (second touchdown of his career) and became the 76th different player to catch a touchdown from Brady, extending his NFL record.
- WR Julian Edelman caught five passes for 72 yards in the game, including a 30-yard reception after returning from injury in the fourth quarter on the game-winning drive. Edelman's first reception of the day broke a tie with Wes Welker for the most career connections with Brady with 568 following the completion of the game.
- RB Rex Burkhead caught four passes out-of-the-backfield including a 31-yard reception in the third quarter and totaled a career-high 77 receiving yards on the game.
- K Nick Folk made all three field goals he attempted, including a season-long 51-yard attempt in the third quarter.
- LB Dont'a Hightower recorded 1.5 sacks in the game, marking his second game with multiple sacks this season and fourth such game in his career.
- The Patriots secured their 11th consecutive AFC East title with the victory, extending their NFL record.

Roberts becomes the second defensive player to catch a touchdown from Brady (Mike Vrabel) and the 77th different touchdown target in Brady's career, extending his NFL record.
- With his 221 yards passing, Brady reached 4,000 yards on the season for the 11th time in his career. Brady joins Peyton Manning (14), Drew Brees (12) and Philip Rivers (11) as the only quarterbacks to throw for 4,000 yards at least 11 times.
- WR Julian Edelman caught three passes in the game and eclipsed 100 catches on the season, marking the second season in his career that Edelman has hit the mark.
- CB Stephon Gilmore recorded a pass defended, moving his total to 20 on the season. Gilmore becomes the first Patriot since 2000 to record 20 passes defended in back-to-back seasons.
- RB James White's fourth quarter receiving touchdown gave him 24 receiving touchdowns in his career, the most by an NFL running back in their first six seasons.
- RB Sony Michel scored on a rushing touchdown in the second quarter and set a new single-season high with seven rushing touchdowns on the year.
