THE MATCHUP

The New Orleans Saints (1-4) will seek their second straight victory when they host the New England Patriots (3-2) on Sunday at the Caesars Superdome.

The Saints are coming off a 26-14 win over the New York Giants at the Caesars Superdome on Sunday, which marked the most complete performance for New Orleans to date, as the Black and Gold scored 23 unanswered points, not surrendering any points for the final 42:59 of regulation.

Quarterback **Spencer Rattler** passed for 225 yards, an 87-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver **Rashid Shaheed** and posted a 99.5 quarterback rating. Shaheed finished with four receptions for 114 yards (28.5 avg.). Running back **Alvin Kamara** increased his career total of receptions to 590, surpassing Tiki Barber and Marcus Allen to move into fifth place all-time for catches by a running back.

The defense forced New York turnovers on five consecutive possessions, the first time an NFL team did so since the 2016 season and first time for the Black and Gold since doing it twice in the 1991 campaign. The Saints also played turnover-free football and now are tied for fourth in the NFL in turnover ratio (+5).

Jonas Sanker, **Jordan Howden** and **Cameron Jordan** recovered fumbles, with Howden returning a fumble by Giants running back **Cam Skattebo** and forced by defensive end **Bryan Bresee** 86 yards for a touchdown, tied for the second-longest fumble return in franchise history. Cornerback **Kool-Aid McKinstry** stopped two fourth-quarter Giants rallies with a pair of interceptions.

Sunday's game features two teams with head coaches in their first season with their teams (New Orleans' **Kellen Moore** and New England's **Mike Vrabel**) both coming up with statement victories in Week Five. The Patriots defeated the Buffalo Bills 23-20 on Sunday Night Football.

New England holds a 10-6 edge in the all-time series, but the Saints have won the last two contests, both taking place at Gillette Stadium. In the last meeting in 2023, the Saints shutout the Patriots, 34-0.

Around the NFC South: The Carolina Panthers (2-3) host the Dallas Cowboys (2-2-1), the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (4-1) host the San Francisco 49ers (4-1) and the Atlanta Falcons (2-2) host the Buffalo Bills (4-1) on Monday Night Football, with each division team having a home game.

THE HEAD COACHES



Named the 19th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 11, 2025 Kellen Moore joined the Black and Gold after serving as the offensive coordinator for the

Philadelphia Eagles in 2024. Under the guidance of Moore, quarterback Jalen Hurts and running back Saquon Barkley both had career years. Hurts finished with a career-high 103.7 passer rating, en route to Super Bowl LIX MVP honors. Barkley, who was named the 2024 National Football League Offensive Player of the Year by the *Associated Press*, had one of the best seasons on the ground in NFL history, leading the league with a franchise-record 2,005 rushing yards in the regular season. His 2,504 rushing yards including the postseason were a league record, earning Pro Bowl and All-Pro honors. The 2024 Eagles offense ranked eighth overall in net yards per game [367.2] and seventh in points per game [27.2]. Philadelphia rushed for a single-season club record 3,048 yards [sixth-best in NFL history] and finished second in the league in rushing yards per game [179.3]. Before joining the Eagles in 2024, Moore served as offensive coordinator of the Los Angeles Chargers in 2023 and the Dallas Cowboys from 2019-22 after starting his coaching career as quarterbacks coach in Dallas in 2018. In four seasons as offensive coordinator of the Cowboys, Moore's unit ranked second in the NFL in total offense [391.0 net yards per game] and scoring [27.7 points per game]. The Dallas offense was also the league's fourth-best passing offense [264.4 net yards per game] and ranked seventh in rushing offense [126.6 yards per game] over that span.

Moore played quarterback at Boise State [2007-11] before playing six seasons in the National Football League with the Detroit Lions [2012-14], Dallas Cowboys [2015-17].

Personal: Born July 5, 1988, in Prosser, Washington. He and his wife, Julie, have two daughters, Halle and Madelyn, and two sons, Kyler and Beckham. His younger brother, Kirby, is the offensive coordinator at the University of Missouri.



Mike Vrabel was introduced by Patriots Chairman/CEO Robert Kraft on Jan. 13, 2025. Vrabel is a three-time Super Bowl champion with New England and was voted into the Patriots Hall of Fame in 2023. He is recognized as one of the most versatile

linebackers and best free agent signings in team history. Vrabel is the seventh individual to become the head coach for a franchise he once helped win a Super Bowl as a player and the only one with three Super Bowl wins. Vrabel is the second head coach for the Patriots that was formerly a Patriots player. He is the sixth Patriots head coach to have played professional football. Vrabel has spent his football life around accomplished leaders. After entering the NFL as a player in 1997, he played or coached under Bill Belichick, Bill Cowher, Romeo Crennel, Urban Meyer and Bill O'Brien. He gleaned attributes from each that helped form his philosophies as a head coach. Vrabel has 14 years of coaching experience, including 11 years in the NFL and three seasons at Ohio State. The Tennessee Titans hired him as their head coach in 2018 and he led the Titans to two division titles and three playoff appearances during his six seasons at the helm. In 2019, the Titans upset the Patriots in Foxborough in the wild card round, then defeated the No. 1 seed Ravens in Baltimore the following week to advance to the AFC Championship Game, where they lost to the eventual Super Bowl Champion Kansas City Chiefs. In 2021, the Titans claimed the top seed in the AFC with a 12-5 record, earning Vrabel NFL Coach of the Year honors. Vrabel became the linebackers coach at Ohio State in 2011 and then served as the defensive line coach for the Buckeyes for two seasons [2012-13]. In 2014, Vrabel was hired by Houston Texans head coach Bill O'Brien as the linebackers coach [2014-16] and was promoted to defensive coordinator for the Texans in 2017. After six seasons as the head coach of the Titans [2018-23], he spent last season with the Cleveland Browns as a coaching and personnel consultant. With playoff appearances in 2019, 2020 and 2021, Vrabel became the sixth head coach in Oilers/Titans history to coach at least three playoff teams. The Titans won back-to-back AFC South titles in 2020 and 2021.

SERIES HISTORY

New England dominated the series in early years, with a stretch where the Patriots won the first five games between the two clubs and currently leads the series 10-6. New Orleans posted three-straight victories from 1989-95 - all on the road. The Saints broke a three-game losing streak with a 38-17 win over the Patriots on Monday, November 30, 2009, when they improved their record to 11-0.

Eight of the 16 games have been decided by a touchdown or less - including two by a field goal. The Saints have a 2-5 record in New Orleans, looking for their first home victory against the Patriots since a Nov. 30, 2009 38-17 win.

LAST MEETING

Saints 34, New England Patriots 0; October 8, 2023 @ Gillette Stadium - New Orleans improved to 3-2 and snapped a two-game losing streak, hutting out the New England Patriots, 34-0, at Gillette Stadium, recording three takeaways that led to 17 points, while not turning over the football on offense.

On defense S Tyrann Mathieu returned an interception 27 yards for a touchdown and LB **Pete Werner** recorded his first career pick, as New Orleans became the only team in the NFL to have three shut-outs since 2021.

Offensively, RB **Alvin Kamara** led the club in rushing yards, following an afternoon when he grinded out a game-high 80 yards in the ground with one rushing touchdown, his 73rd to become the franchise's all-time leader in touchdowns. TE **Foster Moreau** also caught his first touchdown as a Saint, a fourth quarter six-yard grab.

SEASON GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 1: Arizona Cardinals 20, Saints 13; September 7 @ Caesars Superdome - The New Orleans Saints fell to the Cardinals in the season opener, despite rebounding from a 20-10 third quarter deficit to come within an end zone throw of a game-tying touchdown.

Heroics on offense, defense and special teams aided the Black and Gold in a promising fourth quarter. With 4:40 left in the contest, Saints DT Bryan Bresee blocked a 46-yard field goal attempt. QB Spencer Rattler then converted a trio of first downs on throws to TE Juwan Johnson and WR Devaughn Vele and a 12-yard scramble by the signal-caller to set up a 28-yard field goal by K Blake Grupe with 2:44 left.

New Orleans then forced a three-and-out, punctuated by a third down sack of Cardinals QB Kyler Murray by CB Alontae Taylor for a 15-yard loss to get New Orleans the ball back with 1:49 left.

Rattler helped advance the Saints to the Cardinals 18-yard line to set up three tries at the end zone, the closest being a laser to Johnson that was broken up by Arizona defenders Jalen Thompson and Budda Baker.

Rattler completed 27-of-46 passes for 214 yards and carried four times for 29 yards. Johnson led the Saints in receiving with eight grabs for 76 yards. Murray completed 21-of-29 passes for 163 yards with two TDs and a 108.8 passer rating, carrying seven times for 38 yards. New Orleans RB Alvin Kamara's first half 18-yard rushing TD was the 1,000th touchdown scored at the Caesars Superdome.

New Orleans outgained Arizona through the air, 208-130, but the Cardinals held the ball for 33:46 of the contest to win the time of possession battle. The loss snapped a six-game winning streak for the Saints in openers. The Saints fell to 15-17 against the Cardinals in the all-time regular season series.

Week 2: San Francisco 49ers 26, Saints 21; Sept. 14, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - The Saints dropped their second game of the season to the 49ers, despite bouncing back from a 26-14 early fourth quarter deficit to have a chance of winning the game in the final minutes.

An impressive drive and defensive stops paved the way for New Orleans to be back in it in the very end. After going down two scores with 12:18 left in the fourth, QB Spencer Rattler and company made some magic happen, converting a trio of first downs to WR Chris Olave and RB Alvin Kamara to set up the eventual three-yard TD to WR Devaughn Vele. The score capped off a 13 play, 71-yard drive in just six minutes flat to bring the Saints back within five. After two three-and-out drives by both teams, Rattler led a charge that just fell short. Starting on the New Orleans' six yard-line with 2:40 left, the signal-caller picked up two first downs before the 49ers defense became too much to handle.

Rattler completed 25-of-34 passes [73.5%] for 207 yards with career-highs of three passing TDs and a rating of 118.1. He also carried four times for 14 yards.

Mac Jones filled in for an injured Brock Purdy and went 26-of-39 for 279 yards and also threw three TDs with a 113.1 passer rating. New Orleans outgained San Francisco on the ground, 121-77, but the 49ers beat the Saints in passing yardage, 344-307, and were 53% [8-for-15] on third down to New Orleans' 36% [four-for-11].

Week 3: Seattle Seahawks 44, Saints 13; Sept. 21, 2025 @ Lumen Field - New Orleans' season continued to get off to a rocky start, as they fell to the Seahawks at Lumen Field.

The Saints had gotten off to a solid start, getting the ball first and quarterback Spencer Rattler completed a pass to wide receiver Chris Olave and running back Alvin Kamara gained seven yards to put the team near midfield. However the drive stalled out and the Saints failed to convert on fourth down, giving the Seahawks the ball back. After a Seahawks first down, the Saints had stopped two run plays for one-yard gains, but on third down, DT Bryan Bresee was assessed a 12-yard unnecessary roughness penalty on a third down play that extended a drive and set up a touchdown. The Seahawks extended their lead to 21-0 by the end of the first quarter, where Seattle rookie wide receiver Tory Horton returned a punt 95 yards for a touchdown and blocked punt set up a third score.

On a drive spanning between the first and second quarter, the Saints finally got on the scoreboard with a 27-yard field goal by kicker Blake Grupe, but the Seahawks took advantage of a long kickoff return to set up a scoring play of a 14-yard pass from quarterback Sam Darnold to Horton.

The Seahawks took a halftime 38-6 lead, while the Black and Gold kept up their intensity, holding Seattle to a pair of field goals and recording a turnover, while tight end Jack Stoll scored his first touchdown.

"We didn't do enough to give ourselves a chance," said Saints Head Coach Kellen Moore. "We need to give ourselves an opportunity to compete in these games. Too many penalties, too many missed opportunities, big special teams plays early in this game that put us behind. I appreciate our guys' battle through the second half. They didn't quit and I do appreciate that. But this is going to be a very powerful lesson for our guys on adversity and how we respond, and simply, we can't start the football game like that with the sequence that we had and put ourselves in a really poor situation."

Rattler completed 28-of-39 passes for 218 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Olave had a career-high ten catches and Stoll had his first career touchdown reception.

SEASON GAME SUMMARIES

Week 4: Buffalo Bills 30, Saints 19; September 28, 2025 @ Highmark Stadium - New Orleans faced a 11-point deficit with 6:42 left in the third quarter and was able to cut it to two with 8:53 remaining in the contest, but ultimately the Saints never took the lead in the loss. New Orleans was efficient offensively, rushing for a season-high 189 yards, scoring a touchdown on their first offensive possession for the first time this season. But with Buffalo leading 14-7 in the second quarter, New Orleans was unable to capitalize or score points, when rookie S Jonas Sanker recorded his first career interception near midfield early in the second quarter. QB Spencer Rattler connected with WR Chris Olave for a three-yard TD late in the third quarter to reduce Buffalo's lead to 21-16, followed by a Blake Grupe field goal early in the fourth quarter. But the Bills answered with a four-play, 60-yard drive to gain a nine-point advantage. This was followed by a Saints drive that stalled at the Buffalo 43-yard line on downs and the Bills then took advantage of a roughing the punter penalty to hold onto the ball and kick a field goal with 2:12 left in the contest. New Orleans fell to 0-4, while Buffalo improved to 4-0

Week 5: Saints 26, New York Giants 14; October 4, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - Spencer Rattler was so fired up by the sight of Rashid Shaheed hauling in his deep throw down the right sideline that the second-year quarterback started springing the length of the field to join the celebration. Rattler's pivotal completion to Shaheed went for an 87-yard touchdown, DB Jordan Howden returned a fumble 86 yards for a score, and New Orleans defeated the turnover-prone Giants 26-14 for the Saints' first win under rookie coach Kellen Moore. "Probably the fastest I ran all game," Rattler quipped when asked about chasing Rashid to the end zone. "Those plays create energy for the whole team, the whole crowd and we definitely want to have more of those." Such moments had been rare for New Orleans since late last season, which ended with the Saints on a four-game skid before the Moore era began with four more losses to start the 2025 season. That changed Sunday against the New York Giants (1-4) - also the previous team to lose to the Saints last Dec. 8.

And after the game, the Saints transformed their home locker room - equipped with a sound system and color-changing LED lighting - into "Club Dub" for the first time since beating Cleveland on November 17.

"It's been a while since we had the fog and the music playing afterward," Howden said. "I almost forgot how that was."

The 37-year old Moore celebrated his first victory since last season's Super Bowl - a game also played in the Caesars Superdome, when he was Philadelphia's offensive coordinator.

"This is a special group," Moore said, praising Saints players' "resiliency to hang in there through some challenging times the first month."

Rattler earned his first victory in 11 career starts, passing for 225 yards without turning the ball over or taking a sack, while Shaheed finished with four catches for 114 yards for the Saints (1-4).

"It feels good to get that first win," Rattler said. "It was a team win. The defense played great. The offensive line was elite."

Giants rookie quarterback Jaxson Dart, who won his first career start last week, passed for 202 yards and two touchdowns, but also turned the ball over three times, the first when the ball slipped from his hand during a scramble in the third quarter. DE Cameron Jordan recovered as Dart, laying across Jordan's legs, disgustingly put both hands over his face.

"We had a lot of opportunities and moved the ball just fine," Dart said. "We hurt ourselves. We just kind of gave this game away."

Dart threw his first two career interceptions in the fourth quarter - both caught by Kool-Aid McKinstry for his first career picks.

New York committed five turnovers in all, none more costly than when RB Cam Skattebo was stripped by DT Bryan Bresee at the Saints 12-yard line, giving Howden the chance to scoop the loose ball on the 14 and sprint untouched the other way early in the fourth quarter.

"It was a game-changing play," Moore said.

Indeed, the Giants were threatening to score a go-ahead touchdown when Howden saw the ball on the ground behind the line of scrimmage, picked it up and recalled thinking, "Just run - run for my life."

Dart completed his first five passes for 44 yards, capped by his short TD pass to TE Theo Johnson. He mixed in a 20-yard scramble with three more completions during New York's next series, which ended with Dart's 15-yard strike to Johnson for a 14-3 lead.

New Orleans closed to 14-13 on Shaheed's TD - the Saints' longest offensive play since Drew Brees connected with Brandin Cooks for a 98-yard score in 2016.

Shaheed said he tried to make S Tyler Nubin believe he was headed across the field to the left, "and once I saw his hips turn, I broke toward the [right] corner and the rest is history.

It was also Shaheed's sixth career touchdown reception of 53 or more yards, and his third covering at least 68 yards.

After Saints K Blake Grupe missed a 52-yard field goal that would have given New Orleans the lead late in the first half, the Saints got the ball back when LB Demario Davis forced receiver Darius Slayton's fumble at the Saints 35 and S Jonas Sanker recovered.

That led to Grupe's short field goal for a 16-14 Saints lead at halftime.

FIVE STRAIGHT

In Sunday's 26-14 win over the New York Giants, the Saints recorded takeaways off of five consecutive Giants possessions. This was the first time this occurred in an NFL game since the Kansas City Chiefs intercepted New York Jets QB Ryan Fitzpatrick on the last five Jets possessions of the contest in a 24-3 Chiefs win on September 25, 2016. It was the first time the Saints had defensive takeaways on five consecutive possessions, since they had five straight interceptions in a 27-3 win over the Phoenix Cardinals on December 22, 1991 at Sun Devil Stadium. COORDINATOR CORNER


**SPECIAL TEAMS COORD.
PHIL GALIANO**

Phil Galiano is in his first season as the Saints' special teams coordinator and his seventh campaign in New Orleans, spending his first six years as the club's assistant special teams coach. Galiano is a veteran in the coaching ranks with 25 years of experience, including nine seasons in the NFL.

Galiano's work over the past six years with Darren Rizzi, who served as coordinator from 2019-24, helped make the kicking game an important key to victory for New Orleans. On coverage units, J.T. Gray's 93 tackles rank first in the NFL, with the special teams ace selected as an *Associated Press* All-Pro three times. The punting game has produced the top five seasons in club history for punts inside-the-20-yard line. Since 2019, the Saints have excelled in the return game. Over the six-season period, the team has been ranked fifth in the NFL in punt return average (10.4) and are tied for second in the league with three punts returned for touchdowns. The coverage units have allowed the third-lowest punt return average (7.0).

Special teams continued to be a bright spot for New Orleans in 2024, highlighted by Gray being selected as an All-Pro after recording an NFL-best 26 coverage tackles and one blocked punt. New Orleans ranked first in the NFL in opponent starting field position after kickoffs (28.2), punts inside-the-20 yard line (franchise-record 41), fifth in punt return average (12.5), seventh in opponent field goal percentage (78.6), eighth in opponent punt return average (7.6) and tenth in field goal percentage (87.1). Two blocked field goals were crucial in a pair of three-point victories. K Blake Grupe made 27-of-31 field goal attempts, six-of-eight from 50+ yards, an 87.1 percentage and scored 112 points. WR/RS Rashid Shaheed returned a punt for a touchdown for the second consecutive season.

A three-year starter at safety for Shippensburg, Galiano served as a tri-captain during his senior campaign. He helped lead the Raiders to consecutive winning seasons (1997-99). The Norristown, Pa. native graduated a degree in business administration.

COORDINATOR CORNER


**OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR
DOUG NUSSMEIER**

Doug Nussmeier is in his first season as the Saints' offensive coordinator and tenth campaign as a coach in the National Football League. A 24-year coaching veteran, Nussmeier returns to New Orleans after originally being a fourth round pick (116th overall) of the Saints in the 1994 NFL Draft out of Idaho.

Nussmeier joins the Saints after spending the 2024 season as quarterbacks coach of the Philadelphia Eagles under Saints Head Coach Kellen Moore, who served as offensive coordinator, where he proved to be a key piece of their Super Bowl LIX Champion offensive coaching staff. Jalen Hurts flourished under Nussmeier's tutelage, posting a career-high 103.7 passer rating, fifth in the league and tying for the fifth-most rushing touchdowns (14) in the league (first among quarterbacks).

Nussmeier rejoined the NFL with the Dallas Cowboys in 2018, after previously spending two seasons with the St. Louis Rams from 2006-07 as quarterbacks coach. After serving on the Cowboys staff from 2018-22, he served as quarterbacks coach of the Los Angeles Chargers in 2023. In between, he spent 13 seasons coaching at the collegiate level, where he tutored eight different players who were selected in the first or second round of the NFL Draft.

Nussmeier finished his career at the University of Idaho as the program's all-time leading passer with 10,824 career passing yards over five years (1989-93). He won the Walter Payton Award in 1993, which was at the time given annually to the top player in NCAA Division 1-AA after throwing for a program-record 33 touchdown passes and leading the Vandals to a national semifinal berth. Nussmeier was named Big Sky Conference Offensive Player of the Year in 1992 and was inducted into the University of Idaho Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.

A Portland, Ore. native, Nussmeier and his wife, Christi, have two sons, Garrett and Colton, and a daughter, Ashlynn. Garrett is in his fifth season as a quarterback at LSU.

COORDINATOR CORNER


**DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR
BRANDON STALEY**

Brandon Staley is in his first season as the Saints' defensive coordinator. Staley is a 19-year coaching veteran with three as head coach of the Los Angeles Chargers.

This will be Staley's second stint as a defensive coordinator after leading the Los Angeles Rams to finish first in the NFL in total defense in 2020.

Staley arrived in New Orleans after serving most recently as assistant coach/defense of the San Francisco 49ers in 2024. Working with multiple position groups, as well as aiding 49ers Head Coach Kyle Shanahan, the San Francisco defense finished the season ranked eighth in the NFL in opponent net yards per game (317.4) and fifth against the pass (192.8 ypg.). DL Nick Bosa was selected to the Pro Bowl after recording nine sacks, one interception, one forced fumble and one recovery. ILB Fred Warner was selected to the Pro Bowl, Associated Press All-Pro and PFWA All-NFL, as he registered 131 tackles (76 solo), two interceptions returned for 70 yards, including a 45-yard touchdown return and four forced fumbles. Saints CB Issac Yiadom led the team with a career-high three takeaways.

During his tenure as Chargers head coach, Staley led Los Angeles to a 24-24 record and guided the franchise to its first postseason appearance since the 2018 season. In his final season with the Chargers (2023), Staley helped QB Justin Herbert continue one of the best starts to a career in NFL history as no quarterback has more completions or passing yards over the first four seasons of a career than Herbert. Staley also saw WR Keenan Allen and LB Khalil Mack put together career seasons and earn themselves nods to the Pro Bowl Games roster. Before becoming an NFL coach, Staley spent 11 seasons coaching at the collegiate level. In 2016, Staley earned National Coordinator of the Year honors for Division III.

A native of Perry, Ohio, Staley played collegiately as a quarterback at the University of Dayton for four seasons (2001-04) before finishing at Division II Mercyhurst College in 2005. He and his wife Amy, have three sons, Colin, Will and Grant.

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH


**ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH/
RUNNING BACKS
JOEL THOMAS**

Joel Thomas, a 25-year coaching veteran, returns to New Orleans to tutor the clubs running backs in 2025. He previously spent nine years with the Black and Gold (2015-23). After spending the 2024 season coaching the New York Giants running backs, the Port Angeles, Wash. native returns to New Orleans with a additional title of associate head coach.

During Thomas' initial nine-year tenure in tutoring the Saints running backs, the Black and Gold tied for second in the NFL with 161 rushing touchdowns and his backs registered 25 individual 100-yard performances. Under his tutelage, Alvin Kamara, the Saints' all-time rushing yardage leader, earned five consecutive Pro Bowl selections (2017-21) and was the only NFL player with at least 1,160 total yards from scrimmage in each of the seven seasons he first coached him, three of them 1,500 or more.

In 2023 under Thomas, Kamara became the franchise's all-time leader in yards from scrimmage, rushing touchdowns and total touchdowns. Thomas also coached Mark Ingram II, New Orleans' all-time rushing leader from 2021-24 (6,500 yards), for six years, including two 1,000-yard campaigns. During Thomas' first New Orleans tenure, the Saints ranked in the top six in the NFL in rushing three times (2017, 2018 and 2020).

With the Giants in 2024, Thomas oversaw the development of rookie tailback Tyrone Tracy Jr., a fifth round pick. Tracy earned PFWA All-Rookie when he carried 192 times for 839 yards (4.4 avg.) with five TDs to rank second among NFL rookies for the season and New York rookies all-time in rushing yards. He added 38 receptions for 284 yards with one TD to tally 1,123 yards from scrimmage, the fifth-highest total among NFL rookies in 2024 and fourth among Giants rookies all-time.

Thomas lettered as a running back at Idaho from 1993-98 and still holds Vandals career records with 3,929 rushing yards and 51 touchdowns. He was inducted into the University of Idaho Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008. Thomas earned his degree in communications in 1998.

Thomas and his wife, Ebbie, have two boys, Teyo and Niko.

ON THIS DAY

This week's game against the New England Patriots is being played on October 12. The Saints are 5-3 on October 12. The Black and Gold have played eight different teams on the date with seven of the contests at home. This is the first time they will play the Patriots on this date. Among the most memorable of the victories, was a last second win that was the team's first in the now named Caesars Superdome. A Saints victory this Sunday would mark the franchise's 200th all-time regular season win at the Caesars Superdome, now celebrating it's 50th birthday.

1969 - The Saints lose to the Cleveland Browns, 27-17, at Tulane Stadium.

1975 - The Saints defeat the Green Bay Packers 20-19 on a 20-yard Richie Szaro field goal as time expired. It was the franchise's first win in the recently christened Louisiana Superdome. QB Archie Manning tossed a touchdown and Saints RB Mike Strachan rushed for 105 yards and one touchdown.

1980 - The Saints fell to the Detroit Lions, 24-13 at the Silverdome.

1986 - New Orleans defeats the Indianapolis Colts, 17-14 at the Hoosier Dome with RB Rueben Mayes having the first 100-yard rushing game of his career and S Brett Maxie recording an interception.

1997 - New Orleans falls to the Atlanta Falcons, 23-17 at the Superdome.

2003 - New Orleans improves to 2-4 with a 20-13 win over the Chicago Bears at the Superdome, behind a 116-yard rushing performance by RB Deuce McAllister and a sack and forced fumble by CB Fred Thomas.

2008 - New Orleans improves to 3-3 with a 34-3 win over the Oakland Raiders at the Superdome, where the Saints gained 441 total net yards and surrendered only 226 total net yards. QB Drew Brees threw for 320 yards, three touchdowns and zero interceptions and LB Jonathan Vilma finished with 11 tackles and a pass breakup in the complete victory.

2020 - New Orleans evens their record at 2-2 with a 30-27 overtime win over the Los Angeles Chargers before only 749 fans in a COVID-19 reduced capacity crowd at the Superdome. Trailing 27-20 in the fourth quarter, QB Taysom Hill tied the score with a nine-yard rushing touchdown with 52 seconds left and QB Drew Brees engineered a game-winning field goal drive in overtime that spanned nine plays and 48 yards in what would be the final Monday Night Football appearance of the signal-caller's career.

Numerous Saints players, coaches and administrators are not the only members of their families to make a name for themselves in pro football. 22 Saints players, coaches or front office staff have relatives who have played, coached or served in the front office in the NFL.

Tight Ends Coach Chase Haslett - Father, Jim Haslett, played linebacker for the Buffalo Bills from 1979-85 and finished his playing career with the New York Jets in 1986. Haslett was an assistant for the Los Angeles Raiders, Saints, Pittsburgh Steelers, St. Louis Rams, Washington Redskins, Cincinnati Bengals and Tennessee Titans and was head coach of the Saints from 2000-05, where he guided the franchise to their first playoff victory in 2000 and was named NFL Coach of the Year.

Defensive Pass Game Coordinator Terry Joseph - Cousin Vance Joseph is currently defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos, was their head coach from 2017-18 and has also been an assistant coach with six other teams, after also playing for the New York Jets and Indianapolis Colts. Younger cousin, Sammy, played for the San Francisco 49ers in 2007.

Vice President/Asst. General Manager-College Personnel Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame linebacker/center E.J. Holub. Grandson of Philadelphia Eagles running back and Chicago Bears personnel executive Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, JoJo, has been a longtime scout in the NFL Player Personnel ranks.

Run Game Coordinator T.J. Paganetti - Brother, Ryan, has coached with the Philadelphia Eagles and Jacksonville Jaguars. He is currently the Head Coach Research Specialist of the Las Vegas Raiders.

Edges Coach Jay Rodgers - Brother, Jeff, is a longtime NFL assistant who is currently assistant head coach/special teams coordinator for the Arizona Cardinals.

Linebackers Coach Peter Sirmon - Son, Jackson, currently plays for the New York Jets.

Assistant Wide Receivers Coach Kyle Valero - Father, Art, was an NFL assistant for ten years.

ROSTER ROLL CALL

On the Saints active roster as of September 22, 30 were on the active roster, a reserve list of the practice squad at the end of the 2024 season. Among newcomers, the roster includes six unrestricted free agents, one waiver acquisition, four veteran free agents, four trade acquisitions, six draft picks and two rookie free agents.

Of the players, 43 have less than four years of previous NFL experience, including 12 rookies. 45 colleges and universities are represented on the Saints' 90-man roster. Of that total, 18 are represented by multiple Saints, three from Ohio State, Oregon State and South Carolina and two from BYU, Louisville, LSU, Weber State, Northern Iowa, Nebraska and Tennessee.

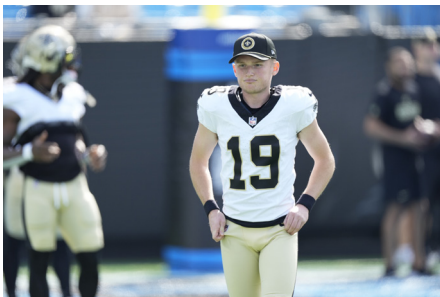

Bucking the Odds

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or after developing their careers initially on the practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster have played key roles on offense, defense and special teams.

Over the past 22 years, the Saints [2018-22: DB **J.T. Gray**, WR/RS **Deonte Harty** and WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed**] and San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers [2003: G **Kris Dielman**, TE **Antonio Gates** and WR **Kasim Osgood**] are the only two teams to have three players signed as undrafted free agents be selected to a Pro Bowl for the team that originally signed them.



Joining New Orleans following the 2023 NFL Draft after a graduate transfer season at Notre Dame and playing the first four years of his college career at Arkansas State, K **Blake Grupe** won a pre-season competition to handle placekicking duties and in three seasons, has drilled 67-of-83 field goal attempts [80.7 pct.], including 27-of-31 kicks [87.1 pct.] in 2024 with a career-long of 57 yards in the season-opening win over Carolina. Grupe drilled two 50+ yard kicks through the uprights in two contests in 2024. In the past two contests, Grupe has made 50+-yard kicks in successive weeks.

DE **Carl Granderson** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming and has appeared in 93 games with 46 starts, posting 266 tackles [158 solo], 33 sacks for a loss of 202.5 yards, eight passes defended, four forced fumbles and two recoveries, one blocked field goal and one blocked extra point. In 2025, Granderson has been hot from the start, starting all five games and recording 26 tackles [19 solo], 4.5 sacks and two pass breakups. Through the first five contests, Granderson is tied for seventh in the NFL in sacks. In the first two games, he recorded more than one sack.

An integral part of both the team’s offense and return game, through the first six games in 2024 before suffering a season-ending knee injury vs. Tampa Bay, October 13, Shaheed had 20 receptions for 349 yards [17.5 avg.] with touchdowns of 43-, 59- and 70 yards, carried six times for 29 yards, returned nine punts for a league-best 143 yards [NFL-high 15.9 avg.] and six kickoffs for 171 yards [28.5 avg.]. Rasheed’s 15.9 punt return average ranks first in the NFL and his 692 all-purpose yards rank fourth. Overall, since coming into the league in 2022, his 15 catches of 40 yards or more rank third in the NFL.

With his second career punt return on a 54-yard runback on October 13, 2024 vs. Tampa Bay, Shaheed joins Reggie Bush [4] and Tyrone Hughes [2] as only the third Saint with multiple punt returns for touchdowns.

In 2025, a healthy Shaheed has provided a spark both on offense and in the return game. In the first five contests, he has recorded 22 receptions for 288 yards [13.1 avg.] with two touchdowns and in the return game, he has brought back six punts for 91 yards [15.2 avg.], including a 40-yard runback on Sept. 21 at Seattle. He is currently ranked sixth in the National Football League in punt return average.

TE **Juwan Johnson** first led Saints tight ends with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position that offseason after playing wideout in college and as a rookie in 2020, he signed as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. Johnson led Saints tight ends with a career-high 50 receptions for a club-best 548 yards in 2024, adding three touchdown grabs. He has led the Saints with 15 receiving touchdowns over the past four seasons, tied for sixth over that period among NFL tight ends. In his career, Johnson has played in 72 games (39 starts), making 170 receptions for 1,843 yards with 19 TDs.

In 2025, Johnson ranks third among tight ends in receiving with 24 grabs for 221 yards with one TD. His 166 receptions as a tight end (four additional were as a WR in 2020) are fourth among the position all-time for the club.

Signing with New Orleans following the 2025 NFL Draft, G **Torricelli Simpkins III** started all 48 games with along the offensive lines at North Carolina Central [2021-23] and South Carolina [2024]. After playing the first three seasons of his career at NCCU, where he was a third-team All-American in 2023, he transferred to South Carolina in 2024. He opened all 13 games at right guard for the resurgent Gamecocks and received third-team All-SEC honors. He competed on all three interior positions in 2025 training camp and secured a roster spot based on his play in preseason games following injuries to the offensive line. After contributing on special teams in the first two contests, Simpkins received his first career start at left guard at Seattle on Sept. 21, saw extensive action at right guard on Sept. 28 at Buffalo and started at right guard in Sunday’s victory over the New York Giants, where the offensive line did not give up a sack.

Signing with New Orleans following the 2024 NFL Draft, LB **Isaiah Stallbird** played at Nebraska [2019] and South Dakota State [2020-23]. He played in 64 games and made 251 tackles, 18.5 for loss, three sacks, an interception, 19 passes defended, five forced fumbles, two recoveries and 19 blocked punts for the 2022 and 2023 FCS National Champions. Stallbird finished with three coverage stops in five games. Through five games in 2025, Stallbird has five coverage stops.

WR **Mason Tipton** stuck on the 53-man roster in 2024 after showing bright spots in the preseason following a college career at Yale, where he posted 132 receptions for 1,067 yards with 19 touchdowns. In 2024, he had 14 receptions for 99 yards. In the 2025 preseason, Tipton led the team in all receiving categories with eight receptions for 158 yards [19.8 avg.] with one touchdown, ranking fifth in the league in receiving yardage.

DRAFT HISTORY

The New Orleans Saints 2025 draft class, the first under first-year Head Coach Kellen Moore features six-of-nine players currently contributing to the team’s 53-man roster, three offensive players, as well as three defenders, with three [T Kelvin Banks Jr., S Jonas Sanker and CB Quincy Riley] starting on Sunday against the New York Giants. On offense, Executive VP/General Manager Mickey Loomis split the selections among four different positions. Defensively, New Orleans added players at four different positions as the unit makes the switch to Defensive Coordinator Brandon Staley’s 3-4 scheme, a safety, a linebacker and a cornerback currently contributing.

FROM THE FIELD TO THE SIDELINE

Kellen Moore is the seventh New Orleans Saints head coach to have played in the National Football League, joining Tom Fears, John North, Dick Nolan, Mike Ditka, Jim Haslett and Sean Payton. Moore, who finished his college playing career at Boise State with a record of 50-3, the most wins by a quarterback in NCAA history, played six seasons for the Detroit Lions (2012-14) and Dallas Cowboys (2015-17).



BARKING UP THE RIGHT TREE

With Moore as his offensive coordinator in 2024 with the Eagles, Philadelphia running back Saquon Barkley had one of the best seasons by a tailback in NFL history. The consensus National Football League Offensive Player of the Year, a first-team Associated Press All-Pro and Pro Bowl starter selection, Barkley led the league with a franchise-record 2,005 rushing yards in the regular season, making him just the ninth player in NFL history to post 2,000+ rushing yards in a season, eight-most in league records. Including 499 rushing yards in the playoffs which ranked third all-time, Barkley’s 2,504 rushing yards were the most in NFL single-season history (regular season and postseason combined).

NOTHING HURTS

In 2024 in Philadelphia, under the tutelage of Moore who served as offensive coordinator and Saints Offensive Coordinator Doug Nussmeier, who was quarterbacks coach, Eagles signal-caller Jalen Hurts was able to put together one of the best seasons of his career. The Super Bowl Most Valuable Player ranked among the top eight in the league in yards per attempt (fourth, 8.0), passer rating (fifth, career-high 103.7), completion percentage (eight, career-high 6.7 pct.) and total touchdowns (32, eighth). In Super Bowl LIX, Hurts completed 17-of-22 passes (77.3 pct.) for 221 yards, two touchdowns, a 119.7 passer rating and 72 rushing yards with one touchdown on the ground, the most rushing yards by a signal-caller ever in a Super Bowl.

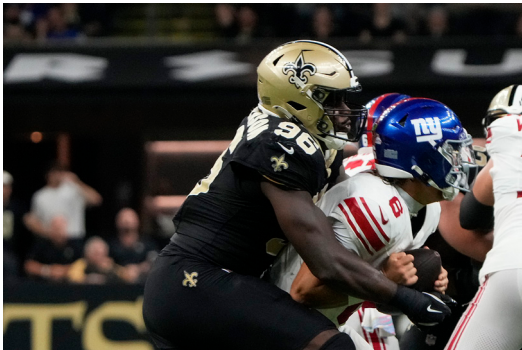

DRAFT CONTRIBUTORS

The team’s top three selections in the 2024 NFL Draft started multiple games for the Saints in 2024. Below is a summary of the performance of five of the top six 2024 draft picks, as each of them of them look to make a jump in 2025:



RT Taliese Fuaga, Oregon State [D1] - Selected with the 14th overall pick out of Oregon State, the Saints were able to address an immediate need, while also acquiring a building block for the future. Fuaga was an anchor on the Saints offensive line in his rookie campaign, seamlessly moving over to the left tackle position for his first NFL season, where he opened every game for an offense that improved in every rushing metric. Starting all 17 games, he was the first Saint to start every game in his rookie year at the offensive line’s most challenging position since J.T. Taylor in 1978. Now in 2025, Fuaga has moved back to his natural right tackle position. After missing the Week Three contest at Seattle, he returned to the lineup in Week Four and helped spur a run game that gained a season-high 189 yards. On Sunday against the New York Giants, he anchored and offensive line that kept QB Spencer Rattler’s jersey clean and did not give up a sack.



CB Kool-Aid McKinstry, Alabama [D2] - Selected in the second round of the 2024 NFL Draft with the 41st overall pick out of Alabama, McKinstry arrived in New Orleans having covered many of the nation’s top wideouts in the Southeastern Conference for the last three years.

In 2023, the consensus first-team All-American was a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award, making 32 tackles and seven passes defended. In New Orleans, McKinstry played in 15 games with nine starts, moving into the starting lineup in Week Eight and recorded 44 tackles with seven pass breakups, often tasked with covering an opponent’s top wideout. Through the first five contests/starts of 2025, he has recorded 20 tackles [17 solo] with, two interceptions and four pass breakups, recording the first two picks of his career in Sunday’s win over the New York Giants. In 20 career games with 14 starts, he has career totals of 61 stops [48 solo], two picks, 11 pass breakups and one special teams tackle.



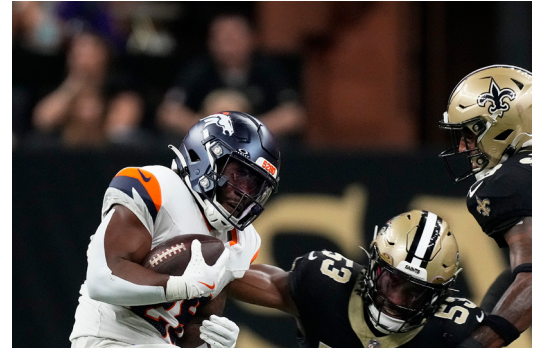
QB Spencer Rattler, South Carolina [D5a] - Selected with the team's first selection in the fifth round [150th overall] out of South Carolina, Rattler completed 900-of-1,313 passes [68.5 pct.] for 10,807 yards with 77 touchdowns, and only 32 interceptions for the Gamecocks [2022-23] and Oklahoma [2019-21]. As a rookie, Rattler played in seven games with six starts and completed 130-of-228 passes for a Saints rookie-record 1,317 yards with four TDs, also carrying 18 times for 146 yards.

After opening the most games by a Saints rookie signal-caller since Archie Manning in 1971, Rattler captured the starting position in a preseason competition. In the 2025 season opener vs. Arizona on Sept. 7, Rattler completed 27 passes for 214 yards, while carrying four times for 29 yards, while leading his team to the Cardinals 18-yard line for three pass attempts to potentially tie a 20-13 Cardinals lead.

Rattler took another big step forward on Sept. 14, vs. San Francisco, when he completed 25-of-34 passes [73.5 pct.] for 207 yards with three touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 118.1 passer rating. Rattler also carried four times for 14 yards, including a nine-yard scramble on third-and-nine. He set career-bests for completion percentage, touchdown passes and passer rating.

Rattler led the Black and Gold to his first victory as a starter on Sunday vs. the New York Giants, when he completed 21-of-31 passes [67.7 pct.] for 225 yards with a career-long 87-yard touchdown pass to WR Rashid Shaheed, tied for the fifth-longest play from scrimmage in franchise history and a 99.5 passer rating.

On the season, Rattler has completed 118-of-177 passes [66.7 pct.] for 990 yards with six touchdowns, only one interception and a 90.4 passer rating. Rattler has also utilized his feet, carrying 22 times for 123 yards [5.6 avg.].



LB Jaylan Ford, Texas [D5c] - The last of three fifth round draft picks by the club in 2024, Ford was selected out of Texas, where during he posted 287 tackles, 27.5 stops for loss, three sacks, ten pass breakups, six interceptions, four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. As a rookie, Ford established a role on special teams, contributing five tackles before suffering a fibula injury in Week 17. Ford is expected to comprise a role as a core special teams player in 2025, making one stop in the season opener and contributing in all five contests.



DT Khristian Boyd, Northern Iowa [D6] - A sixth round selection, Boyd appeared in 49 career games in college and collected 149 tackles [59 solo], 22.5 stops for loss, 10.5 sacks, five pass breakups and two forced fumbles.

In his final college season, Boyd started all 11 games along the defensive line and had 43 stops [17 solo], 6.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks and a pass breakup, while earning All-Missouri Valley Football Conference first-team and consensus FCS third-team All-American. Following a full offseason, and utilizing his 6-2, 320-pound frame to fit into the Saints' 3-4 alignment under Staley, the Kansas City native led the Black and Gold with two sacks in the preseason, while providing a push up the team's interior defensive line. Boyd made his 2025 regular season debut in Week Four at Buffalo and finished with one tackle.

LINING THEM UP



One of Head Coach Kellen Moore's first tasks was shoring up the alignment and the overall depth of the Saints offensive line- a unit that saw nine different starting combinations during the 2024 campaign. The group is tutored by Offensive Line Coach Brendan Nugent, Run Game Coordinator T.J. Paganetti, Assistant Offensive Line Coach Jahri Evans and Offensive Asst Tobijah Hughely. Despite having to start their fourth different offensive line combination on Sunday vs. the New York Giants due to injuries, the Black and Gold kept QB Spencer Rattler's jersey clean in not giving up a sack for the first time this season.



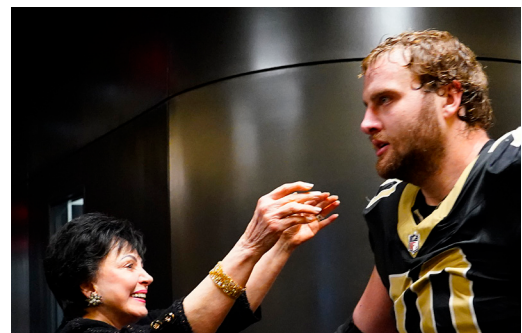
A franchise that has consistently invested in the offensive line with four first round picks in the last six seasons, the past two campaigns have been no different. On the interior center **Erik McCoy** and right guard **Cesar Ruiz** have combined to play in 160 career regular season games with 154 starts. Additionally McCoy, a two-time Pro Bowler and Ruiz, have started five postseason contests between them. Ruiz is currently rehabilitating from an ankle injury suffered in Week Four.

In three of the last four seasons, New Orleans has continued to fortify their offensive line, selecting left tackle **Kelvin Banks Jr.**, right tackle **Taliese Fuaga** and and left guard **Trevor Penning** with first round selections. with one tackle.



Banks, 6-5, 315, was selected with the ninth overall pick out of Texas this past April, the highest selection by the Black and Gold since 2005. A three-year starter, who opened all 42 games he played in at left tackle for the Longhorns from 2022-24, Banks was the 2024 Outland Trophy winner and a unanimous All-American selection. his final season, Banks has lined up and the left tackle position that he manned flawlessly as a college standout for the last three seasons, facing weekly challenges from some of the NFL's elite pass rushers.

2024 first round draft pick Fuaga, immediately moved into the left tackle position as a rookie after being a two-year starter at right tackle at Oregon State, earning first-team All-American honors in 2023. In 2025, the Tacoma, Wash. native became the first Saints rookie to start every game at the position since J.T. Taylor in 1978. In 2025 for his second-team campaign, Fuaga has moved back to the right tackle position he manned in Corvallis.



2022 first round pick Penning opened all 17 games at right tackle in 2024 in his third professional season after playing left tackle his first two. Spending time at both tackle positions and right guard in college at Northern Iowa from 2018-21, he will utilize his toughness and physicality by slotting into left guard in 2025. He returned to action in Week Four after missing the first three contests with a toe injury.

Building up depth throughout the offseason was also a priority of the club. **Dillon Radunz**, who was signed as an unrestricted free agent from Tennessee in the offseason, has opened 31 contests at every position but center, opening the first two contests in Penning’s absence at left guard. **Torricelli Simpkins III** earned a roster spot as an undrafted free agent out of South Carolina with his ability to play both guard and center, starting games at both left guard and right guard this season.

SPECIAL TEAMS OVERVIEW

The New Orleans Saints special teams units will benefit from the offseason elevation of Phil Galiano to the coordinator position, after serving as assistant special teams coach for the past five-and-a-half seasons before taking over coordination of the unit midway through the 2024 campaign. During Galiano’s tenure, where he collaborated with Darren Rizzi, the New Orleans special teams units have consistently ranked among the National Football League’s leaders in place-kicking, coverage and return units, producing Pro Bowlers and Associated Press All-Pro selections, while also setting various club records in place-kicking, punting, return game and coverage units.



PUNT RETURN GAME

Shaheed provided a spark to the punt return game prior to his season-ending knee injury in Week Six. He was on his way to being selected as a Pro Bowl starter as a return specialist and a first-team Associated Press All-Pro as a punt returner again. Shaheed is only the third Saint with multiple punt returns for touchdowns.

BLOCK UNIT

New Orleans’ field goal block unit came through big on three occasions in the second half of the 2024 season, two taking place in three-point victories. The field goal block unit’s hard work carried over into the 2025 season opener, as DT **Bryan Bresee** blocked a fourth quarter 46-yard field goal attempt to give the offense the ball back for a drive where they scored a field goal.

Tyler Shough

With their eyes on competition and development, the New Orleans Saints selected Tyler Shough (last name pronounced Shuck) out of Louisville with the team’s selection in the second round (40th overall) of the 2025 NFL Draft. In seven seasons at Oregon [2018-20], Texas Tech [2021-23] and Louisville [2024], Shough played in 42 games and completed 599-of-951 passes [63.0 pct.] for 7,820 yards with 59 touchdowns, also carrying 246 times for 733 yards with 11 scores.

Taysom Hill.



Hill has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. He’s played in 106 games with 49 starts at several positions. He has carried 443 times for 2,436 yards, the most by a Saint not to play running back full-time, with 33 touchdowns, ranked fifth in club records. In the passing game, he has caught 99 passes for 943 yards with 11 touchdowns, completed 194-of-303 passes for 2,388 yards with 11 touchdowns, returned 20 kicks for 489 yards, made a defensive tackle, a forced fumble, 15 special teams tackles and blocked one punt. Hill showed his versatility his versatility, starting all eight contests he has played in, carrying 39 times for 278 yards with six touchdowns to tie for the team lead, catching 23 passes for 187 yards and completing two passes for 21 yards. Hill also contributed on several special teams units, forcing a safety on an aborted punt and returning a kickoff for 42 yards. Suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week 13, Hill aggressively rehabbed to return to action on Sunday vs. the Giants, where he contributed on offense and special teams and completed a pass for 19 yards.

BY THE NUMBERS

1 - With 2,436 rushing yards, 2,388 passing yards and 943 receiving yards, Hill is the only NFL player in the Super Bowl era with 2,000 career passing yards, 2,000 career rushing yards and 900 career receiving yards.

2 - With his standout performance in the the November 17, 2024 35-14 win over Cleveland, Hill picked up his second NFC Offensive Player of the Week honors.

3 - Hill has picked up three conference player of the Week awards, including an NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honor in 2018 at Tampa Bay, when he blocked a punt, joining RB/RS Reggie Bush as only the second Saint to capture conference player of the Week honors in two phases.

5 - In 2023 and 2024, Hill saw action at five offensive positions [quarterback, fullback, tailback, tight end and wide receiver], as well as participating on special teams.

10 - With 11 career touchdown passes, 11 career receiving touchdowns and 33 career rushing touchdowns, Hill is the first player to have at least ten career passing touchdowns, ten career receiving touchdowns and ten career rushing touchdowns since Frank Gifford [Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 1977].

33 - Hill's 33 career rushing touchdowns are ranked fifth in record books.

33 - Hill's 33 receptions in 2023 set a career-high. In 2024, he had 18 grabs after setting a career-high with eight catches vs. Cleveland on Nov. 17.

44 - Hill has 44 career touchdowns, ranked ninth in club record books.

47 - Hill brought back his first career NFL kickoff return 47 yards in a 21-18 win over the Cleveland Browns on Sept. 16, 2018, the longest of his career. In part-time kickoff return duty, he has brought back 20 kicks for 489 yards [24.5 avg.], including a 42-yard runback in the Nov. 17, 2024 win over Cleveland.

RUNNING BACKS

ALVIN KAMARA

A talented runner and receiver who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Alvin Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage [1,554], second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards [6.1 avg] with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards [10.2 avg] with five touchdowns and one kickoff return for a touchdown. Kamara set a club rookie record with 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL and finished first in the league in yards per carry. Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes [1986], as an *Associated Press* second team All-Pro [flex], the club's first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was also named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and *Associated Press* NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

In 120 career regular season games with 89 starts, Kamara has carried 1,616 times for 7,062 yards [4.4 avg.] with 61 touchdowns and has caught 590 passes for 4,839 yards [8.2 avg.] with 25 touchdowns. Kamara is the franchise's all-time leader in rushing yards, rushing touchdowns, total touchdowns [87], two-point conversions [7], total yards from scrimmage [11,901], all-purpose yardage [12,554] and first downs [591].

Through the first five games of the 2025 season, Kamara has carried 73 times for 283 yards with one touchdown and caught 17 passes for 77 yards for 360 yards from scrimmage after surpassing Tiki Barber and Marcus Allen to move into fifth all-time in NFL record books for receptions by running backs on Sunday vs. the New York Giants.

SCRIMMAGE LEADER

Since entering the NFL in 2017, Kamara ranks second in the league in yards from scrimmage [11,774], only one of three to have 11,000 over that period. With 1,493 scrimmage yards in 2024, Kamara is the third player since 2000 with at least 1,100 scrimmage yards in each of his first eight seasons, joining Matt Forte and Pro Football Hall of Famer LaDainian Tomlinson.



Kamara’s career scrimmage yards total is the most by an NFL player with a single team over the nine-season period.

KENDRE MILLER

A third round draft pick of the Saints in 2023, Miller was a three-year standout at TCU, posting 2,410 rushing yards and 26 touchdowns in only 33 games with 17 starts. In 2022, the first-team All-Big 12 selection carried 242 times for 1,399 yards and 17 touchdowns.

In three seasons, Miller has played in 19 games with two starts and has carried 118 times for 469 yards [4.0 avg.] with three touchdowns, caught 19 passes for 169 yards and returned 15 kickoffs for 370 yards, including a 43-yarder on Sept. 7, vs. Arizona, the longest by a Saint since 2020.

Miller had his most productive performance of the season in Week Four at Buffalo, when he carried 11 times for 65 yards [5.9 avg.] with an 18-yard touchdown run, tying his career-high for a carry.

WIDE RECEIVERS

CHRIS OLAVE

The 11th overall pick in the 2022 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented wideout made an immediate impact as a rookie, catching 72 passes for 1,042 yards [14.5 avg.] and four TDs, leading the team in receptions, receiving average and receiving yards, while earning September NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors as the 24th player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to record 1,000 receiving yards as a rookie. Olave became the third Saints rookie to reach 1,000 receiving yards and the first Saints rookie since WR Danny Abramowicz [1967] to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign.

In 2023, Olave took the next step in his promising-career, leading the team in receiving and receiving yardage for the second consecutive season with 87 receptions for 1,123 yards and five TDs, tying for the team lead. He became the seventh Saint with 85 receptions in a season and the sixth with 1,100 receiving yards in a season.

In 2024, prior to being placed on Injured Reserve in Week 10 [concussion], he led the team’s wide-out corps in receiving with 32 grabs for a club-best 400 yards with one touchdown in eight games. Olave has rebounded to appear in every contest, while leading the team in receiving with 33 receptions with one touchdown. Olave is tied for sixth in the NFL in receiving and third in third down receptions [11].

In 44 career games with 33 starts, Olave has recorded 224 receptions for 2,809 yards with 11 touchdowns.

Brandin Cooks

The New Orleans Saints added a speedy big-play threat to their offense, when they signed wide receiver Brandin Cooks, who started his NFL career with the club from 2014-16. Cooks, who was selected 20th overall by New Orleans in the 2014 NFL Draft, has six career 1,000-yard seasons, which is tied for the fifth-most in the NFL since he was drafted in 2014. Cooks joins Brandon Marshall as the only players in NFL history to record at least 1,000 receiving yards in a season with four different teams. Overall, he has played in 163 career games with 145 starts for New Orleans (2014-16), the New England Patriots (2017), Los Angeles Rams (2018-19), Houston Texans (2020-22) and the Dallas Cowboys (2023-24), posting career totals of 722 receptions for 9,635 yards (13.3 avg.) and 60 touchdowns, to go along with 58 rushes for 341 yards and two scores. Voted as a team captain, Cooks also provides leadership to a youthful receiver room.



Rashid Shaheed

This fourth-year wideout has made his mark for New Orleans in both the passing game and the return game, where he was selected to the Pro Bowl and voted as an AP All-Pro in 2023. In addition to the return duties in 2023, Shaheed enjoyed a breakout season on offense, when he recorded 46 receptions for 719 yards (15.6 avg.) with five touchdown grabs, finishing 12th in the NFL in yards per catch. in 38 career games with 24 starts, Rashid has caught 116 passes for 1,844 yards (15.9 avg.) with 12 touchdowns, carried 19 times for 128 yards with one touchdown, brought back 60 punts for 766 yards (12.8 avg.) with two touchdowns and returned 38 kickoffs for 875 yards (23.0 avg.).

Since entering the league in 2022, Rashid’s 15.9 yards per catch average ranks eighth in the league.

Showing significant growth in the passing game at the start of the 2024 season, Shaheed recorded 20 receptions for 349 yards [17.5 avg.] with three touchdowns, carried six times for 29 yards, brought back nine punts for 143 yards [15.9 avg.] and returned six kickoffs for 171 yards [28.5 avg.]. Shaheed’s receiving average was fifth in the NFL before suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week Six. In 2025, he has started all five games and has 22 receptions, while leading the team in receiving yards [288] and touchdown grabs [two].

DEVAUGHN VELE

This second-year wideout was acquired by the Saints from the Denver Broncos near the conclusion of the preseason. A seventh round pick of Denver out of Utah in 2024, Vele appeared in 13 games with seven starts, recording 41 receptions for 475 yards with three touchdowns, tallying the most receiving yards, receptions and receiving touchdowns by a Broncos’ seventh-round draft choice as a rookie. The Saints will look to utilize the San Diego native’s 6-5, 210 frame in key spots. On Sept. 14 vs. San Francisco, Vele utilized his size to muscle in a three-yard touchdown grab.

TIGHT ENDS

JUWAN JOHNSON

The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the New Orleans Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season in 2021. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson was tied for third among NFL tight ends in receiving touchdowns. Overall, Johnson’s 18 touchdown grabs since 2021 lead the team. In 2024, Johnson stepped up after missing most of training camp with a foot injury to play in all 17 games with five starts and make a career-high 50 receptions for a team-best/career-best 548 yards and three touchdowns. With 41 receptions in 2025, Johnson ranks third among NFL tight ends.

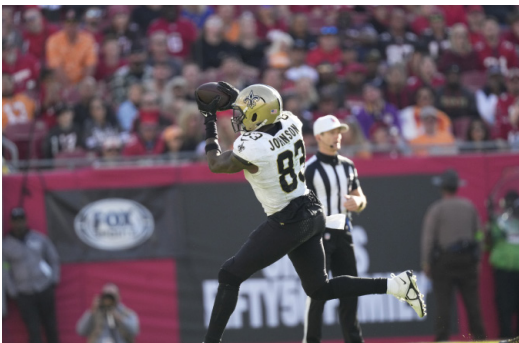

FOSTER MOREAU

This veteran tight end and New Orleans native who was a standout at Jesuit High School and Louisiana State University signed with the Saints in the 2023 offseason. He finished his fifth National Football League season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four campaigns with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders, who origianlly select-ed him in the fourth round of the 2019 NFL Draft. In his career, Moreau has contributed both as a pass catcher and blocker, appearing in 94 regular sea-son games with 62 starts and has recorded 144 receptions for 1,713 yards [11.9 avg.] with 18 touch-downs, also adding seven special teams tackles.

DEFENSIVE LINE

DE CAMERON JORDAN

New Orleans’ first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft [24th overall] out of the University of California, Jor-dan has played in 231 career regular season games with 230 starts, recording 825 tackles [509 solo], a franchise record 124 sacks for a loss of 827 yards, three interceptions, 68 pass breakups, 15 forced fumbles and 12 fumble recoveries.



Jordan returned from offseason ankle surgery in 2024 to start every game and rank among the team’s leaders on the defensive line, starting all 17 games and making 34 tackles [18 solo], includ-ing seven stops for loss, four sacks for a loss of 26 yards, one interception and four passes defended. Off-the-field, as a ten-time team captain, Jordan sets the standard for excellence as he was select-ed as the team nominee for the third time for the National Football Leagues Walter Payton Man of the Year award and also has been recognized for his citizenship and commitment to family and com-munity as the 2025 Bart Starr Award winner. Jor-dan leadership and experience served as a crucial component in a Saints season that faced adversi-ty in the form of extensive injuries and an in-sea-son coaching change in the face of a seven-game losing streak. His leadership helped set a tone for the team to rally and win three contests after a 2-7 start to the 2024 season.

JORDAN SACK NOTES

On Dec. 24, 2022, at Cleveland, Jordan played in his 200th career game (regular season/postseason combined) in a Black and Gold uniform, moving him into third place on the club’s all-time games played list. The following week at Philadelphia, Jan. 1, 2023, Jordan also started his 200th career game, joining Drew Brees as only the second player to open 200 contests in franchise history. On Sept. 24, 2023, at Green Bay, Jordan played in his 206th career game, passing Thomas Morstead for second all-time in club record books. On Oct. 29, 2023, Jordan became only the second Saints player, first defensive Saint and 57th NFL defensive lineman to play in 200 regular season contests. On Nov. 5, 2023 vs. Chicago, he became only the second Saint to start 200 career regular season contests. MOST SACKED

Jordan is now one of only 15 National Football League players to have at least 15 sacks against two opponents, 17 against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and 23 against the Atlanta Falcons, both NFC South divisional rivals. Jordan’s 23 takedowns of former Atlanta QB Matt Ryan are the most sacks a player has had against an individual quarterback in NFL history.

Against this week’s opponent, Jordan has recorded only one sack against the Giants, which occurred in 2016. Jordan has sacked 49 different players in the regular season, looking to make Patriots signal-caller Drake Maye the 50th player he’s dropped.

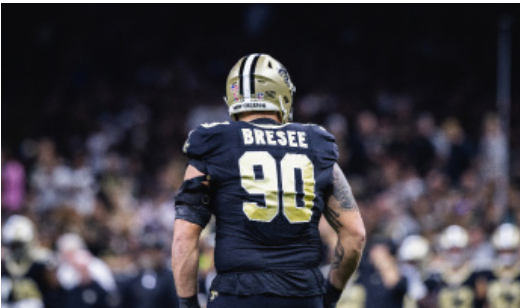

DT BRYAN BRESEE

The team’s first round selection in 2023 out of Clemson after being a three-time All-ACC selection, the Maryland native played in 26 games with 21 starts for the Tigers, producing 54 tackles (35 solo), 15 stops for loss, nine sacks, a forced fumble, an interception and five passes defended.

Bresee immediately found a role in New Orleans’ interior rotation and appeared in all 17 games, recording 24 tackles, 4.5 sacks and six pass breakups. His sack total was the highest by a Saints rookie defensive tackle since becoming an official statistic (1982) and his pass defense total was the most in club records for a rookie at the position since the statistic was first recorded (1980). He was also tied for second in the league among defensive tackles.



Bresee enjoyed a breakout sophomore campaign, playing in all 17 games and tied for fourth in the NFL among defensive tackles with a career-high and team-leading 7.5 sacks. The 7.5 takedowns are the ninth-highest total in a single-season for a Saints defensive tackle and tied for fourth in the league at the position. In 2025, Bresee has ten tackles (three solo), one sack, one pass defense, one forced fumble and one blocked field goal.

DT DAVON GODCHAUX

Davon Godchaux [pronounced duh-VAHN GOD-chaw] returns to his home state to play for New Orleans in his ninth NFL campaign after being acquired from the New England Patriots. Originally a fifth round draft pick (178th overall) of the Miami Dolphins out of LSU in 2017, Godchaux has started 114-of-125 regular season games for the Dolphins (2017-20), Patriots (2021-24) and Saints (2025-), recording 434 tackles (207 solo), 5.5 sacks, 20 stops for loss, three pass breakups, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery, as well as one solo stop in the 2021 Wild Card Playoff for New England. In 2024, he started all 17 games and posted 67 tackles (24 solo), one pass defended and one stop for loss.

DE CARL GRANDERSON

Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming in 2019, Granderson posted 17.5 sacks in college and possesses the prototypical frame for an NFL pass rusher. Granderson has become a significant cog in the team's defensive line rotation with 266 tackles, 33 sacks, eight pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two recoveries.

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson posted a career-high 78 tackles (44 solo), led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a 55-yard loss, one pass defense, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Starting all 17 games in 2024, Granderson had 61 tackles, 5.5 sacks, tied for second on the team with Chase Young, a career-high four passes defended, one forced fumble and a blocked extra point. Through the first five games of the 2025 season, he has 4.5 sacks, tied for seventh in the NFL.

DT NATHAN SHEPHERD

Originally selected by the New York Jets in the third round of the 2018 NFL Draft out of Fort Hays State, this versatile defensive tackle enters his eighth NFL season, his third campaign with the Saints. The Ajax, Ontario, Canada native has appeared in 111 career games with 47 starts, totaling 215 tackles (107 solo) and 10.5 sacks for a loss of 86.5 yards. In 2025, he has started all five games and has 17 stops (six solo).

DE CHASE YOUNG

Originally selected by Washington with the second overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented edge rusher enters his sixth season and second in New Orleans. In five campaigns for Washington (2020-23), San Francisco (2023) and New Orleans (2024), he's has appeared in 60 games with 32 starts and recorded 131 tackles, 22 sacks, 28 stops for loss, 12 pass breakups, seven forced fumbles and three recoveries. The consensus NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Young recorded 7.5 sacks and made multiple splash plays with four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in 2020. In 2023, he played in seven games for Washington and nine for San Francisco following a midseason trade and tied his career-best with 7.5 takedowns in helping the 49ers advance to Super Bowl LVIII. Young fit in with the New Orleans defensive line with 31 tackles, 5.5 sacks, a takedown on a two-point conversion attempt, a forced fumble and three pass defenses.

DT KHRISTIAN BOYD

Originally selected by the Saints in the sixth round of the 2024 NFL Draft out of Northern Iowa, this widebody run-stuffer can control the point of attack. After playing six games as a rookie, Boyd is pushing for more playing time, recording three tackles and one sack in the preseason.

DE CHRIS RUMPH II

Signed as a free agent in the offseason, Rumph is well-versed in defensive coordinator Brandon Staley's system. In his career, he's played in 42 games and made 40 tackles (24 solo), four sacks, two passes defended, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and 15 special teams tackles.

LINEBACKERS

DEMARIO DAVIS

This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the Saints in 2018 after spending his first six NFL seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. In his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 214 regular season games with 200 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Browns (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,519 stops (954 solo), 44.5 sacks, four interceptions, 63 pass breakups, five forced fumbles and nine fumble recoveries.

PETE WERNER

New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles [111 solo], 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by the Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semi-finalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles.

In five seasons, Werner has played in 61 games with 53 starts and has recorded 364 tackles [231 solo], 1.5 sacks, one interception, seven pass breakups, two forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and four special teams stops.

In 13 games started/played in 2024, Werner posted 92 tackles [54 solo] and one pass defense. In the 2025 season opener vs. Arizona, making his season debut in the team’s new alignment, Werner tied for the team lead with nine tackles, including one sack. In five games, he has 41 stops, one sack, two pass breakups and one fumble recovery.

SECONDARY

S JUSTIN REID

This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and South Louisiana native returned to his home state after signing with the Black and Gold during the 2025 offseason as an unrestricted free agent. Reid was originally selected by the Houston Texans in the third round (68th overall) in the 2018 NFL Draft out of Stanford. In seven NFL seasons, the former Dutchtown High School standout has played in 111 career regular season games with 107 starts for the Texans (2018-21), Kansas City Chiefs (2022-24) and Saints (2025-), recording 584 tackles (425 solo), 23 stops for a loss, six sacks, ten interceptions, with one returned 101 yards for a touchdown, 47 pass breakups, three forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, 15 special teams stops and one blocked kick. Reid has started all 13 postseason contests he has played in and recorded 79 tackles (58 solo), four stops for a loss, 1.5 sacks and five pass breakups, playing for two Super Bowl champion squads as a member of the Chiefs. Reid will look to help fortify the back end of the Saints defense in 2025.

CB ALONTAE TAYLOR

Selected by the Saints in the second round (49th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 pass breakups, ranked fourth among NFL rookies.

Moving to the nickel position in 2023, possessing extensive experience on the inside and the outside, Taylor appeared in all 17 games with 13 starts and recorded 75 tackles, his first two career interceptions and a career-high 14 pass breakups, tied for second on the team and ninth in the NFL.

In 2024, Taylor played in all 17 games with 15 starts and ranked third on the team with a career-high 89 tackles (61 solo), was tied for fourth with four sacks and has added a club-best 16 passes defended and two forced fumbles to tie for the team best. His four sacks were tied for the most by a Saints cornerback with Alex Molden. His pass defense total was ranked fifth in the National Football League. In the 2025 season opener, he had two tackles and a sack.

GET A HAND ON

Taylor’s 16 pass breakups in 2024 were tied for third in the NFC and fifth in the NFL. His 41 since coming into the league in 2022 are tied for fourth.

DB DROP

In the Sept. 8, 2024 season-opening win over Carolina, Taylor became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest since the statistic was officially recognized by the NFL in 1982. The only other defensive back to record three sacks on kickoff weekend is former Chargers S Rodney Harrison (vs. Buffalo, 9/6/98). After splitting a sack on October 27 at the Los Angeles Chargers, Taylor’s four sacks are tied for the highest total by a cornerback in Saints record books with Alex Molden’s four in 1997, while the total ranked third among defensive backs and led all cornerbacks. Taylor’s six career takedowns are tied with Molden for the most by a Saints cornerback all-time.

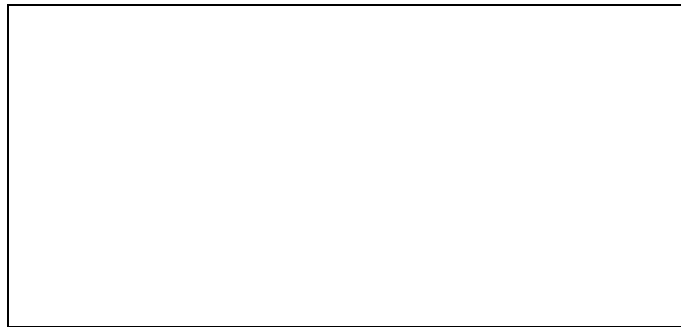

Opening comments

“Awesome win. Found a way to get it done. It was a really, really good job by our guys, just resiliency. Obviously, it hasn’t been an easy month for our guys, missing on four opportunities, and for them to hang in there this whole entire game I thought it was an awesome effort. The turnovers were obviously a huge part of the game, 5-0. Lot of positives coming out of this thing.”

(On how the first win of the season feels)

“It’s awesome. This is a special group. Their resiliency to hang in there through some challenging times the first month. By no means is it the perfect script to start a journey together as a group. I thought our guys just battled the entire game, and it was just really fun to see those guys.”

(On building momentum for the remainder of the season)

“You have to get in the win column first. Then, you can carry momentum moving forward. We can feel it. We know what it looks like. We know what it feels like. Now, we have to keep getting better. That is what the NFL season is about. You have to keep getting better, and more opportunities will come ahead of us.”

(On describing the locker room postgame)

“It’s an awesome group. We have an awesome group. I love the energy. I love the joy that these guys bring each and every day for a lot of our guys. It’s not just, obviously me. A lot of this group is coming together for the first time for Spence [Spencer Rattler], for him battling through a lot of things through the last year and a half for him. I was fired up for him as well.”

(On the defensive performance today)

“The turnovers. It’s a resilient group. The playstyle, you never know which play is going to make a difference in the game through all four quarters. I thought our defense did an incredible job attacking the football. To create five turnovers in a game is really, really special.”

(On the takeaway by Bryan Bresee, which led to a Jordan Howden touchdown)

“Just excellent, excellent job attacking the football. I have not seen the perfect look (camera angle) yet, but I have seen one. He’s attacking the football, and I think that’s a special thing. We’ve seen it throughout the NFL these last couple of days. Certainly, Thursday night there was an example of that

by the Niners. These defensive linemen, they just keep attacking the football, and eventually, it's going to pop out."

(On his thoughts as the play unfolded)

"They were grinding it out. They were grinding out a long drive. For our guys to make that play, immediately (was smart). As soon as Jordan scoops up the ball, I immediately looked at what was ahead of him, and there was a whole lot of green grass. Our guys did an excellent job of getting out in front of him, creating a couple of blocks and just securing it, allowing him to go score. It was a game-changing play."

(On the defensive strategy)

"I thought we just continued to attack the football. I thought our defensive line continued to rush, continued to find plays. Jaxson (Dart) is going to be a really good quarterback in this league. He's a really good player. He's going to buy time. Plays are going to last longer. It's going to be challenging for our defensive line, and they just have to keep going for it."

(On CB Kool-Aid McKinstry's performance)

"Just so, so happy for him. He's a phenomenal player. We think the world of him. He's played some hard downs the first few weeks of the season. For him to come up with two big-time interceptions – he made a bunch of plays throughout the entire game. I am so fired up for him. He deserved everything that's coming his way this week. We are really excited for him."

(On S Jonas Sanker)

"Obviously, Justin (Reid) going out early is a challenging situation. Jonas hopped in there and continued to play, and then Jordan (Howden) hopped in there. Big time job by both of those guys."

(On QB Taysom Hill's return)

"It was awesome to see Taysom, (and) to see Foster (Moreau) out there competing and playing. They have been through a lot. Taysom had some hard downs in the run game, and the play-action pass, the opportunity to throw it in the short-yard situation was obviously awesome. I thought he made an excellent decision, really good throw because the corner was playing over the top. It was a big-time play. We needed that in that situation."

(On if Hill was limited today)

"His role, obviously, will evolve. He was just coming back. He did punt protection, and he did some snaps in some offensive situations. As he goes, he will keep growing that as we go."

(On having Hill and Moreau lead the Who Dat chant)

"We talked about it earlier in the week. Once we felt like those two were trending and they were going to be ready to play, it was kind of a no-brainer."

(On when he knew Hill and Moreau would be ready to play this week)

“We felt really good about it going into this week. We had to obviously see the evidence on the field. Both guys hopped into Wednesday’s practice and did an excellent job and really reconfirmed what everyone believed. Again, credit to those guys, their work. Credit to our training staff, all the long journey that all of those guys have been on. Ben (Stollberg), Shone (Gipson), the rest of the crew in there, we have some of the best in the business in there and they work a lot. What these guys have gone through from the whole offseason to the summer being there at training camp and not being able to participate and all the things they have to wait through, for them to be ready when the opportunity presented itself, I give credit to all of those guys.”

(On Hill’s pass to tight end Juwan Johnson)

“It was in our pocket based off the look. We had a couple of plays in the short-yardage situation designed for Taysom. Obviously, based on their look, we felt like there was a chance to be aggressive there. We were probably going to go for it on fourth down anyway. We can be aggressive and see if it happens.”

(On the offensive development with Hill returning)

“It is going to be a lot of fun as we build this. Taysom hopped in there and had a handful of roles in this game. Obviously, some of them, weren’t really utilized yet. There will be more coming, more expanding. His ability to play all these different positions will be a huge advantage for us.”

(On the explosive touchdown by wide receiver Rashid Shaheed)

“As soon as I saw the leverage by the safety, and the corner took Juwan, we knew we had an excellent opportunity. Beautiful route, beautiful throw by [Spencer Rattler]. It was a really cool play. We needed that, an explosive play. We have been trying to chase these explosives. They haven’t happened. It has been frustrating for the whole group, but they’re hanging in there. When the opportunity presented itself, these guys executed at a really high level.”

(On the offensive sequencing)

“Our numbers have been heavy run with those bigger packages. Certainly, we had some pass game opportunities in the play, and that one was able to be successful. We were able to utilize it.”

(On going through adversity before getting the first win of the season)

“I think our guys have grown a lot through this journey. We know we have played some good football. We haven’t earned the wins. That is certainly the ultimate goal, but I think our guys battled each and every week. Seattle got away from us. That was the one that was frustrating. The other ones, we were right in it. We were close. We have to make a couple more plays, got to find some margins to close a little bit more. I felt like our guys went out there and played really well this week.”

(On the matchup with Giants tight end Theo Johnson)

“There’s some circumstance there based off the call. Sometimes you’re matched up against one, whoever the one receiver is based off the presentation look. Kool-Aid responded really well in a bunch of those situations.”

(On McKinstry’s balance guarding Johnson)

“He responded really well. I thought Kool-Aid made a bunch of plays as the game progressed. I thought our guys responded really well. There are times you’re going to have advantageous situations, and there are times you’re going to have hard downs and hard situations. Our guys understand that, and our guys’ ability to respond to that is critical.”

(On the flea flicker)

“As soon as you see it, oh man, here we go. Awesome, awesome play. [Terrell] Burgess, the ability to recognize it, the ability not to panic in that situation. So many times there are clips all over where guys just go and run into the guy. Ok, we stopped the play, but that’s a 15-yard gain in that situation. For him to just still compete, have some patience to himself as far as some calmness, I thought it was a big time play. It was a critical play for us.”

(On quarterback Spencer Rattler’s first career win)

“I thought he did a lot of good. I am really happy for Spence. He has battled through a lot certainly through a year and a half of football here. I thought he’s played a lot of good football this year, here for us. He has competed each and every week. We have been really close, but we have not gotten there collectively. For him to get this one, he’s earned it. He’s earned it, and I thought he had a huge impact on this game in a positive way.”

(On the roughing the passer call late in the game on defensive end Carl Granderson)

“I saw a sack. I was disappointed because you try to educate your players. When you don’t feel like, as a coach, you have an answer to help educate your players on how to play the game, that’s frustrating. You coach to give those guys the best chance to be successful. It’s going to be a great opportunity for us to learn whatever ultimately is the opinion of that play is. It is a frustrating play when you do so much good. That’s a frustrating one as a coach. You feel like you’re helpless in that situation.”

(On if the league will explain why the penalty was called)

“Potentially. We’ll see if there is. Sometimes you can get an educational point out of it. Sometimes you do not. We will see if our league provides something for our whole league to figure out.”

(On scoring 23 unanswered points to end the game)

“I thought the turnovers were huge, and I think our ability to respond to get some points out of the turnovers provided some value. The way we ended the second quarter, I thought was nice. We missed our opportunity, but the defense makes a play. We receive another opportunity to get some points there and take the lead before half. I thought that was a critical moment for us. We have not led a game this year. To go into halftime, finally with a lead, feeling the confidence and then for our guys to come out and play really good football in the second half, really spoke to our guys’ resiliency.”

(On defensive coordinator Brandon Staley’s adjustments)

“Just the communication and just the subtle adjustments throughout the game are really, really critical. That is what makes Brandon special. His ability to make those adjustments in the time, in the moment, make a different call, make an adjustment. I thought our guys communicated at a really high level on defense. They are going to present a lot of different looks on the backend. Our secondary did an

excellent job of communicating, being on the same page, being all tied together. Our rush was resilient. Jaxson (Dart) is going to get out and make some plays out in space. You have to be able to respond after that. He's going to make a play. You have to respond. Credit to all those guys."

(On the special teams performance)

"Obviously, some positives. Certainly, we did some good things. Ultimately, not quite good enough. We have the right guys. We have a bunch of guys who have had a lot of success in this league. When you go through bumps, you bring it a little closer, bring it a little bit tighter, and find the solutions together. We keep moving."

(On cornerback Kool-Aid McKinstry providing a spark)

"Certainly with Kool-Aid, he's been close to some opportunities. He hasn't quite gotten the ball production yet in his career. For him to make two plays, I thought awesome, awesome job by him, great plays right when we needed them."

(On if game balls were issued)

"Yes, absolutely. We gave Spence and Kool-Aid a couple in there. We, obviously, will give plenty of more guys on Monday as we evaluate the film and have the opportunity to recognize all the good that came through this game. It's an awesome opportunity for our entire team to recognize the good stuff that came out of this."

(On if he is going to celebrate the win)

"I don't know. I'm tired. These weeks are long, so I'm ready to hang out and get a little sleep."

(On the challenge in the first half)

"It was a tricky look. I knew it was a 50-50. We just didn't get a ton of looks and felt like there was a chance for a replay there. I knew I was taking a little bit of a chance and may not have converted there. They got down to the line of scrimmage. They were able to run the play. It felt like there was a chance the ball was bobbled at that point. We didn't get it done."

(On if he received a game ball)

"Yes, AK [Alvin Kamara] gave me a game ball. AK's the best."

(On getting his first career win as a head coach)

"I think for all of our guys, for all of our coaches, this entire group that's come together, there's a lot of resiliency that's had to come through for four games. We missed four opportunities. To be close and to feel like you're playing good football, it was good. It was a big-time momentum opportunity for our team, establish some winning success, and hopefully it carries on in the future."

(Opening statement)

"Credit to the Saints. It's hard to win when you turn the ball over five times on five consecutive drives. We missed a couple of opportunities offensively, the flea flicker and some others. On defense, we did a good job in the run game. Gave up some huge plays for us. We can't have those things, too many DPI penalties. You get five turnovers to zero, you're not going to win in this league."

(On what went wrong in the flea flicker play)

"I'm going to have to go back and look at it. I thought we got by him there, I'll have to see how it looks, I thought we had a chance."

(On being aggressive on fourth down during the following play)

"That was the decision that we made not to go for it there. We went on a number of fourth downs, and we were going to try to pin them down there on that one."

(On his thought process when deciding to go for it on fourth down)

"Again, I have guys that I lean on fourth down wise that we communicate with and talk about the decisions that I make. Every decision that I make, I think that's the best decision after talking to the guys that I lean on, and then ultimately, it's my decision."

(On what he thought of Jaxson Dart)

"I thought he battled. The game got away from us, from him a little bit, with those turnovers. Some easy ones too, that were dropped. Those kill you because they give 13 points off, then they take away points when we're driving and they're all on the +50 or down there inside the scoring zone to at least get a field goal out of it. We moved the ball well sometimes, it's just hard when you're giving the ball away."

(On the difference between Dart's first and second halves)

"Not much. I thought we moved the ball and then we turned it over. The drives that we stalled in we turned the ball over. Five in a row, which is hard to do."

(On all the turnovers, but specifically Cam Skattebo's fumble returned for a TD)

"Yeah, I'll have to go back and look at all of them. It got knocked out of his hands, (Darius) Slayton had knocked hands, Jaxson dropped the one — I mean those were three big drives to generate some points or not give them up at the end of the half. Turn a ball over like that, give them opportunities for points, take away opportunities for you to score points, when you're moving the ball."

(On improving the pass rush with his team)

"I'd say a number of things. I think they got the ball out quick, and they did a good job with it. I thought we missed a couple that we had in our grasp. That big play on defense got us. Some third downs, they were third and short, one third and long on the crosser to (Chris) Olave. We didn't create any turnovers, and again it's a broken record but 5 and 0...I don't know how many teams have ever won when it's 5-0 on turnovers."

(On what he sees in Deonte Banks versus Cor'Dale Flott)

"Deonte had that penalty. He's done some good things, and I trust both of those guys. Obviously, that one hurt us. We had some missed opportunities, that one and a couple that we had downfield that I thought we had the chance to make, and the turnovers. So, not good enough."

(On why he thinks these penalties keep happening with Banks)

"We have to keep working on our technique. I know Marquand (Manuel) is out there with those guys every day working on technique and getting their head around what they need to get their head around and not being as handsy. We'll continue to do that."

(On his thought process when choosing the number of multiple-tight end sets)

"I thought it was an advantage for us relative to how they played it in their base defense. They ended up going nickel defense. Belli (Daniel Bellinger) and Theo (Johnson), I had confidence in those two guys. It simplified them as well. I thought we operated it well early on, but it's hard to operate when you start turning the ball over."

(On what he said to Dart after his first loss as starting QB)

"Kid, that's the NFL. Every play matters, and he knows that. He's as hard on himself as anybody. There's a lot to learn from this, and that's what we will do. There will be ups, there will be downs, and I thought he started out really well. Collectively, we have to do a better job. We have to make the play down the field when we have the opportunity to make the play. We have to hold on to the ball when we are scrambling. Those are things that we will build off of with him, make sure he's prepared and ready to go. Again, it's a broken record but it's hard to win with five turnovers."

(On roster management and not bringing up an additional receiver)

"We felt good about where we were at relative to our plan going into the game and what we were going to try to do with multiple tight ends. So, we'll see what happens next week. There's a possibility you could lose two running backs and have no running backs. It's the NFL, injuries are going to happen. We had five wide receivers, four tight ends in case something happened to one of them, to continue with our plan throughout the game."

(On building off of Dart's strengths despite the turnovers)

"Absolutely. It's his first loss as a starting quarterback. I know there are plays that he wishes he had back, but we have to do a good job around him. I have a lot of confidence in the young man."

(On the wide receivers having to step up without the injured Malik Nabers)

"Again, none of us did a good enough job."

(Opening Statement)

"It feels good to get that first win. It was a team win. The defense played great. The offensive line played elite today. We had zero sacks. That's a great building point. We need to catch that momentum, go on a run and keep working. We need to keep doing what we are doing."

(On the touchdown pass to Rashid Shaheed)

"We had the play dialed up. We knew we were going to call it going into that series. I told Rashid to make that safety turn. He had him spin. He bit. I had great protection. I put the ball up and he took it to the house. It was a good feeling."

(On if the biggest thing is to not overthrow the football on that play)

"You just put it to a spot. It is hard to overthrow him. I put it toward that sideline so he could run under it. I connected really well. We have been working on it at practice since training camp. It was good for it to come to life. It was a play that we needed in the game to bring some momentum. That definitely turned some things around"

(On hitting an explosive play)

"Our defense presented an opportunity for those shots. We had it dialed up today. We could have connected on a few more, but it was good to get that one. You can see what one big play can do for a game. There were a few others, but we still have to finish in the red zone a little better. It was the perfect look. It was a great route. It was great protection. It was a great call. It was dialed up. It was ran well and executed well."

(On if play action creates that look)

"I think so especially if you are running the ball on first down. They expect run and boom. Especially when you are backed up and take a shot. One play drive is always a great feeling."

(On the defense coming up with five consecutive turnovers)

"It was huge. They played their tails off. Credit to them, they kept us in that game. We could do a better job offensively of taking advantage of those turnovers especially in plus territory. We are getting down there in the red zone. Credit to the Giants as they did a great job with their coverage down there. We have to find a way to score those points. ."

(On getting his first NFL win)

"It's big. We have to weather the storm. We just have to keep going. Keep following the process and the outcome will take care of itself. The past is the past and now we are looking forward to the future. Let's keep stacking wins and get some momentum going."

WR RASHID SHAHEED

(On if a weight is lifted after securing the first win)

"You could say so. It feels good to come to the locker room and hear music and everyone is smiling and dancing. We worked hard for it and it all paid off this week."

(On being able to enjoy it)

"We will enjoy it until tomorrow. We will break down the film tomorrow morning and then we will be on to the next. We want to carry this over. This is good energy and positive outlook from this game, so we have to keep it going."

(On his touchdown reception)

"My job was to get to the hash and break toward the sideline as soon as the ball is snapped. I was trying to sell that I was going to go across the field as much as possible. Once I saw his hips turn, I broke toward the corner, and the rest is history. Spencer (Rattler) laid out a great ball. The offensive line did great. That's how plays like that work."

(On if that play was set up from last week)

"100%. We noticed that when we get in that 13 personnel that the safeties eyes might not be that good. I was able to get up to the second level and run my route. It all worked out. It was a well-executed play."

(On if he thought he would be caught on the touchdown reception)

"I was kind of nervous at first because when I turned around, I saw that he was close and thought that he might trip me up. I didn't want to lose my respect in the locker room for my speed."

CB KOOL-AID McKINSTRY

(On the feeling of two interceptions in the fourth quarter)

“Man I just want to thank my teammates and coaches first off for trusting me and believing in me. That’s number one, man, but it definitely felt good to be able to help those guys because that’s my job, that’s my role. So I want to thank them, man.”

(On how he prepped going into this week)

“I feel like I was a little more locked in this week. I did a little extra of everything. I put in more work this week. I trained harder. I ran on my own a little bit after practice. And I’m sticking to that definitely. Definitely found a new routine. I’m going to stick to it.”

(On if his prep and film prep were a big part of his interception)

“A film study thing, but more in the game. They kept running that same little play. So I just finally decided to go and press it and jump it.”

(On the first interception)

“I kind of felt them running one out of two. So I kind of knew the quarterback was going to kind of, well I didn’t know this, but I knew everybody was kind of running back this way. So I kind of just played over the top of everything and caught going.”

(On taking advantage of Jaxson Dart’s second game as a starter)

“Well, we knew when we watched him on film all week that he’s an energetic guy, that he liked to make the big plays, that he can use his legs, that he can make the throws. And he came out, and he definitely played like we expected. So, just watching him, we know that it is a possibility that he can have a good game, and you’ve got to contain him.”

(On if Brandon Staley changed a lot)

“Well, we kind of knew just watching them in the first half. We knew kind of what they were going to do and what they wanted to do. We got familiar with the plays that they were running. So, yeah, it was easier for Coach, man. Coach will do a good job of adjusting that halftime. He does a good job of talking to us and letting us know what’s going on and how we’re going to defend exactly what’s going on. So, yeah, Coach Staley is definitely good, man.”

(On what the sideline was like when the Giants were up 14-3 and what caused them to then have 23 unanswered points)

"We know if we play together, believe in each other, and play for one another, that we can be as special as we want to be. So, I feel like coming out of halftime, that was something that we harped on. That was something that we were talking about. That was something that we wanted to depend on. And that's what we did."

(On blocking for Jordan Howden on his TD)

"I was going to (Darius) Slayton. He's kind of a fast guy. He tried to come down the crack block with a ball that already fumbled by the end, so that's how Howden was able to get it. And I knew that Slayton was kind of a fast guy, so I knew I had to go and get on my horses so we could make sure that we get the touchdown because I knew how important it was. And that just goes with being good teammates, man. He would have done the same for me, so why not do the same for him? I feel like this defense is very special. I love those guys. I love this team. So when plays like that come up and my fellow teammate is making the play, they feel like I'm making the play. So why not block for them?"

(On if he's ever been a part of a team with five straight forced turnovers and what it was like)

"No, no, no. not five. we harp on getting turnovers. That is all we talk about, the ball, the ball, the ball. Our coaches do a good job of splitting us through turnover circuits. We do a good job of getting to the ball in practice. So it finally came to the game."

(On receiving a game ball today)

"I am just glad my coaches and teammates trust and believe in me. So for me to get the game ball from those guys is very special to me. Something for me to build on and something for me to continue to grow. I feel like it is areas where I can continue to grow, and that is what I got those guys for. So I love those guys."

(On the pass breakup to the tight end in the end zone)

"I kind of knew when they got in that set that they kind of wanted to run the big post and kind of boxed me out. So I kind of saw the quarterback check. So I knew when he checked, there was nothing else to check too. The guy is not going to run around. I knew he was going to run a phase. So I kind of just played it."

(On what he saw from Bryan Bresee forcing the fumble)

“It looked like he was getting blocked a little bit, but he had one hand free in his gap. And he just reached out and got it out, punched out. Like I said, that's something we practice every day at practice, and it came to the game.”

(On if he has a special place at home for the game ball)

“Oh, yeah, definitely. I got a spot at home. I got a spot at home and put it there. Definitely. Right

now, I have a football in there that I just keep at the house. I put it right there just to keep at the house and throw it around. But now I'm going to replace that with both of those balls. So, yeah, it's very special."

(On if he's seen the video of his second interception)

"No, I didn't even see it. I saw the video just come to my phone, but I didn't even watch it."

(On the significance of this victory in light of this season and last season)

"Oh, man, last year is last year. This year is this year. I feel like it's very special, and it's, like I said, something for us to build on this year with this team and this staff. So, man, it's very special for us. I feel like we just got to build on it. We have to keep our heads down and keep chopping."

(On what it's like to win this for Kellen Moore and Spencer Rattler)

"Yeah, I'm very happy for Coach Moore, man. He gives us his all. He cares. He cares about his players. He's a very special coach. I'm very blessed to have Coach Moore. So, I'm very excited for his first win, man. He got a big smile. So, I was glad to see it today."

"Oh, Spence. Oh, my God, man. We came in together. We always kind of got that connection because we know we came in together. We know we are on two different ends of the team, but we have to make sure that we're doing our parts, and we know that we play two important roles. So, we look at each other all game. We kind of wink at each other. We know, there's nothing else to say, but for him to get that win, man, I'm very happy for Spence. I feel like he's a great guy, for one. He's a great quarterback. He knows how to throw 12 yards. He knows how to throw it 40 yards. He's a very special guy. So, I am glad to have him as my quarterback."

"No, no, no. Like I said, he just had a great big smile. He just smiled. You know Coach, he smiles."

DB JORDAN HOWDEN

(On his touchdown and what he saw)

"We're playing the call, first of all, and then I think it was Bryan that forced the fumble. And then I see it bobble like behind a lineman, and I just seen it like open grass. So I just picked it up and just run. Run for my life."

(On being on kickoff coverage on the next play)

“No, I had to take that one out. They know, they play football, they know how tiring it is. I'm just glad they gave me the play off so I can catch my breath a little bit. And I'm able to be back on the field a couple of plays after that.”

(On the fumble recovery and the depth in the room)

“It says a lot, during the week we always preach, the ball, the ball, the ball is the most important thing in football. And like you said, we practice turnovers in practice and drills and team periods, and stuff like that. And you go out there, you talk it, you preach it, and you go out there, you fly around. Good things happen when you're around the ball.”

(On Terrell Burgess's critical pass breakup on the flea flicker)

“That was actually the play of the game. If you guys really watch football, that saved the whole touchdown, and that is a big play by him. And it might not be in the papers, but that's probably the biggest play in the game.”

(On the closeness of the secondary group and how it fuels playmaking)

“Yes. You hang around with your teammates off the field. That builds chemistry, but then like the room and you laugh and you communicate, when we watch film and stuff like that. And like you said, everybody, you never know when your time is up. So, we always make sure you're not starting a game and then something happens. I mean, football's weird. So you don't know when it's your opportunity to go in and then make sure what you're doing out there. So that says a lot just in the room. We're all paying attention and being ready.”

(On the conversation before the turnover)

“The first few drives like going against the offense is the hardest drives because you don't know what you are going to get. And then once you start getting used to the play calling they got going on and, you get on the sideline, communicate, just talk like, just calm down, communicate, and let's go get the ball. And like I said, good things happen here on the ball and everybody is wanting to the ball.”

(On who is the calming presence in tight situations)

“For sure, Demario Davis. It might seem calm to him, but he's definitely yelling. So, yeah.”

(On Justin Reid's pride for him after the game and if there was a “proud dad” energy)

going on)

“Oh, no, for sure. He was definitely more excited than I was for sure when I saw him. And even when Julian (Blackmon) was out there too, he had a video and everything. We just talked about it. It's just cool to see the vets, just happy for the young guys and go out there just having fun.”

(On if Brandon Staley made any adjustments that contributed to the success of the defense in the second half)

“A little bit. There is always going to be something to adjust off of. But like I said, you make a call, you execute the call, and you fly out to the ball. That is really all it is. And you can see that's all we were doing from the D-line, from linebackers, from the DBs. And that's how you get five to zero. You get five turnovers, and that just sets you up for a big W at the end of the day.”

(On if it was as simple as just getting used to what they were doing)

“Yeah, a little bit. But, they can always switch it up. But, you always have that. That's okay. Like if you're getting this, they might do this. So you always have to keep that in your head. Like, okay, just make sure you just actually just execute the call, and you just go out there and just fly around.”

(On how special it is for the vets and younger guys to make plays)

“It always starts especially like up front. The front seven is what drives us to go out there and just play fast because they dominate the whole line, and they're getting sacks and strip sacks, them getting tackles and stuff, that hypes us up and that creates opportunities for the secondary to go out there and get picks and fumble recoveries.”

(On if Staley's scheme opens him up to “fly around”)

“For sure. Your eyes are more on the quarterback in the backfield and you get to see more and you get to play a little patient. You don't just got to go, ‘oh, this is my man,’ and stuff like that. So it definitely gives you a leeway of, okay, I can break on the ball faster than the previous scheme.”

(On Kool-Aid McKinstry's first two picks today)

“I'm very proud of him. It's a big thing, to get your first INT, especially in the NFL. But then to get two in one game, definitely, like I heard you guys talking about where is he going to put it. Definitely got to have a special place to put at least fit two of them or a stab or whatever. But like

I said, just proud of him. During the week he's always preparing and communicating. He's doing way better than he was last year. So I'm proud of him."

(On if he's keeping the ball from his fumble recovery)

"Oh, for sure. That's going home with me."

(On if he's ever had a scoop and score)

"No. In college? No, I didn't have one in college, but this would definitely be my first one since probably like, high school. So that's definitely a big deal for me. So like I said, I'm just proud of myself to go out here and be having the opportunity to go get it."

(On how it feels since it's been 300 days since a Saints)

"You try not to think about it like that. You have a new coach, new team, new spirit, new players. You always come in like just trying to get that nasty taste out your mouth. You (aren't) used to losing none of that. So it's just the next right step. It gives us confidence from coaching staff and also as players. Like I said, it's the next right step and (we) just (have to keep it going.)"

(On the post-game locker room)

"Oh, definitely. It's been a while since we had the fog and music playing and stuff like that. Almost forgot how that was. So to actually feel that and to have seen Kellen, he's a humble guy. So to see him smiling and just getting with the guys. So that was pretty cool, for him to actually experience that, like we used to do in the past."

DE CAMERON JORDAN

(On the defense causing five turnovers today)

"(It's) huge. We have been talking about how we need more turnovers. We've been stuck at that one number. (Being) up plus five in turnovers is how you get a win."

(On the play of Kool-Aid McKinstry)

"That's what you need. (You've got to) have confidence. We already knew that he got better. Kool-Aid, I'm sure, had the biggest smile."

(On getting the first win for Head Coach Kellen Moore and Quarterback Spencer Rattler)

“It’s all about trying to build that confidence...He (Rattler) aired one out to Rashid Shaheed. When you air things out, it helps a defense out and you are able to take advantage, and I think we did just that. I wish that we could’ve put up more points.”

TE FOSTER MOREAU

(On the feeling of winning the game today)

“It feels great. The whole team came together, the O (offense), D (defense), and (special) teams. It got a little dirty there in some moments, but credit guys for picking each other up. Credit the defense. 5-0 on the turnover differential. It is unbelievable. I don’t know if I have ever been a part of something like that. That was really spectacular. It was an awesome, awesome opportunity for us to capitalize on a little bit of momentum.”

(On the feeling of being able to play again following an injury)

“It was a deep feeling deep inside. It’s great. I talked to Taysom (Hill) this morning (and) we were pretty pumped up. It’s so hard to put into words how much coming back from these injuries takes. Credit to everyone to rest on their shoulders...We’ve got a great medical staff. We’ve got a great nutrition staff. We’ve got a great strength staff. Our coaches were patient. They understood our schedules and what we had to do. We just had to buy in and compete every single day. Thank God that I had someone to compete with (in rehab) as good as Taysom. They don’t make people as good as (him).”

(On helping Head Coach Kellen Moore get his first win)

“It is awesome. Kellen is an excellent coach. He’s a great play caller. People sit in meetings, and the stuff that comes out of this guy’s mouth...He is unbelievable. (He’s) just a brilliant guy. I mean, he is still able to relate to everyone and does a great job of communicating information. It’s awesome for him. Hopefully, it is the start of many.”

T KELVIN BANKS JR.

(On playing complementary football and capitalizing off of some turnovers)

“It’s definitely important, especially when the defense gets the ball for us. We have to go down and score. Sometimes, we weren’t able to put it in. That’s something that you just have to learn and grow from and go finish the drive.

QB JAXSON DART

(On turnovers “snowballing”) “Yeah those suck. Obviously you don't win many games when you have five, and you don't get on the other side of the ball so it felt like we had a lot of opportunities where we were moving the ball down the field and we would hurt ourselves. In the NFL every team is a good team, every team has talent and I felt like we just gave the game away with all the turnovers.”

(On when he dropped the ball)

“It fell out of my hand.”

(On what was the teaching moment)

“To tuck the ball.”

(Has it happened before)

“No.”

(On the opinion on his progress)

“Any time you get more reps you're going to get better, obviously I'm young and that can't be an excuse so I have to continue to get better. Quarterbacks are measured by wins and losses so I take that to heart. I felt like I was the one who should've been putting our team in better situations to win this game.”

(On how he processes five straight turnovers)

“It is not good, (I) have got to cut it out. It starts with me being a leader. Obviously some of those came from me, and I have to be a better example and (better) leader. In those situations can talk to the guys in the huddle and remind them about ball security. As a quarterback I put those on myself. ”

(On the takeaway from the first two offensive drives that were successful)

“(I’m) Definitely not into moral victories, it is a loss. I don’t really care what happened during the game. The whole game we moved the ball, we had turnovers. There weren't many times where we got stopped, we were really good in the open field, we just turned the ball over.”

(On moving forward from the first loss)

“I am going to work harder. It is a long season and it is different from college. For me I just have to keep leading. I told as many guys as I can in the locker room that this one is on me, and I am going to get better. I expect myself to play better in the games and to win them. I’m going to go back and watch the tape, see the things that I can clean up on and be better for this team to win the games we play. ”

(On why does he put the loss on himself as there were other people who contributed)

“I’m the leader of the offense, so i think that any time those things happen it falls back on the leaders. I take that responsibility and I’m going to continue to have conversations with the guys, and we’re going to clean that stuff up.”

(On being a rookie/young player)

“I never cared about my age. Coming into the NFL, I'm the youngest quarterback in the league, but I could care less about that; it's about winning. I don't take any excuse for my age or being a rookie. There’s a responsibility when you’re a quarterback to go win games and that’s the standard I hold myself to.”

(On the Egg Bowl compared to NFL)

“Every game in the SEC is intense, but I would say the Egg Bowl was one of the bigger rivalries in college football. I think the physicality of it is something you can take from college to the NFL.”

(On How he feels physically)

“Good, I’m okay.”

(On any trouble with the play on the first interception)

“There was some extra communication that we were trying to get cleared up, and obviously it's fourth down so I'm not going to take a sack or try to make a play. Fourth down you have to try to give somebody a chance and it gets out of the pocket, and in those situations I try to put the ball down the field and in my mind that's just as good as a punt. I try to give my guy a chance on fourth down.”

(On preparations for short weeks)

“I’ve played in a short week in college before; the Egg Bowl. That is a quick turnaround so I understand the timing a little. The good thing for me is that I have guys in the room who have done it for a really long time. I try to make a schedule, and it's going to be a lighter week on our bodies, but the communication has to be at an all-time high to make sure that everybody is on the same page. In these short weeks we can play as clean as we can. ”

RB CAM SKATTEBO

(On the fumble in the red zone)

“I fumbled, he got a good punch on it, I handed them a touchdown. So, just got to be better, hold onto the ball. We preach to take care of the ball and that is all I got to do, that my job.”...”He got it out perfectly, he punched the ball on the backside, and I did not hold on tight enough.”

(On the offense having three straight turnovers)

“We stayed on the course, we just kept fighting, fighting, and fighting. One of his picks was fourth and eight and we had to make something happen. Might as well punt the ball, you know what I mean, he (Jaxson Dart) knew that. It was fourth and eight and (we) had to make something happen, and threw an interception, oh well, you know what I mean. As an offense we kept fighting, we had a lot of turnovers obviously, got to take care of the ball, I’m a main culprit of that. Mine resulted in a touchdown, so I take big responsibility in that.”

(On beating an undefeated team last week, then losing to a team that hasn’t won)

“We lost a game, it’s as simple as that. We turned the ball over and we didn’t play the football we should be playing, as simple as that. It’s not on the coaches. We got to take care of the ball better.”

(On Jaxson Dart’s confidence)

“He will be fine; he’s a football player he will be fine. I mean I don’t have to say anything to him, he knows who he is, he stays true to himself, he’s not going to bite, we are going to keep fighting to win football games.”

TE THEO JOHNSON

(On running more two-tight end formations)

“I think it has a good change up, gives the defense something different to look at. I think we can do a lot out of it, we have all capable guys, that can do everything you ask. We can run out of it, catch out of it. Me and (Daniel) Bellinger get more action in the passing game. It is tough to defend when you have got guys that can do everything at the tight end position.”

(On the connection with Jaxson Dart)

“That’s my guy, we are going to keep building that connection. Keep working together.”

(On keeping spirits high despite the 1-4 start)

“It’s next play mentality, everyone is going to make mistakes and have plays they wish they could have back. Its next play mentality, if you keep thinking about the last play you aren’t going to do the right thing on the next play.”

(On the crowd noise being disruptive)

“It got loud in there; I think we did a good job of handling it. We got to hold our water, we had some offsides (penalties), but overall I think we handled it well.”

S TYLER NUBIN

(On the penalties)

“Yeah, I mean it tough, on the back end I feel like we play some of the hardest positions on the field. When you make a mistake it’s a touchdown or they are moving the ball quite a good amount. We got to be better, we got to better, like I said we can be better on first and second down so we can put them in disadvantageous positions so that we can go eat.”

(On two late Saints scores before half, hurting flow)

“It definitely put a wrench in it. But I wouldn’t say it hurt the flow because we came in here really encouraged for the second half, to come out and start doing well and start playing our brand of football. You know that was huge, I think that was really huge momentum swing from what we were doing earlier in the game to obviously going into halftime, so (we) got to clean that up.”

WR DARIUS SLAYTON

(On his fumble)

“Just trying to make a play, I don’t know if he punched it out, I don’t know how I lost the ball. Obviously, right there I have to be better, I have to do a better job at securing the ball.”

(On two missed targets)

“Not so much that [first] one, that one I kind of got hit on that try, I still didn’t make the play, but that it’s kind of like football, make some miss some. More so the second one [flea flicker], I wish I would’ve tried to go back and get the ball a different way, maybe try to jump and get the ball.”

(On expanding on the flee flicker play)

“I just wish I would’ve tried to get back to it in some type, shape or form. End of the day, the quarterback can’t be perfect, put it near us, it’s our job to go up and fight for the ball, I wish would’ve went about it differently.”

- With the 26-14 win over the New York Giants, the New Orleans Saints move to 1-4 on the season and 1-2 at home. Next up, the Black and Gold stay at home when they face the New England Patriots next Sunday, October 12, in the Caesars Superdome. Kickoff is set for Noon CT and will be broadcast regionally on CBS (WWL 4 locally).
- The 26 points scored were a season-high by the Saints and the 14 points allowed a season-low, as New Orleans ran off 23 consecutive points in the final three quarters.
- The Saints victory improved New Orleans' record to 17-17 against the Giants, giving them their third consecutive victory against the team. The Saints now have at least a .500 record against 12 teams.
- The win over the Giants now gives them an 11-4 record in the series in games played in New Orleans (Tulane Stadium and Caesars Superdome).
- Head Coach **Kellen Moore** received his first victory against the Giants.
- QB **Spencer Rattler** went 21-for-31 for 225 yards with one touchdown, zero interceptions and a 99.5 passer rating. Rattler also rushed six times for 21 yards. He had 187 yards passing in the first half, the most in a half in his career. It also marks Rattler's first win as a starting quarterback in the NFL, and the first time that a QB drafted by the Saints started and recorded a win since Danny Wuerffel (9/13/98 19-14 win vs. Carolina at Caesars Superdome). Rattler was protected by an offensive line that did not surrender a sack.
- QB **Taysom Hill** also threw a pass that connected for 19 yards in his first game back this season.
- The receiving effort was led by WR **Rashid Shaheed**, who recorded four receptions for 114 yards (28.5 avg.) and a touchdown. WR **Chris Olave** also put up seven receptions for 59 yards.
- The 87-yard bomb from Rattler to Shaheed was the longest play from scrimmage since an 87-yard touchdown connection from Drew Brees to WR **Brandin Cooks** vs. Carolina, 10/16/16. It is tied for the fifth-longest play in franchise history. Since 2022, when Shaheed entered the NFL as an undrafted free agent, his 12 total touchdowns of 40 yards or more rank third in the NFL behind only Ja'Marr Chase and Tyreek Hill.
- The only other Saints signal-callers to throw an 87-yard (or more) completion (all touchdown passes) are Drew Brees, Billy Joe Hobert, Kerry Collins and Heath Shuler.

- Shaheed reached 21.72 MPH on that touchdown, which is the highest by any player in the NFL this season.
- RB **Alvin Kamara** rushed eight times for 27 yards and also caught four receptions for 28 yards. RB **Kendre Miller** also carried ten times for 41 yards and recorded one reception for eight yards.

- Kamara surpassed Tiki Barber and Marcus Allen to move into fifth place all-time in NFL record books for receptions by a running back. He also played in his 120th game to move into a tie for 33rd on the club's games played list with LB Vaughan Johnson.
- Kamara recorded 56 yards from scrimmage, which passes RB **Ezekiel Elliot** for 75th all-time.
- Defensively, New Orleans held the Giants to converting only three-of ten (30.0 pct.) third down attempts.
- The tackling effort was led by LBs **Pete Werner** and **Demario Davis**, as they accumulated 11 and ten total stops, respectively. CB **Alontae Taylor** contributed eight tackles, and S **Jonas Sanker** also recorded seven stops on the day with a fumble recovery.
- Davis played in his 119th game as a Saint on Sunday, which put him in sole possession of 35th in club record books ahead of DE Charles Grant and CB Brett Maxie. He also played in his 215th career game in his 14-year career, the most games played by an active NFL linebacker. With his 215th appearance, he moved into a tie for 14th all-time for appearances by linebackers with Monte Coleman and Pro Football Hall of Famer Ted Hendricks.
- Sanker's back-to-back games with takeaways is the first time by a Saints rookie since Marshon Lattimore had an interception a piece in three consecutive contests from 12/7/17–12/24/17. His two takeaways on the season are the most by a Saints rookie since Paulson Adebo recorded three in 2021.
- Early in the third quarter, Jaxson Dart fumbled which was picked up by DE **Cameron Jordan**. This was the first turnover of Dart's NFL career.
- DB **Jordan Howden** recovered a fumble by Giants RB **Cam Skattebo** (forced by DT **Bryan Bresee**) and returned it for 86 yards all the way to the end zone. It is tied for the second-longest fumble return in franchise history with an 86-yard return by Tyrone Hughes vs San Francisco on Nov. 28, 1994.
- This was the first time the Saints had three fumble recoveries in the same game since 11/22/18 vs Atlanta.
- CB **Kool-Aid McKinstry** recorded his first career interception midway through the fourth quarter, then recorded his second only a couple of minutes later. McKinstry has recorded Dart's first two interceptions if his NFL career.
- This was the first time with five takeaways since in a 24-17 win over Chicago on Nov. 5, 2023. The turnover ratio was 5-0 in the Saints' favor. This is the second game this season and first time since the season opener that the Saints did not commit a turnover.
- The Saints defense forced a turnover on five consecutive possessions, last doing so during the 1991 season against the Eagles (Oct. 13) and Cardinals (Dec. 22). The last team in the NFL to force turnovers off of five consecutive offensive possessions was Kansas City on Sept. 25, 2016.
- The Saints went seven-for-15 on third down, which is a 46.7% success rate, the highest percentage all season.
- K **Blake Grupe** went four-for-six on field goals, hitting from 28, 29 (2x) and 53 yards. He also made both PAT attempts.
- P **Kai Kroeger** punted twice for 83 yards (41.5 gross and net avg.).
- LS **Zach Wood** surpassed S Tommy Myers for 22nd place in games played in club record books with 137.
- On special teams coverage units, DE **Chris Rumph II** led the team with two stops, to go with three defensive tackles. Through the first five games, Rumph has already tied his career-high for special teams stops (five), which he previously set in 2021 and 2022.
