TRAINING CAMP SUMMARY

Players Report to Training Camp on July 22; First Practice Set For July 23

The New England Patriots will open their 66th annual training camp on Tuesday, July 22, when veteran players report to camp. The first scheduled practice will be on Wednesday, July 23 at 10:15 a.m. on the practice fields behind Gillette Stadium. The daily practice schedule throughout training camp is tentative and subject to change. Fans planning to attend practice are encouraged to check www.patriots.com/trainingcamp for last-minute updates or call the training camp hotline at 508-549-0001. Parking and admission to practices, the Fan Walk and Kids Activity area are all free.

Gillette Stadium offers ample parking for the fans who attend daily training camp practices. Bleachers, located on the west sideline of the practice fields, will provide seating for thousands of fans with overflow seating on a hillside in the north end of the field.

JOINT PRACTICE WITH TWO TEAMS

The Patriots will host a joint practice session with the Washington Commanders on Wednesday, August 6 prior to the preseason game at Gillette Stadium on Friday, August 8. The Patriots will also travel for joint practices with the Minnesota Vikings for practices on Wednesday, August 13 and Thursday, August 14, prior to the preseason game on Saturday, Aug. 16.

PATRIOTS MEDIA INFORMATION

GENERAL MEDIA TRAINING CAMP POLICY

Practices throughout training camp are open to the media. In your coverage of daily practice sessions, we ask for your cooperation in observing the following practice policies:

1. **Please do not report on strategy. This includes describing formations, personnel groups, first-team/second-team groupings, positions and non-conventional plays.**
2. **Live streaming of any video to the Internet or any other social media platform is prohibited.**
3. **Video recording or photography of any kind (including from your phone) after the allotted camera access times is prohibited.**
4. **Please do not quote, paraphrase or report the comments made by coaches or players during practice.**
5. **Please do not report on players who line up in positions different from the one listed on the roster.**
6. **Please do not take photos or report on any players who are rehabilitating on the lower practice fields.**
7. **For practice sessions during training camp that are open to the public, tweeting, blogging, etc. of events, such as VIP visitors to practice and exceptional plays by individual players, is allowed.**
8. **After practice, photographers and videographers are welcome to shoot any of the players who are engaged in media interviews or signing autographs, but not any of the on-field activities, including the time when players are visiting with family and friends after practice. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.**

If there are any questions regarding these policies during a practice session, please ask for clarification from a Patriots communications representative in advance. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

PHOTO AND VIDEO POLICY

Still photographers and TV cameras will be allowed to shoot a portion of each practice session. Times will likely vary. A member of the Patriots communications staff will notify all cameras when it is time to shut down. **Please do not use recordings of comments made by coaches during a practice session.** Photographer credentials will allow access to the north end of the field and in front of the ropes on the west sidelines. There will be no access to areas between the two fields or along the east sideline. We ask that you please adhere to the following guidelines at practice:

1. **Please be respectful of the fans who are seated behind you. On the west sideline, we request that all photographers kneel in the areas immediately in front of the bleacher seating to minimize the obstructed views for our fans.**
2. **Please do not use photos showing personnel groupings or formations.**
3. **Please do not take any photos of the player family and guest area.**

MEDIA ENTRANCE

Enter the P1 entrance from Route 1, proceed past the security checkpoint and follow signs to the designated media parking lot (Lot 6). To access the practice fields, proceed to the security entrance located under a red awning to the right of Loading Dock #4 in the south end of the stadium. Check in and proceed to the **media elevator**. The practice fields may be accessed at Level 1, and the press box (media workroom) may be accessed at the Red Level (RL) or Blue Level (BL).

TRAINING CAMP CREDENTIALS

A non-event photo identification badge will be issued to all approved media who regularly cover the Patriots. This photo ID will be required for access to all media-specific areas, including the media tent, press box and press conference areas. All others must register for a visitor's media pass with a member of the Patriots communications department at media check-in. To expedite the media check-in process, please remember to bring your outlet-issued photo ID. If you have any questions, please reach out to Julia Palin at jpalin@patriots.com.

GAME CREDENTIALS

Sports editors and sports directors should have access to an individualized credential portal to submit all credential requests for their news affiliation each week. All entries must be submitted by Monday at 5 p.m. ET prior to that week's game. Approved credentials and parking passes will be issued on a weekly basis and can be picked up in person from the communications office. Please note, per the NFL's 2025 media access policy, there will be a limited allocation of 18 local media and broadcast television affiliates with field access, in addition to 12 for the visiting team. MEDIA SEATING AREAS

A media tent will be available to any media wishing to seek shade. The tent will be located atop the hillside in the north end zone between the VIP bleacher seating and the family tent area. Please show credentials for access to the tent. **Please Note: There is no media access to the VIP seating area or the family tent.**

MEDIA WORKROOM

Throughout training camp, media may use the Red and Blue Level Press Box area as a workroom. Members of the media relations staff will be available to assist the media and can be reached on their cell phones. For those arriving without media credentials, please call Julia Palin upon arrival at 774.378.0597.

MIKE VRABEL MEDIA AVAILABILITY

Patriots Head Coach Mike Vrabel will be available for the **first time in the media workroom on Tuesday, July 22 at TBD**. He will be available for the second time on Wednesday, July 23 at 9:30 a.m. on the upper grass fields. Vrabel will be available to the media every other practice, throughout training camp, prior to that day's practice.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

At the request of media, the Patriots communications staff will only have two interview stations again this year and will plan to bring four to six players to those stations after each practice. TV cameras will shoot from atop the hill near the media tent. We ask all reporters to please allow the cameras behind them unobstructed views to the players by standing to the side of each interview station or by kneeling/sitting in front. New England's Pro Football Writers Association representative, Andrew Callahan, will collect and prioritize all player requests from the media and provide to the Patriots communications staff daily. Any additional requests can be made through the Patriots communications staff. Please try to make all requests in advance so it can be communicated prior to each practice.

MEDIA INFORMATION

All Patriots media information is available on the Patriots media website, located at media.patriots.com. Copies of materials will be available upon request.

RAIN POLICY

When the Patriots are forced to practice indoors due to inclement weather or poor field conditions, those practices will be closed to the public. For that reason, we stress the importance that fans and media please visit the team website at Patriots.com or call the training camp hotline at 508-549-0001 prior to every practice for up-to-the-minute changes in the daily practice schedule.

ROSTER REDUCTION DATE

The NFL roster limit during training camp is 90 players. Teams must cut down to a 53-man roster by 4 p.m. ET on August 26.

PATRIOTS PROSHOP

The Patriots ProShop will be open daily on all days that the public has access to practice. The ProShop is located on the northeast corner of the stadium below the Patriots Hall of Fame presented by RTX. Fans attending training camp and parked on the west side of the stadium may access the ProShop via the staircase on the north end of the stadium. Times will vary depending on the daily practice schedule, opening at least one hour before or after each practice session.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

To ensure an enjoyable experience for all, fans entering Training Camp will be required to go through security screening and have all bags inspected by our security personnel.

Fans may bring their own collapsible chairs and strollers.

Video cameras and detachable lens cameras are not allowed. Photographs taken with cell phones and non-detachable lens cameras are welcome, but we ask fans not to shoot or post practice video of any kind.

While bags are permitted at Training Camp, we encourage fans to use clear bags for speed of inspection and entry.

Please refer to the Prohibited Items list below for items not allowed at entry at Training Camp:

- Animals, except service animals assisting those with disabilities.
- Any alcoholic beverages
- Beach balls
- Bullhorns, air horns and other noise makers
- Coolers
- Detachable lens cameras
- Drones or other forms of remote-controlled aircrafts
- Fireworks or pyrotechnics
- Flags will be allowed, however those over two feet in length will not be allowed.
- Helium balloons
- Laser pens
- Non-prescription or illegal drugs
- Selfie sticks
- Tripods
- Video cameras
- Weapons of any kind (including knives)
- Any other item deemed inappropriate by stadium management

Fans are reminded to please leave all such items appropriately secured in their vehicles.

Individuals with possession of a prohibited item(s) may be denied admission to training camp, ejected, and or prosecuted. Prohibited items that are discovered at Training Camp will be confiscated.

CONCESSIONS

The concession stands at Training Camp offer fans a variety of food and drink options.

PARKING

Parking is free throughout training camp. Tailgating is not permitted in the lots during training camp.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2025

- P Bryce Baringer can become the first Patriots player with at least 30 punts inside the 20-yard line in three straight seasons. Baringer set a Patriots record with 38 punts inside the 20-yard line as a rookie in 2023 and then followed with 31 punts inside the 20-yard line in 2024. Baringer and Jake Bailey (36 in 2019 and 31 in 2020) are the only Patriots punters with back-to-back seasons with at least 30 punts inside the 20-yard line. If Baringer reaches 30 punts inside the 20-yard line in 2025, he will be the first punter since Cameron Johnston (2021-23 with Houston) to accomplish the feat.
- Baringer enters the 2025 season with a team record 48.1-yard punting average and will attempt to stay on that pace.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2025

- WR Stefon Diggs has recorded five seasons with 100 receptions. If he registers 100 receptions in 2025, he will join Antonio Brown and Brandon Marshall as the only NFL players with six 100-reception seasons.

- Diggs has 17 career 10-catch games and needs three more to join Davante Adams (23), Antonio Brown (23), Andre Johnson (22) and Keenan Allen (20) as the fifth player to have at least 20 such games.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2025

- S Kyle Dugger scored 3 touchdowns in 2022 with 2 interceptions returned for touchdowns and a fumble returned for a touchdown. He needs one more defensive touchdown to tie Willie McGinest and Tedy Bruschi for the second-most defensive touchdowns in team history with 4, behind the 6 by Ty Law.




WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2025

- TE Hunter Henry enters the 2025 season fifth on the all-time reception list among New England tight ends with 199 receptions, sixth in receiving yards with 2,205 and fifth with 19 touchdown receptions. He needs 1 reception to become the fifth New England tight end to reach 200 receptions, 795 receiving yards to join Rob Gronkowski (7,861), Ben Coates (5,471) and Russ Francis (3,157) as the fourth Patriots tight end to reach 3,000 receiving yards and 1 touchdown to become the fifth New England tight end with 20 touchdowns.
- Henry led the Patriots with 66 receptions in 2024. If he leads the team in receptions in 2025, he will become the second New England tight end to lead the team in receptions in consecutive seasons, joining Ben Coates (1993-95, 1997-98).

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2025

- CB Marcus Jones scored on a 48-yard touchdown reception vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1, 2022. If he scores on offense in 2025, he will join LB Mike Vrabel (8 touchdown receptions) as the only defensive player with more than 1 touchdown on offense in team history. Vrabel also has the most offensive touchdowns by an NFL defensive player with 10 in the regular season and 2 in the postseason.
- Jones returned a punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets on Nov. 20, 2022. If he returns a kickoff for a touchdown in 2025, he will become the first New England player to return a punt and a kickoff for a touchdown and the first NFL player to do so in a season since WR KaVontae Turpin of Dallas in 2024.
- If Jones returns a punt for a touchdown in 2025, he will join Julian Edelman (4), Troy Brown (3), Irving Fryar (3) and Mike Haynes (2) as the only Patriots players with more than one punt returned for a touchdown.
- Jones scored on offense, defense and special teams in 2022. He is the only player to score in all three phases in a single season since 1970. He is one of ten players to score on offense, defense and special teams during their NFL career.

- Jones had a 62-yard punt return in the third quarter vs. the N.Y. Jets (10/27/24). It was his second career punt return of over 60 yards. He had a career-best 84-yard punt return for a touchdown vs. the Jets on Nov. 20, 2022. If he registers a punt return of at least 60 yards in 2025, he will join Troy Brown with three career punt returns of over 60 yards, behind only the four by WR Julian Edelman (since 1980).
- Jones finished second in the NFL in 2024 with a 14.8-yard punt return average (26 returns for 386 yards). He enters the 2025 season with the highest punt return average in team history with a 13.3 punt return yard average.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2025

- T Vederian Lowe scored his first career touchdown on a 4-yard reception from QB Drake Maye vs. the Los Angeles Rams on Nov. 17, 2024. If he has a touchdown reception in 2025, he will be the first Patriots offensive lineman with more than one reception and touchdown reception in his career.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2025

- QB Drake Maye enters the 2025 season in 15th place in team history with 2,276 passing yards and needs 1,645 passing yards to move into the team's Top 10.
- As a rookie in 2024, Maye finished with 54 rushing attempts for 421 yards and a 7.80-yard average, the sixth-highest in NFL history for a quarterback with at least 50 rushing attempts. Maye will look to add to his rushing average in his second NFL season. Former Philadelphia QB Randall Cunningham set the NFL record for a quarterback with a 7.84-yard rushing average in his first two NFL seasons (1985-86 – 95 rushing attempts for 745 yards).

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2025

- S Brenden Schooler has led the Patriots in special teams tackles in each of his first three seasons with 14 in 2022, 13 in 2023 and 9 in 2024. He will look to become the first Patriots player in team history to lead the team in special teams tackles in each of his first four NFL seasons since 2000. Since 2000, Larry Izzo (five straight from 2001-05) and Matthew Slater (five straight from 2011-2015) were the only players to lead the Patriots in special teams tackles for at least three straight seasons regardless of their experience level before Schooler's current three-season streak.
- Across the NFL, there have been four players this century to lead the same team in special teams tackles in each of their first four NFL seasons:
 - Nick Bellore: 2011-14 - N.Y. Jets
 - Johnson Bademosi: 2012-15 - Cleveland
 - Justin Bethel: 2012-16 - Arizona (first five seasons)
 - Tyler Matakevich: 2016-19 - Pittsburgh
- Across the NFL, there have been five players this century to lead any team in special teams tackles in each of their first four NFL seasons:
 - Brendon Ayanbadejo: 2003-04 - Miami; 2005-07 - Chicago (first five seasons)
 - Nick Bellore: 2011-14 - N.Y. Jets; 2015 - San Francisco (first five seasons)
 - Johnson Bademosi: 2012-15 - Cleveland
 - Justin Bethel: 2012-16 - Arizona (first five seasons)
 - Tyler Matakevich: 2016-19 - Pittsburgh; 2020-21 - Buffalo (first five seasons)
- Schooler blocked a field goal in 2023 and a punt in 2024. If he records a blocked kick in 2025, he will join Chad Eaton (3 blocked field goals) for second in team history with 3 blocked kicks, behind the 6 blocked kicks by Richard Seymour (6 blocked field goals).
- Schooler would also join DL Chad Eaton (2 blocked field goals in 2000), DL Richard Seymour (2 blocked field goals in 2002), S Patrick Chung (1 blocked field goal and 1 blocked punt in 2010) and LB Shea McClellin (1 blocked extra point and 1 blocked field goal) as the only Patriots players with 2 blocked kicks in a season.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2025

- RB Rhamondre Stevenson recorded his first 1,000-yard rushing season with a career-high 1,040 rushing yards in 2022. He can become the third New England player to reach at least two 1,000-yard rushing seasons, joining Curtis Martin (3) and Jim Nance (2).
- Stevenson led the team in receptions in 2022 with 69 receptions. He can join Tony Collins (1985 and 1987) as the only New England running backs to lead the team in receptions in two seasons.
- Stevenson enters the 2025 season in ninth place in team history with 3,066 rushing yards and needs 542 yards to move past Kevin Faulk (3,607) into fifth place on the New England all-time rushing yards list.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2025

- LB Jahlani Tavai has registered 100-total tackles in each of the last two seasons with 107 tackles in 2023 and a career-high 109 total tackles in 2024. He can become the first Patriots player with three-straight 100 tackle seasons since LB Ja'Whaun Bentley (2021, 2022 and 2023).





- Played for Louisiana Tech from 2017-20, making the transition to interior defensive line as a redshirt junior after starting his career on the edge.


