## GAME SUMMARY

### NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (12-3) AT NEW YORK JETS (3-12)

Sunday, December 28, 2025 • MetLife Stadium (82,500) • 1:00 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots will meet the New York Jets for the second time in 2025 when they travel to square off at MetLife Stadium. The Patriots earned a 27-14 win on Thursday Night Football on Nov. 13 at Gillette Stadium in the first meeting of the season. This week, the Patriots will look for their 24<sup>th</sup> series sweep and first since the 2022 season. The Patriots improved to a 7-0 road record last week when they won at Baltimore, 28-24, to clinch a playoff berth. The Patriots have gone undefeated on the road two times in team history, finishing 8-0 on the road in 2016 and 2007.

## BROADCAST INFORMATION

**TELEVISION:** This week's game will be broadcast by **FOX** and can be seen locally on **WFXT-TV** Channel 25. **Adam Amin** will handle play-by-play duties with **Drew Brees** as the color analyst. **Kristina Pink** will work from the sidelines. The game will be produced by **Barry Landis** and directed by **Mitch Riggins**.

**NATIONAL RADIO:** Thursday's game will be broadcast to a national audience on **Sports USA**. **Larry Kahn** will call the game with **Brandon Noble** providing analysis.

**LOCAL RADIO:** **98.5 The Sports Hub** is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. A complete listing of the network's 33 stations can be found in this press release on page 61. Play-by-play broadcaster **Bob Socci** will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback **Scott Zolak**, who will provide color analysis. The games are produced by **Marc Cappello**.

## PATRIOTS CLINCH FIRST PLAYOFF BERTH SINCE 2021

The Patriots clinched their first playoff berth since the 2021 season and their 29<sup>th</sup> postseason appearance overall. Twenty-three of those playoff berths have come in the 32 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence.

## ROAD WARRIORS

A win this week at the New York Jets will give the Patriots a perfect 8-0 road record in 2025. They are the only team that has not lost on the road in 2025. The Patriots finished undefeated on the road two times in team history with 8-0 records in 2007 and 2016. The Patriots can join San Francisco (1984, 1989 and 1990) as the only NFL teams to go undefeated on the road in three seasons since 1970. The only other teams to go undefeated on the road in a season were Miami (1972), Washington (1982), Detroit (2024), Kansas City (2020), Dallas (2014) and St. Louis (2001).

## SEEKING NO. 13

A victory over the New York Jets this week will give the Patriots their 13<sup>th</sup> win of the season and their eighth 13-win season in team history. Only San Francisco has more 13-win seasons with 11.

# PATRIOTS AT NEW YORK JETS

## SERIES HISTORY



The New England Patriots will meet the New York Jets for the second time in 2025 when they travel to face the Jets at MetLife Stadium. The Patriots earned a 27-14 win on Thursday Night Football on Nov. 13 at Gillette Stadium in the first meeting of the season. This week, the Patriots will look for their 24th series sweep and first since the 2022 season.

The Jets broke a 15-game losing streak overall in a 17-3 regular season finale win at Gillette Stadium on Jan. 7, 2024. It also broke up a 14-game home winning streak by New England. The teams have split the annual series in each of the last two seasons.

New England leads the series 76-56-1 overall. The Patriots are 35-30 overall in games played on the road against the Jets, including 11-4 at MetLife Stadium.

The teams have played in the postseason three times – a 1985 Wild Card game, a 2006 Wild Card game and an AFC Divisional game in 2010. New England beat the Jets 26-14 in 1985 at the Meadowlands en route to Super Bowl XX. In 2006, the Patriots defeated the Jets 37-16 at Gillette Stadium, and the Jets beat the Patriots 28-21 in the 2010 Divisional playoff game in Foxborough.

New England is 47-18 against the Jets since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, including two postseason games.

New England's 76 overall victories over the Jets (including two playoff wins) are the second-most over any single opponent, trailing only the 80 all-time wins over Buffalo.

That season, which was DeVito's redshirt freshman year, DeVito completed 44-of-87 passes (50.6%) for 525 yards and 4 touchdowns in eight games for the Orange. Jonathan recorded 21 tackles, 6 tackles for loss, 5 sacks, 1 forced fumble and 1 fumble recovery that season, and Cisco logged 60 tackles, 11 passes defended and 7 interceptions, which tied for the lead in the country and helped him be named a Freshman All-American.

- **QB Drake Maye** enters this week against Jets first in the NFL with a 70.9 completion percentage. Tom Brady has the New England record for a season with a 68.9 completion percentage in 2007. Brady was the last Patriots player to lead the NFL in completion percentage when he did so in 2007. Maye's 70.9 completion percentage would be the ninth-best in NFL History.
- Maye is first in the NFL in completion percentage (70.9), third in passer rating (108.5) and fourth in passing yards (3,947).
- Maye enters this week with 3,947 passing yards and needs 53 yards passing this week against the Jets to reach 4,000 yards passing and join Tom Brady (11) and Drew Bledsoe (2) as the only New England quarterbacks to reach 4,000 passing yards in a season.
- Maye enters this week tied for fifth in the NFL with 25 touchdown passes. He needs 5 touchdowns in the last two games of the regular season to join Tom Brady (seven seasons) and Babe Parilli (one season) as the only Patriots with at least 30 touchdown passes in a season.
- Maye has a 108.5 passer rating in 2025. Tom Brady is the only Patriots quarterback to finish with a 100-plus rating in a season. He accomplished the feat six times during his career with the Patriots with a team record 117.2 passer rating in 2007.
- Maye has five 50-yard completions in 2025. The most 50-yard completions by a Patriots quarterback in a season is seven by Tom Brady (2016, 2011, 2009 and 2007).
- Maye has 11 games in 2025 with a 100-plus quarterback rating. If Maye registers a quarterback rating of at least 100 this week at the Jets, he will tie the team record for the most in a season. Tom Brady has the Patriots record with 12 games in a season with a 100-plus rating in 2011 and 2010. The NFL record is 14 by Aaron Rodgers in 2020.

- **WR Stefon Diggs** enters this week with a team-leading 869 receiving yards and needs 131 yards over the final two games of the season for his seventh 1,000-yard season. It would be the first 1,000-yard season by a New England player since the 2019 season when WR Julian Edelman finished with 1,117 receiving yards.
- Diggs had his fourth 100-yard game of the 2025 season last week at Baltimore. If he records a 100-yard game this week at the Jets, he will be the first Patriots player with five 100-yard games in a season since TE Rob Gronkowski in 2015. - In Week 9 vs. Atlanta (11/2), Diggs surpassed 900 career receptions and at Tampa Bay (11/9), reached 11,000 career receiving yards since entering the NFL in 2015. - **RB TreVeyon Henderson** has four touchdown runs of 50-plus yards in 2025. Chris Johnson (2009 with Tennessee) and Jim Brown (1963 with Cleveland) are the only players to have more touchdown runs of 50-plus yards in a single season with five. Henderson is tied for the third-most in NFL history. RB Saquon Barkley (2018 with the Giants and 2024 with Philadelphia), Jim Brown (1958 with Cleveland), Napoleon Kaufman (1997 with Oakland),

Lenny Moore (1956 with Baltimore), Adrian Peterson (2012 with Minnesota), Barry Sanders (1997 with Detroit) and Spec Sanders (1947 with the NY Titans) also had four 50-yard rushing touchdowns in a season.

- Henderson enters this week's game at the Jets with 8 total touchdowns (7 rushing touchdowns and 1 receiving touchdown). If he scores a touchdown this week, he will become the fifth Patriots rookie to score at least 9 total touchdowns in a season.

- Henderson is the second player in NFL history to have multiple games in a season with two rushing touchdowns of 50-plus yards, joining RB Chris Johnson in 2009 with Tennessee. If he has two 50-yard touchdown runs this week at Baltimore, he will be the first NFL player to score a pair of touchdown runs of at least 50 yards in three games in one season.

## RHAMONDRE STEVENSON #38, RB

- **RB Rhamondre Stevenson** is the first player in franchise history with 700-plus scrimmage yards in each of his first four seasons: 729 in 2021, 1,461 in 2022, 857 in 2023 and 969 in 2024. Curtis Martin, John Stephens and Tony Collins are the Patriots that had 700-plus scrimmage yards in each of their first three NFL seasons. He has 693 scrimmage yards so far in 2025 and needs 7 scrimmage yards this week at the Jets to extend his streak to five straight seasons with at least 700 scrimmage yards.



## DEMARIO DOUGLAS WR, #3



- **WR DeMario Douglas** has two 50-yard receptions in 2025. If he has a 50-yard reception this week against the Jets, he will be the first Patriots player with three 50-yard receptions in a season since the 2017 season when WR

- **CB Marcus Jones** has returned two punts for a touchdown in 2025, joining Troy Brown (2001), Irving Fryar (1985) and Mike Haynes (1976) as the only Patriots to return two punts for a touchdown in a season. If he returns a punt for a touchdown this week at Baltimore, he will be the first Patriots player with three punts returned for a touchdown in a season. He will also join Julian Edelman as the only Patriots player with 4 overall punts returned for a touchdown. Jones returned his first punt for a touchdown as a rookie in 2022. In addition, he would be the first NFL player with at least three punts returned for a touchdown in a season since the 2011 season when Patrick Peterson returned 4 punts for a touchdown for Arizona.
- Jones has 6 career touchdowns with 3 punts returned for a touchdown, 2 interceptions returned for touchdown and 1 touchdown reception. He joins Ty Law (6 interceptions returned for touchdown) and Mike Vrabel (8 touchdown receptions and 1 interception returned for a touchdown) as the only primary defenders with at least 6 touchdowns in team history. If Jones scores a touchdown this week, he will move out of a tie with Law and be 1 touchdown behind Vrabel.

- **LB Robert Spillane** enters this week with a team-leading 97 total tackles. That would be the highest total for the Patriots since WR Devante Parker had a 17.4-yard average for New England in 2022. Stanley Morgan (1979, 1980 and 1981) and Shawn Jefferson (1998) are the only Patriots players to lead the NFL in receiving average.

- **LB Harold Landry III** is leading the Patriots with 8½ sacks. If he registers 1½ sacks this week against the Jets, he will reach at least 10 sacks for the third time in his career. He had 12 sacks in 2021 and 10½ sacks in 2023 when he played for Tennessee.

- **WR Kyle Williams** scored on a 37-yard touchdown pass from QB Drake Maye in the fourth quarter in the win at Baltimore last week for his third touchdown reception of the season. His other scores were on a 72-yard reception at Tampa Bay (11/9) and a 33-yard reception vs. the New York Giants (12/1). Williams joins WR Rondale Moore (2021-23 with Arizona) and WR Jameson Williams (2022-23 with Detroit) as the last NFL players whose first three touchdowns were at least 30 yards. If Williams scores on a 30-yard touchdown this week, he will join WR Dyami Brown (2022-24 with Washington) as the last player whose first four touchdowns were at least 30 yards.

Under Kraft's leadership since he purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports.

Kraft has led the two most dominant decades in NFL history in terms of overall wins – 141 (2010-19) and 126 (2000-09).

Kraft is the most successful owner since he purchased the team in 1994 in terms of wins (369), division titles (19), winning percentage (.654), playoff wins (33) and playoff seasons (23).



Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In his 32 seasons of ownership, he is credited with transforming one of the league's least successful clubs into one of the most valuable. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.), the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (19), conference crowns (10) and Super Bowl championships (6) than any other NFL team. Additionally, the Patriots have achieved the most winning seasons (25) since Kraft assumed ownership beginning in 1994. **Super Bowl LIII was the 10th Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has appeared in more than four Super Bowls.** In Kraft's 32 seasons, the Patriots qualified for the playoffs 23 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

### A WINNING TRADITION I

Robert Kraft won his 300th game overall as owner of the New England Patriots against Miami on Sept. 30, 2018. Kraft reached the milestone in his 25th NFL season and in his 432nd game, the fastest an owner has reached the mark. Al Davis of the Raiders accomplished the feat in 495 games (31 seasons) while Pat Bowlen of Denver reached 300 career wins in 501 games (30 seasons).

### A WINNING TRADITION II

Kraft's winning percentage with the Patriots (.654) since taking over the team in 1994 is the highest among all owners/ownership groups with at least 200 wins (regular and postseason) with one team. He is one of just four owners with at least 200 wins and a winning percentage over .600.

The Patriots have 369 wins overall under Robert Kraft. He has produced more victories than every other Patriots owner combined. Under Kraft, the Patriots are 369-195 overall since he purchased the team in 1994. Kraft's predecessors in the owner's office went 225-276-9 in the 34 years prior to his purchase of the team.

### CONTINUITY BREEDS SUCCESS

New England is the first team in NFL history to win six Super Bowls with the same owner (Robert Kraft), head coach (Bill Belichick) and quarterback (Tom Brady).

### PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 29 times in their 66-year history. Twenty-three of those playoff berths have come in the 32 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots have won 22 division crowns.

Since the 1994 season, the Patriots have won 64.8 percent of their regular season games (324-176), which is the highest winning percentage in men's major American professional sports over that period (among teams with at least five years of existence). Since 1994, there have been 148 franchises that have fielded teams in the five major American sports leagues (NFL, MLB, NBA, NHL and MLS) and completed more than two full seasons of competition. On the women's side, the Toronto Six (29-5-3) and the Boston Pride (90-29-10) of the PHF hold the two highest winning percentages of all women's professional sports teams.

# PATRIOTS *POINTS OF INTEREST 2025*

## PATRIOTS

- The New England Patriots are tied with the Pittsburgh Steelers for the most Super Bowl wins in NFL history with six.
- The Patriots have played in 11 Super Bowls, the most by any team in NFL history. Dallas, Denver, Pittsburgh and San Francisco have played in eight.
- The New England Patriots have 37 postseason victories, tied with Green Bay for the second-most in NFL history to the 38 postseason wins by San Francisco.
- The Patriots are third in NFL history with 15 Conference Championship Game appearances, behind San Francisco (19) and Pittsburgh (16).
- The New England Patriots have earned seven No. 1 seeds, trailing only San Francisco (10) and Denver (8) since playoff seeding began in 1975.
- The Patriots have earned a first-round playoff bye an NFL-best 14 times since 1990. San Francisco is second with 10 byes since 1990. New England is the only team in NFL history with nine-straight first-round byes (2010-18).
- The Patriots have played in 59 postseason games, the fifth-most in NFL history, behind Dallas (67), Pittsburgh (65), Green Bay (64) and San Francisco (62).
- The Patriots are third with 14 seasons of 12 wins since 1970, behind San Francisco's 16 and Dallas' 15 seasons with 12 victories.
- New England has won 13 games in a single season seven times in franchise history. Only San Francisco (11) and has more 13-win seasons.
- The New England Patriots have won 14 or more games in a season five times, most in NFL history. San Francisco is second with four 14-win seasons.
- The Patriots have 36 winning seasons since 1970, tied with Dallas for second all-time, behind Pittsburgh's 41.
- The Patriots have 594 total victories, the fourth-most wins since their inception in 1960, behind the 614 by Pittsburgh, the 611 by Dallas and the 605 by Green Bay.
- New England (1,074) played their 1,000th game in franchise history (regular season and playoffs combined) against Cleveland on Nov. 14, 2021, and became the first original AFL team to play in 1,000 games.
- The Patriots ended a 10-year streak of finishing in the top 10 for fewest points allowed (2012-2021) after finishing 11th in 2022 with 20.4 points allowed. The Patriots and Tampa Bay (1996-2005) are the last two teams to reach 10-straight seasons in the top 10 for fewest points allowed.
- The Patriots finished with a positive turnover ratio for 17-straight seasons (2006-22), the longest streak since the 1970 merger before the streak ended in 2023. Seattle is second with 13-straight seasons with a positive turnover ratio.
- The Patriots finished seventh in total defense in 2023. The Patriots have finished in the top 10 in defense 11 times since 2000.
- The Patriots played in their fifth international game when they faced Jacksonville in London on Oct. 20, 2024. It was their second-straight year with an international game after playing in Frankfurt, Germany in 2023. The Patriots played in London in 2009 and 2012 and in Mexico City in 2017. The five international games are tied for fourth all-time with Las Vegas, behind the 13 by Jacksonville, eight by Buffalo and seven by Miami.
- The Patriots went 19-straight seasons (2001-19) without being swept in a series by a division opponent, the longest such streak since the 1970 NFL merger.
- The Patriots are 115-8 all-time at Gillette Stadium in the regular season when leading at halftime.

## TEAM RECORD 9.8-YD RUSHING AVG.

The Patriots rushed for 246 yards on 25 carries for a 9.8-yard average vs. Buffalo (12/14), the team's highest rushing average in a game in team history. The previous record with a 7.9-yard average when they rushed 19 times for 151 yards on Oct. 6, 2024, vs. Miami.

## SEASON HIGH 246 YARDS RUSHING

The Patriots finished the game with a season-high 246 yards rushing vs. Buffalo (12/14). The previous high was 177 yards vs. Cleveland on Oct. 26. It is the first time the Patriots have rushed for 200 yards in a game since gaining 200 yards rushing vs. Indianapolis (12/1/24). The 246 yards rushing was the most since they rushed for 250 yards vs. Las Vegas (9/27/20).

## TWO FINISH WITH 10

S Jaylinn Hawkins (11) and CB Marcus Jones (10) both finished with at least 10 total tackles vs. Buffalo (12/14). The last time the Patriots had two players finish with at least 10 total tackles was on Jan. 7, 2024, vs. the NY Jets when LB Ja'Whaun Bentley (12) and DL Christian Barmore (10) both reached at least 10 tackles.

## TIE TEAM RECORD WITH 4 RUSH TDS

The Patriots tied a team record with 4 total rushing touchdowns vs. Buffalo (12/14). It is the 12th time they have scored 4 rushing touchdowns in a game and the first time since scoring 4 vs. Jacksonville on Jan. 2, 2021.

## PATRIOTS WON 10TH STRAIGHT GAME

The Patriots won 10 straight games, their sixth 10-game winning streak overall in regular season games.

## PATRIOTS FINISH WITH A 5-0 RECORD AGAINST NFC

The Patriots finished the season with a 5-0 record against the NFC after the win against the Giants. Since moving to a 17-game schedule in 2021, it is the first time the team has finished with a 5-0 record against the NFC. Overall, the Patriots have finished undefeated against NFC opponents in a season 11 times - 1972, 1974, 1977, 1994, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2010, 2019 and 2025.

## 10 STRAIGHT & 23 SCORED, 23-OR-LESS ALLOWED

With the 33-15 win vs. the New York Giants (12/1), New England became the first team in NFL history to win 10 consecutive games with at least 23 points scored and 23-or-less points allowed in each game. The 1961 Houston Oilers are second with nine straight such games.

## 100-YD RECEIVER IN FOUR STRAIGHT GAMES

The Patriots had four straight games with a 100-yard receiver: WR DeMario Douglas – 100 yards vs. Atlanta (11/2), WR Mack Hollins – 106 yards at Tampa Bay (11/9), WR Stefon Diggs – 105 yards vs. the New York Jets (11/13) and TE Hunter Henry -- 115 yards at the Bengals (11/23). It is the first time the team has had a 100-yard receiver in four straight games since the 2018 season:

## RALLY FROM 10-POINT DEFICIT FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2021

The Patriots' 26-20 victory at Cincinnati (11/23) marked the team's first win in a game where they trailed by 10-plus points since Oct. 10, 2021, at Houston, where they trailed 22-9 and won 25-22. At Cincinnati, New England trailed 10-0 in the second quarter before rallying back to win. The Patriots rallied from an 11-point fourth quarter deficit at Baltimore (12/21) with 15 fourth quarter points for a 28-24 win.

## FIRST PICK-6 SINCE 2022

CB Marcus Jones returned an interception 33 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter at Cincinnati (11/23), the Patriots' first interception returned for a touchdown since the 2022 season when S Kyle Dugger returned an interception 39 yards for a touchdown vs. Miami on Jan. 1, 2023.

## PATRIOTS IMPROVE TO A 7-0 ROAD RECORD

The win at Baltimore (12/21) improved the Patriots to a 7-0 road record. It is the third time in franchise history the team has started with a 7-0 road record. (listed below):

## PATRIOTS COMPLETE SERIES SWEEP OF NFC SOUTH

The Patriots completed a sweep of the NFC South with the 28-23 win over Tampa Bay (11/9), after 42-13 win vs. Carolina (9/28), a 25-19 win at New Orleans (10/12) and a 24-23 win vs. Atlanta (11/2).

## RECORD 50-YD REC. TD & 50-YD. RUSH TD

The Patriots recorded a 50-yard passing touchdown (72-yard pass from Drake Maye to Kyle Williams) and a 50-yard rushing touchdown (TreVeyon Henderson 55 and 69-yard runs) in the same game at Tampa Bay (11/9) for the first time since Sept. 21, 1997, when Curtis Martin rushed for a 70-yard touchdown and WR Troy Brown caught a 52-yard touchdown pass from QB Drew Bledsoe vs. Chicago.

## 100-YARD RUSHER & 100-YARD RECEIVER

The Patriots finished with a 100-yard rusher and a 100-yard receiver at Tampa Bay (11/9) after RB TreVeyon Henderson gained 147 yards rushing and WR Mack Hollins finished with 106 yards receiving. It is the 33rd time in team history that has happened and the first time since Oct. 9, 2022, vs. Detroit when RB Rhamondre Stevenson had 161 rushing yards and WR Jakobi Meyers had 111 receiving yards.

## TWO AND TWO OF 50

In the Patriots victory at Tampa Bay (11/9), the team had two 50-yard passes and two 50-yard touchdown runs. QB Drake Maye had a 72-yard touchdown pass to WR Kyle Williams and a 54-yard completion to WR Mack Hollins. RB TreVeyon Henderson had a 55-yard touchdown run and a 69-yard touchdown run. The Patriots and the Dolphins (in their 2023 blowout against the Broncos) are the only teams with multiple 50-yard rushes and catches in the same game this century.

## VRABEL WINS ROAD GAMES

Mike Vrabel became the third head coach in NFL history to win each of his first seven road games with a team and first since the Colts' Jim Caldwell in 2009.

## THREE-GAME ROAD TRIP, THREE WINS

The Patriots completed a three-game road trip with their fourth straight win with the 31-13 victory at Tennessee. The Patriots won the first two road games with a 23-20 win at Buffalo and a 25-19 win at New Orleans, and the victory over Tennessee marked the Patriots' third time winning all three games when playing three straight on the road in a single season. In 1961, the Patriots won their final three games on the road and then in 1985, the Patriots won three straight postseason games played on the road en route to their first Super Bowl appearance. The Patriots have had 24 previous instances of three or more consecutive games on the road in a single season, including the postseason. The Patriots join the Rams (2018), Steelers (2020), Commanders (2020), Cowboys (2021) and Vikings (2024) as teams that have won all three games of a three-game road trip in the last ten years.

## PATRIOTS LIMITING RUNNING BACKS

The Patriots are the first team in NFL history since at least 1950 to hold a running back under 50 yards in the first nine games of the season. The Patriots streak ended after nine games when RB Sean Tucker gained 53 yards at Tampa Bay (11/9), one shy of the NFL record of 10 set by the 2020 Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

## PATRIOTS SCORE MOST POINTS SINCE 2021

The Patriots scored 42 points in the 42-13 win vs. Carolina (9/28), the most points since the 2021 season when the Patriots scored 50 points vs. Jacksonville on Jan. 2, 2022 in a 50-10 victory. The Patriots have scored at least 30 points four times in 2025.

## RETURNS UPON RETURNS

With CB Marcus Jones' 87-yard touchdown return vs. Carolina on Sept. 28 and 94-yard return for a touchdown vs. the New York Giants (12/1) and RB Antonio Gibson's 90-yard kickoff return for a touchdown at Miami on Sept. 14, it marks the fourth season that the Patriots have returned at least one punt and one kickoff for a touchdown in the same season. The Patriots have also returned both a punt and kick for a touchdown in 1980, 2010 and 2012. Gibson and Jones both earned AFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors for their performance.

## PATRIOTS CONVERT FOUR FOURTH DOWNS

The Patriots were 4-of-5 on fourth downs vs. Pittsburgh (9/21). The only times in team history they converted more was when they went 5-of-6 on fourth down vs. San Francisco (12/16/12) and 5-of-6 on fourth down vs. Buffalo (12/26/21).

## KICKOFF RETURN TD

RB Antonio Gibson returned a fourth quarter kick 90 yards for a touchdown at Miami (9/14), the Patriots first kickoff return for a touchdown since WR Jalen Reagor returned the opening kick 98 yards for a touchdown on Dec. 31, 2023 at Buffalo. It is the 29th kickoff return for a touchdown in team history.





# PATRIOTS 2025 TEAM NOTES

## UP TO 30

The Patriots scored over 30 points for the first time since a 38-15 win at Cleveland on Oct. 16, 2022 with the 33-27 win at Miami (9/14).

## GETTING TO THE QUARTERBACK

The Patriots had 4 sacks in the 2025 season-opener vs. Las Vegas (9/7) and followed that performance with 5 sacks against the Dolphins (9/14). The last time the Patriots had at least four sacks in back-to-back games was in 2022 with 9 sacks vs. Indianapolis (11/6) followed by 4 sacks vs. the N.Y. Jets (11/20).

## BACK TO BACK RETURNS

In the fourth quarter at Miami (9/14), Dolphins WR Malik Washington returned a punt 74 yards for a touchdown. And during the ensuing kick, RB Antonio Gibson had a 90-yard kickoff return for a touchdown. It marks the second time in NFL history there was a punt return touchdown immediately followed by a kick return for a touchdown: Sept. 13, 1992 – Atlanta at Washington.

## TWO ROOKIES ON THE LEFT

2025 first-round draft pick Will Campbell starts at left tackle and 2025 third-round draft pick Jared Wilson starts at left guard. The last team to open the season with rookies at left tackle and left guard was the 2016 Baltimore Ravens with T Ronnie Stanley (first-round) at left tackle and G Alex Lewis (fourth-round) at left guard.

## HEAD COACHING EXPERIENCE

Five of the Patriots 22 assistant coaches have a combined 20 years of head coaching experience at every level.

- **Offensive line coach Doug Marrone** was the head coach for Syracuse University (2009-12). In addition, Marrone was the head coach for the Buffalo Bills for two seasons (2013-14) and spent four total seasons as the head coach of the Jacksonville Jaguars (2017-2020).
- **Offensive coordinator Josh McDaniels** first became a head coach for the Denver Broncos (2009-10.) Later in his career, McDaniels coached the Las Vegas Raiders (2022-23).
- **Passing Game Coordinator and Tight Ends Coach Thomas Brown** spent time as the interim head coach of the Chicago Bears last season.
- **Assistant Offensive Line Coach Jason Houghtaling** was the head coach for Wagner (2015-19). Before making the jump to college, Houghtaling served as the head coach at Troy High School in Troy, N.Y. (2010).
- On the defensive side of the ball, **Senior Defensive Assistant Ben McAdoo** served as the head coach of the New York Giants (2016-17).

## 29 NEW PLAYERS IN 2025

Of the 52 players on the roster, 29 players were not on the 53-man roster last season, the most in the NFL.

## A DRAFTED P, K AND LS ON THE ROSTER

The Patriots are the only team in 2025 with a player they drafted at punter, kicker and long snapper on their current roster. **P Bryce Baringer** was drafted in the sixth-round of the 2023 NFL Draft, **K Andy Borregales** was drafted in the sixth-round of the 2025 NFL Draft, while **LS Julian Ashby** was drafted in the seventh-round of the 2025 NFL Draft. This century, the Patriots have had three seasons in which they played a kicker, punter AND long snapper who were all drafted by New England:

2023 (K Chad Ryland, P Bryce Baringer, LS Joe Cardona)  
2019 (K Stephen Gostkowski, P Jake Bailey, Cardona)  
2010 (Gostkowski, P Zoltan Mesko, LS Jake Ingram)

## TALE OF THE TWOS

The Patriots are one of four teams since 1970 that have had back-to-back head coaches that played for the team and then served as a head coach with Mike Vrabel following Jerod Mayo. They join Chicago, Jim Dolley and Abe Giron; Philadelphia, Jerry Williams and Ed Khayat; and Green Bay, Bart Starr and Forrest Gregg.

## NFL BLOOD

The 2025 New England Patriots have many familial ties in the NFL. Out of the 53 players currently on the roster, 10 have had family members who have spent time in the NFL. Below is a list of each of them:

### Drake Maye - Mark Maye (Tampa Bay Buccaneers, 1988)

Drake Maye's father, Mark Maye, was also a North Carolina quarterback, starting for the Tar Heels in 1986 and 1987. Undrafted in 1988, Maye signed with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, spending the season as a backup to Vinny Testaverde and Joe Ferguson.

### Stefon Diggs - Trevon Diggs (Dallas Cowboys)

Stefon Diggs' young brother, Trevon Diggs, has earned All-Pro and Pro Bowl honors as a cornerback with the Dallas Cowboys.

### Andy Borregales - José Borregales (Tampa Bay Buccaneers 2021-22)

Andy Borregales' brother, José, went undrafted in 2021 and signed with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

### Christian Gonzalez - David Blough (Cleveland Browns 2019\*, Detroit Lions 2019-21, Minnesota Vikings 2022\*, Arizona Cardinals 2022, Detroit Lions 2023\*)

David Blough, who is Gonzalez's brother-in-law, spent time in the NFL as a quarterback with four NFL teams across five seasons. He is now the assistant quarterbacks coach in Washington.

### Christian Elliss - Luther Elliss (Detroit Lions 1995-2003, Denver Broncos 2004), Kaden Elliss (New Orleans Saints 2019-22, Atlanta Falcons 2023-Present), Noah Elliss (Philadelphia Eagles 2022-24\*), Jonah Elliss (Denver Broncos 2024-Present)

Christian Elliss' father, Luther, was a first-round pick for the Detroit Lions in 1995, spending 10 seasons in the NFL. His older brother, Kaden, is a linebacker who emerged as a starter for the Atlanta Falcons in 2023. One of his younger brothers, Noah, went undrafted in 2022 and signed with the Philadelphia Eagles. His youngest brother, Jonah, is a linebacker who was selected in the third round of the 2024 NFL Draft by the Denver Broncos.

### John Saunders Jr. - Jaquan Brisker (Chicago Bears 2022-present)

John Saunders Jr.'s first cousin, is S Jaquan Brisker, a second-round draft pick of Chicago in the 2022 NFL Draft out of Penn State.

### Robert Spillane - Johnny Lattner (Pittsburgh Steelers 1954)

Robert Spillane's grandfather, Johnny Lattner, is one of the all-time college greats. He was selected in the first round of the 1954 NFL Draft by the Pittsburgh Steelers, making the Pro Bowl as a punt returner in his rookie season before joining the United States Air Force.

### Jahlani Tavai - J.R. Tavai (Tennessee Titans 2015-16), Jonah Tavai (Seattle Seahawks 2023\*), Justus Tavai (New England Patriots 2023\*)

Jahlani Tavai has three brothers who spent time in the NFL. J.R., his older brother, was signed by the Tennessee Titans as a rookie free agent in 2015. His younger brothers, Justus and Jonah, both went undrafted in 2023 and were signed as rookie free agents by the New England Patriots and Seattle Seahawks, respectively.

### Alex Austin - Willie McGinest (New England Patriots 1994-2005, Cleveland Browns 2006-08)

Austin's uncle, Willie McGinest, is a Patriots Hall of Famer and one of the key cogs from the team's 2000s dynasty. A top five Draft selection in 1994, McGinest spent 12 seasons in New England, winning three Super Bowls and being named to two Pro Bowls (1996, 2003) along the way.

### Joshua Dobbs - Parker Washington (Jacksonville Jaguars 2023-Present), Ashton Washington

Parker Washington, Joshua Dobbs' cousin, is a wide receiver for the Jacksonville Jaguars. Selected by the Jaguars in the sixth round of the 2023 NFL Draft out of Penn State, Washington's sister, Ashton, is the player personnel coordinator for the Chicago Bears.

### CEREBRAL AND VERSATILE

Vrabel exemplified positional versatility during his Patriots career by starting at both inside and outside linebacker, regularly lining up on offense in short-yardage and goal-line situations and continually making valuable contributions on various special teams units. As a Patriot, he caught eight regular season passes and two more in the playoffs. All 10 of his receptions were for touchdowns, including receptions in back-to-back Super Bowl wins over the Carolina Panthers in Super Bowl XXXVIII and Philadelphia Eagles in Super Bowl XXXIX.

### A PROVEN LEADER AND CHAMPION

**AS A PLAYER:** Vrabel's accomplishments as a player included three Super Bowl wins (2001, 2003 and 2004), one Pro Bowl selection (2007) and an All-Pro honor (2007). Originally drafted in the third round (91st overall) of the 1997 NFL Draft by the Pittsburgh Steelers, he spent the early years of his career mostly playing on special teams and as a reserve linebacker. He signed with the Patriots as an unheralded free agent in 2001 and went on to become one of the key pieces of the dynasty that captured three Super Bowl titles in four years. Vrabel ended his playing career with the Kansas City Chiefs after being a part of a trade that included QB Matt Cassel. He appeared in 206 NFL games and totaled 57 sacks, 722 tackles, 11 interceptions (one returned for a touchdown), 20 forced fumbles and 9 fumble recoveries. A cerebral and versatile athlete, he also saw action as a tight end and totaled 10 touchdown receptions. Additionally, his teams advanced to the playoffs eight times (20 postseason games), with Vrabel recording 8 postseason sacks and two additional postseason touchdown receptions.

**AS A COACH:** Vrabel has 14 years of coaching experience, including 11 years in the NFL and three seasons at Ohio State. The Tennessee Titans hired him as their head coach in 2018 and he led the Titans to two division titles and three playoff appearances during his six seasons at the helm. In 2019, the Titans upset the Patriots in Foxborough in the Wild Card round, then defeated the No. 1 seed Ravens in Baltimore the following week to advance to the AFC Championship Game, where they lost to the eventual Super Bowl Champion Kansas City Chiefs. In 2021, the Titans claimed the top seed in the AFC with a 12-5 record, earning Vrabel NFL Coach of the Year honors.

### SUPER BOWL DNA

**Mike Vrabel** is one of seven head coaches that won a Super Bowl for a team and then became the head coach of that team. The others are Jerod Mayo (Patriots), Forrest Gregg (Green Bay), Bart Starr (Green Bay), Art Shell (Oakland), Jeff Saturday (Indianapolis) and Jason Garrett (Dallas). Vrabel is the only one with three Super Bowl wins.

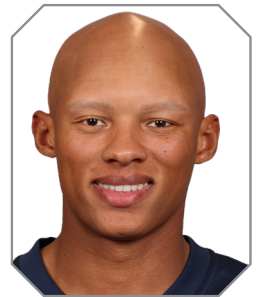

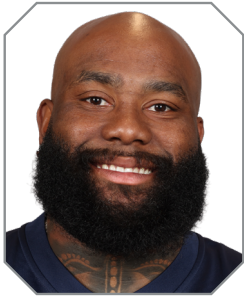

## FAMILY TIES

- While New England is all new for C Garrett Bradbury, an unlikely and largely unknown familial connection exists between himself and quarterback Drake Maye. Bradbury's brother-in-law, Jackson Kowar, a pitcher in the Mariners organization, played baseball and became close friends with Maye's brother, Cole, when they played together at the University of Florida. There are many challenges presented when it comes to free agency, but for Bradbury, it sure helped when family had one team in mind: "When I was going through the free agency process," Bradbury said, "They were all like, 'New England, New England, New England.'"

## FLAG ON THE PLAY

- When Bradbury joined the team, he was surprised to find that the offensive line did not spend very much time together outside of Gillette Stadium. Feeling it would be an important chemistry-building activity, Bradbury decided to bring the group together each Thursday to eat out for dinner. An unexpected side effect of this was the group's discovery of their love for Shirley Temples, a red non-alcoholic drink made with grenadine and either Sprite or ginger ale. Some nights, the offensive line room has ordered close to 70. Nonetheless, the bonding moments shared over the drinks have made their trust and connections stronger.



## GENERATIONS OF REBELS

- C Ben Brown comes from a rich history of Ole Miss football players, as he is the seventh member of his family to play for the school. Brown's father, Tim (1988-89); his maternal grandfather, Bobby (1962-64); paternal grandfather, Allen (1962-64); great uncle, Jerry (1959-61); father's cousin, Alton (1971-72); and uncle, Burkes (1991-92) all played for the Rebels. As a tight end, Allen was a First-Team All-American in college and a two-time Super Bowl Champion for the Green Bay Packers.

## COAST TO COAST

- Brown was signed by New England to the 53-man roster from the Las Vegas practice squad on Oct. 10, 2024. He took a red-eye flight across the country and made his first start for the Patriots when the team hosted the Houston Texans (10/13) just three days later.



## ROOKIE AND THE VETS

- WR Efton Chism III is developing a work ethic by following his veteran wide receivers. Wide receivers coach Todd Downing recently addressed his thoughts on Chism's work ethic: "It starts well before he ever hits the field," Downing said. "This guy's one of the first guys in. A lot of times he'll pop into my office super early in the morning, as I'm just getting going, and he wants to sit there and just watch me build the PowerPoint for the meeting that day or something. Just to kind of get an extra time or an extra rep, the mental processing for the system. He stays late with Mack (Hollins) and goes through things with Mack, and those two have developed a cool relationship, so that piece of it's cool, and then what he does on the field is he translates that into playing fast and confident. He knows exactly what to do, so then he can go out and execute it."

### DIGGS REACHES 11,000 RECEIVING YARDS

- On the first offensive play of the game for the Patriots at Tampa Bay (11/9/25), Diggs caught a 9-yard pass from QB Drake Maye, putting him over 11,000 receiving yards in his career. He is the 25th player in NFL history to reach that mark in 11 seasons or fewer.

### DIGGS BECOMES 29TH PLAYER TO REACH 900 RECEPTIONS

- Diggs became the 29th NFL player to reach 900 career receptions on his 11-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter vs. Atlanta (11/2). Diggs reached the milestone in his 153rd career game, tied with Julio Jones for the fifth-fewest games to reach 900 career receptions.

## #11 JOSHUA DOBBS



### THE PASSTRONAUT

- QB Joshua Dobbs graduated with a degree in aerospace engineering from Tennessee and has since combined his love for football and space, coining the nickname, "The Passtronaut." Through the NFLPA's virtual externship program, Dobbs spent two years (2020-21) with the NASA Kennedy Space Flight Center. In 2022, Dobbs established The ASTROrdinary Dobbs Foundation, which is dedicated to supporting, encouraging and inspiring all members of the community, particularly the youth, through educational, economical, professional and recreational empowerment.
- "We're promoting my background growing up, which was in STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics), aerospace and aviation," Dobbs said. "So, we love giving back to the community itself, who supported me throughout my career, but also just promoting STEM engagement, giving back to those less fortunate and just being involved. It's very important to me to support those communities and to be able to represent my own foundation. It's really cool. As I said, just having the platform, being able to give back."

## #3 DEMARIO DOUGLAS



### THE MEANING BEHIND THE NICKNAME

- DeMario Douglas is more commonly referred to by his nickname, "Pop". Although the nickname is fitting for his quickness on the field, the name actually comes from family ties. Douglas' granddad passed away on his first birthday. The wide receiver was commonly referred to as 'Poppa' from his granddad – a nickname that was quickly shortened to just 'Pop'.

### NUMBER CHANGE

- Pop Douglas changed his jersey number from No. 81 to No. 3 in 2024. He wore No. 3 in college at Liberty, as well as in Little League, middle school and high school. He explained its meaning to him: "It's big because I was raised by three strong ladies -- my mom, grandma and great-grandma," he said.

### ROOKIE RECEIVING RECORDS

- Douglas finished the 2023 season with 49 receptions for a team-leading 561 yards. He has the most receptions and receiving yards by a Patriots rookie wide receiver since 2000.

## DOUGLAS HAS FIRST-CAREER TOUCHDOWN

- Douglas scored his first-career touchdown on a 35-yard touchdown pass from QB Drake Maye in the fourth quarter vs. Houston (10/13/24).

## DOUGLAS HAS CAREER-HIGH IN RECEIVING YARDS

- Douglas finished the game with a career-high 100 yards receiving on 4 receptions vs. Atlanta (11/02/25). His previous high was 92 yards receiving vs. Houston on Oct. 13, 2024.



## FIRST PATRIOTS PLAYER WITH FOUR 50-YARD TDS

- RB TreVeyon Henderson scored on a 55-yard touchdown run in the third quarter and a 69-yard run in the fourth quarter at Tampa Bay (11/9/25) and became the first Patriots player to have two 50-yard touchdown runs in the same game. Henderson became the first Patriots player to have multiple games in a season with two 50-yard touchdown runs when he then scored on a 52-yard touchdown run in the second quarter and a 65-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter vs. Buffalo (12/14). He is only the second player in NFL history to have multiple games in a season with two rushing touchdowns of 50-plus yards, joining RB Chris Johnson in 2009 with Tennessee.

## HENDERSON HAS 4 50-YARD TOUCHDOWN RUNS

- Henderson has four touchdown runs of 50-plus yards in 2025. Chris Johnson (2009 with Tennessee) and Jim Brown (1963 with Cleveland) are the only players to have more touchdown runs of 50-plus yards in a single season with five. Henderson is tied for the third-most in NFL history. RB Saquon Barkley (2018 with the Giants and 2024 with Philadelphia), Jim Brown (1958 with Cleveland), Napoleon Kaufman (1997 with Oakland), Lenny Moore (1956 with Baltimore), Adrian Peterson (2012 with Minnesota), Barry Sanders (1997 with Detroit) and Spec Sanders (1947 with the NY Titans) also had four 50-yard rushing touchdowns in a season.

## FIRST PATRIOT WITH FOUR 50-YARD RUNS

- Henderson is the first Patriots player with four 50-yard runs in a season since 1970. Since 2000, the most 50-yard runs in a season is seven by Adrian Peterson in 2012 with Minnesota.

## HENDERSON 100-YARD GAMES

- Henderson had his first career 100-yard game at Tampa Bay (11/9/25), finishing with 147 yards on 14 carries. He had his second 100-yard game when he rushed for 148 yards vs. Buffalo (12/14/25).

## TWO GAMES WITH 10.0 RUSHING AVERAGE

- Henderson rushed for 147 yards on 10 carries for a 10.5-yard average at Tampa Bay (11/9/25). He rushed for 148 yards on 14 carries for a 10.6-yard average vs. Buffalo (12/14/25). Henderson has two of the team's eight games where a rusher finished with an average of at least 10.0 yards per carry and the only one to have two games with a 10.0-yard average in the same season. The only other Patriots player to have two games with a 10.0-yard average in their career with the team was Larry Garron (1961 and 1962).

## FOURTH ROOKIE WITH MULTIPLE 50-YD RUSHING TDS

- Henderson is the fourth rookie to record multiple 50-yard rushing touchdowns in a single game in NFL history, joining Doug Martin (Nov. 4, 2012 with Tampa Bay), Pro Football Hall of Famer Lenny Moore (Oct. 28, 1956 with the Baltimore Colts) and Adrian Peterson (Oct. 14, 2007 with Minnesota).

## HENDERSON TIES NFL ROOKIE RECORD

- Henderson's 4 rushing touchdowns of 50-plus yards in 2025 ties the NFL record for the most rushing touchdowns of 50-plus yards in a season by a rookie with RB Saquon Barkley (2018) and RB Lenny Moore (1956).



# PATRIOTS OFFENSIVE NOTES

## HENDERSON ACCOUNTED FOR 3 TOUCHDOWNS

- Henderson scored three total touchdowns with 2 rushing touchdowns and 1 receiving touchdown vs. the New York Jets (11/13/25). The only other Patriots rookie to account for three touchdowns in a regular season game was TE Rob Gronkowski when he had 3 receiving touchdowns at Pittsburgh on Nov. 14, 2010 (RB Sony Michel had three rushing touchdowns in a 2018 AFC Divisional Game). Henderson is the first Patriots player with 3 total touchdowns in a game since RB Damien Harris had 3 rushing touchdowns vs. Buffalo on Dec. 26, 2021. Henderson is the fourth player in franchise history to record 2 rushing touchdowns and 1 receiving touchdown in a single game. He joins RB Rex Burkhead (vs. Las Vegas - 9/27/20), Sam Cunningham (at Buffalo - 11/23/75) and Billy Lott (at Oakland - 12/9/61).

## HENDERSON NFL OFFENSIVE ROOKIE OF THE MONTH

- Henderson was named the Offensive Rookie of the Month for November by the National Football League. Henderson is the sixth Patriots player to win a rookie of the month honor and the third offensive player to earn the award. Henderson joins CB Christian Gonzalez (September 2023), QB Mac Jones (November 2021), DE Chandler Jones (September 2012), LB Jerod Mayo (October 2008) and WR Deion Branch (September 2002).



## WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2025

- TE Hunter Henry (251) became the fifth Patriots tight end to reach 200 career receptions in the 2025 season-opener vs. Las Vegas and now ranks third in team history. He is fourth in receiving yards with 2,868 and fourth with 25 touchdown receptions. He needs 132 receiving yards to join Rob Gronkowski (7,861), Ben Coates (5,471) and Russ Francis (3,157) as the fourth Patriots tight end to reach 3,000 receiving yards. He had 2 touchdowns vs. Pittsburgh (9/21/25) and is one of five Patriots tight ends with at least 20 touchdowns with 25.
- Henry led the Patriots with 66 receptions in 2024. If he leads the team in receptions in 2025, he will become the second New England tight end to lead the team in receptions in consecutive seasons, joining Ben Coates (1993-95, 1997-98).

## NOTES OF INTEREST

- Henry has logged 40-plus receptions in all five seasons with the Patriots (46 rec. in 2025), the second-longest streak by a Patriots tight end all-time (Ben Coates, six).
- Henry set career-highs in 2024 with 66 receptions and 674 yards. His previous bests were 60 receptions in 2020 and 652 yards in 2019.

## HENRY BECOMES FIFTH TO REACH 20

- Henry caught a 5-yard touchdown pass from QB Drake Maye in the second quarter vs. Pittsburgh (9/21/25) to become the fifth Patriots tight end with at least 20 touchdown receptions. He now has 25 touchdowns as a member of the Patriots.

## HENRY BECOMES FIFTH TO REACH 200

- Henry caught a 27-yard pass from QB Drake Maye in the first quarter vs. Las Vegas (9/7/25) for his 200th reception as a member of the Patriots, becoming the fifth New England tight end to reach 200 receptions.
- Henry caught 8 passes against Pittsburgh (9/21/25) to move past Russ Francis and Marv Cook into third place among all New England tight ends in receptions.

## HENRY SCORES THREE LONGEST TD PASSES OF HIS CAREER

- Henry scored on a 31-yard touchdown pass from QB Bailey Zappe in the third quarter at Cleveland on Oct. 16, 2022, and had a 37-yard touchdown from Mac Jones at Minnesota in the third quarter on Nov. 24, 2022, the longest touchdown reception of his career. He also added a 31-yard scoring pass from QB Drake Maye vs. Carolina on Sept. 28, 2025.

## AMONG THE LEADERS

- Since entering the league in 2016, Henry is fifth in receiving touchdowns among all tight ends in the NFL with 46. He also ranks sixth in career receiving yards with 5,190 and sixth in receptions with 447. He joins teammate Austin Hooper on those lists, as Hooper ranks eighth in receptions (427), ninth in receiving yards (4,425) and tied for 10th with 29 touchdowns.

### HUNTER HENRY TIED CAREER HIGH

- Henry finished the game with 8 receptions for 90 yards vs. Pittsburgh (9/21/25). The 8 receptions tied his career-high, a mark he has reached three other times in his career – 8 receptions at Jacksonville (10/20/24), vs. Seattle (9/15/24) and vs. Pittsburgh (10/13/19).

### HENRY ACCOUNTED FOR SEVEN FIRST DOWNS

- Henry recorded a career-high 7 receptions for a first down against Seattle (9/15/24). His previous career-high was 6 receptions for a first down, which he accomplished three times, the last being at Indianapolis on Dec. 18, 2021



### BAREFOOT DREAMING

- Unless it's gametime, WR Mack Hollins is walking around barefoot. In his early playing years with the Philadelphia Eagles, Hollins met some trainers from Melbourne Muscular Therapy from Australia, whose philosophy is to be barefoot and get back to your original ways of movement. Hollins flew them out, and although he was hesitant at first, they convinced him that doing all of his training barefoot can help with durability. In the last few years, Hollins has completely abandoned shoes and now walks barefoot all the time, unless it is under 35 degrees.



### HOMELESS TO HOUSE CALLS

- RB Terrell Jennings didn't have it easy growing up. He faced homelessness as a junior in high school and lived with his grandmother while playing youth football with and against his current teammate, DeMario Douglas, in the Jacksonville area. He began to flourish after one of his godparents took him in during his senior year, setting him on a path to college and the NFL. In high school, Douglas and Jennings were teammates and helped lead Mandarin High School in Jacksonville to the state championship.



### WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2025

- T Vederian Lowe scored his first career touchdown on a 4-yard reception from QB Drake Maye vs. the Los Angeles Rams on Nov. 17, 2024. If he has a touchdown reception in 2025, he will be the first Patriots offensive lineman with more than one reception and touchdown reception in his career.

### LOWE SCORES ON A 4-YARD TOUCHDOWN PASS

- Lowe reported as an eligible receiver and caught a 4-yard touchdown pass from QB Drake Maye in the fourth quarter vs. the L.A. Rams on Nov. 17, 2024. Lowe is the fourth Patriots offensive lineman to catch a touchdown pass and first since T Nate Solder caught a 16-yard touchdown pass from QB Tom Brady in the third quarter of the 2014 AFC Championship game vs. Indianapolis on Jan. 18, 2015. T Tom Ashworth caught a 1-yard touchdown pass from QB Tom Brady in the first quarter on Dec. 17, 2005, vs. Tampa Bay. C Pete Brock caught a 6-yard touchdown pass from QB Steve Grogan in the fourth quarter at the New York Jets on Nov. 21, 1976. It was the 10th time that a Patriots offensive lineman caught a pass in a game.

## WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2025

- QB Drake Maye moved into the Top-10 on the New England all-time passing list and now ranks 8th with 6,223 yards.
- Maye has a team-best 69.0 career completion percentage.
- As a rookie in 2024, Maye finished with 54 rushing attempts for 421 yards and a 7.80-yard average, the sixth-highest in NFL history for a quarterback with at least 50 rushing attempts. Maye will look to add to his rushing average in his second NFL season. Former Philadelphia QB Randall Cunningham set the NFL record for a quarterback with a 7.84-yard rushing average in his first two NFL seasons (1985-86 – 95 rushing attempts for 745 yards).
- Maye had a 75-plus completion percentage and threw at least 2 touchdown passes in three consecutive games in 2025. Only Tom Brady has had a longer streak in a single season in NFL history. Brady accomplished the feat during a four-game streak in 2007.

## MAYE REACHES 3,000 PASSING YARDS

- Maye entered Week 12 of 2025 first in the NFL with 2,836 passing yards and needed 164 yards passing at Cincinnati (11/23/25) for his first career 3,000-yard season. He reached the milestone in the third quarter, and after his 294 passing yards against the Bengals, he now has 3,947 passing yards for the year.

## MAYE SETS CAREER HIGH IN PASSING YARDS

- Maye threw for a career-high 380 yards at Baltimore (12/21 on Sunday Night Football for his first 300-yard game. His previous best was 294 yards at Cincinnati (11/23/25).

## MAYE THROWS LONGEST PASS OF HIS CAREER

- Maye completed a career-best 72-yard touchdown pass to WR Kyle Williams in the first quarter at Tampa Bay (11/9/25). His previous best was a 58-yard reception to WR DeMario Douglas in the second quarter vs. Atlanta (11/2/25). His longest touchdown pass prior to the one to Williams was a 53-yard touchdown pass to Douglas at New Orleans (10/12/25).

## MAYE HAS FIRST GAME WITH TWO 50-YARD PASSES

- Maye had a 72-yard pass to WR Kyle Williams in the second quarter and a 54-yard pass to WR Mack Hollins in the fourth quarter at Tampa Bay (11/9/25). He is the first Patriots quarterback with at least two 50-yard passes in a game since Tom Brady had a 52-yard pass to WR Brandin Cooks and a 64-yard touchdown pass to Cooks at Oakland on Nov. 19, 2017 in a game played in Mexico City.

## EIGHT STRAIGHT GAMES WITH A 100-PLUS PASSER RATING

- Maye had eight straight games with a passer rating over 100.0 after finishing with a 102.5 passer rating in the win vs. Atlanta (11/02/25) to tie the team record. Tom Brady had streaks of eight games in both 2007 and 2010. The NFL record for a single season is 12 consecutive games by Rodgers in 2011.

## MAYE HAS 10 GAME WITH AT LEAST 2 TOUCHDOWNS

- Maye had his 10th game in 2025 with at least 2 touchdown passes at Baltimore (12/21/25). The Patriots record for most games with at least 2 touchdown passes in a single season is 14 by Tom Brady in 2007 and 2011. The NFL record is 15 by Peyton Manning (2013) and Dan Marino (1984).

## MORE MAYE PASSING STREAKS

- Maye became the first player under the age of 24 and fourth player in NFL history to record at least 200 passing yards and a passer rating of 100-or-higher in eight consecutive games after finishing with 259 yards and a passer rating of 102.5 against Atlanta (11/2/25). He joined Aaron Rodgers (12 consecutive games in 2011 and eight in 2020), Tom Brady (eight in 2007) and Pro Football Hall of Famer Peyton Manning (eight in 2004).

## AT LEAST 80 PCT. OF HIS PASSES FOR THIRD TIME IN 2025

- Maye now has three games in 2025 with an 80 percent pass completion percentage: at Miami (9/14), vs. Carolina (9/28) and at Tennessee (10/19). He is the first New England quarterback with three games in a season with an 80 percent completion percentage.

## MAYE MOVES INTO 8TH PLACE ON TEAM PASSING LIST

- Maye moved into 8th place on New England's all-time passing list and now has 6,223 passing yards.

## FIFTH GAME WITH 80% COMPLETION PERCENTAGE

- Maye had his fifth NFL game with an 80% completion percentage after finishing with a team record 91.3 completion percentage at Tennessee (10/19/25) when he completed 21-of-23 passes. Maye is the first player in NFL history with five games with a completion percentage of 80-or-higher (minimum 15 attempts per game) in his first two career seasons.

## PRO BOWL

- Maye was added to the Pro Bowl roster to cap his rookie season. Maye is the sixth Patriots player to be selected to the Pro Bowl as a rookie, joining Mike Haynes (1976), John Stephens (1988), Curtis Martin (1995), Devin McCourty (2010) and Mac Jones (2021).

## THE MAYE WAY

- Maye, the youngest of four boys, hails from a family of athletes. His father, Mark, also played quarterback at the University of North Carolina from 1983-1988. His brother, Luke, played basketball at North Carolina (2015-19), winning a national title in 2017 with the Tar Heels. Luke now plays overseas in Japan. His brother, Cole, won a baseball national championship in 2017 with the University of Florida as a pitcher. His brother, Beau, also played basketball at the University of North Carolina. Despite the rich tradition of family athleticism, Drake Maye, measuring at 6'4, is the shortest of the four brothers (Luke at 6'8; Cole at 6'7; Beau at 6'8).

## MAYE FINISHED WITH 95 YARDS RUSHING

- Maye finished the game at Tennessee (11/3/24) with 95 yards rushing. It is the fourth time in team history a New England quarterback reached at least 90 yards rushing in a game and the first time since Steve Grogan had 103 yards rushing vs. the New York Jets on Oct. 18, 1976. Maye's 95 yards are the third-most in team history. Maye had 8 rushing attempts for 95 yards for a 11.9-yard average.

## BEST TWO-GAME RUSHING TOTAL BY A PATS QB

- Maye followed a 46-yard rushing performance vs. the New York Jets (10/27/24) with a 95-yard rushing performance at Tennessee (11/3/24) for 141 total yards. It is the best two-game rushing total by a Patriots quarterback, besting the 132 rushing yards by QB Steve Grogan in 1976 with 103 rushing yards vs. the New York Jets (10/18) followed by 29 yards rushing at Buffalo (10/24).



# PATRIOTS OFFENSIVE NOTES

## MAYE-KING HISTORY

- Since 1950, Drake Maye and Dan Marino are the only quarterbacks with at least 500 passing yards and at least 5 touchdown passes in their first two starts. Maye threw for 243 yards and 3 touchdowns in his first career start vs. Houston (10/13/24) and 276 yards and 2 touchdowns last week at Jacksonville (10/20/24).

## FIFTH TIME A PATRIOTS QB HAS A 40-YARD RUN IN A GAME

- Maye had a 41-yard run in the first quarter vs. Indianapolis on Dec. 1, 2024. The run is tied for the third-longest run by a Patriots quarterback and it is the fifth time a Patriots quarterback had a 40-yard run in a game. It is the longest run by a Patriots quarterback since QB Cam Newton had a 49-yard run vs. the New York Jets on Jan. 3, 2021.

## MAYE HAS SECOND-STRAIGHT GAME WITH 80%

- Maye had his second-straight game completing 80% of his passes after finishing 19-of-23 for 202 yards for an 82.6% completion percentage at Arizona (12/15/24). In Week 13 vs. Indianapolis (12/1/24), he finished 24-of-30 for 238 yards for an 80% completion percentage. The only other Patriots quarterback to ever have back-to-back games with an 80 percent completion percentage was QB Mac Jones in 2021 (11/14) at Cleveland with an 82.6 completion percentage and at Atlanta (11/18) with an 84.6 completion percentage.

## MAYE RUSHES FOR SIXTH-HIGHEST MARK

- Maye finished the season with 54 rushing attempts for 421 yards for a 7.8-yard average, the sixth-highest in a season by a quarterback with at least 50 rushing attempts.

## NOTES OF INTEREST

- RB Rhamondre Stevenson recorded his first 1,000-yard rushing season with a career-high 1,040 rushing yards in 2022. He can become the third New England player to reach at least two 1,000-yard rushing seasons, joining Curtis Martin (3) and Jim Nance (2).
- Stevenson led the team in receptions in 2022 with 69 receptions. He can join Tony Collins (1985 and 1987) as the only New England running backs to lead the team in receptions in two seasons.
- Stevenson moved into sixth place in team history with 3,491 rushing yards.
- Stevenson is the first player in franchise history with 700-plus scrimmage yards in each of his first four seasons: 729 in 2021, 1,461 in 2022, 857 in 2023 and 969 in 2024. Curtis Martin, John Stephens and Tony Collins are the Patriots that had 700+ scrimmage yards in each of their first three NFL seasons. He has 673 scrimmage yards so far in 2025.

## CAREER-LONG RECEPTION

- Stevenson caught a 55-yard reception from QB Drake Maye in the third quarter at Miami (9/14/25), the longest reception of his career. His previous best was a 41-yard reception from QB Mac Jones on Nov. 7, 2021 at Carolina. It is the longest reception by a Patriots running back since RB James White had a 59-yard reception vs. Cleveland on Nov. 27, 2019.

## CAREER-HIGH IN RECEIVING YARDS

- Stevenson set a career-high in receiving yards with 88 yards at Miami (9/14/25). His previous high was 76 yards receiving at Minnesota on Nov. 24, 2022.

## DEDICATION TO HIS GOALS

- While in high school, Stevenson started gaining attention for the impressive stats he posted as a junior. Unfortunately, due to his grades, Stevenson was academically ineligible to receive a football scholarship despite being recruited. Following his senior year of high school, Stevenson took a year off from football and worked part-time jobs at Walmart and Jimmy John's. But after a year away, he decided to follow a group of his friends and enroll in Cerritos Community College. During his time at Cerritos, he shared a two-bedroom apartment with up to six other guys at times and rode his bicycle 20 minutes to and from practice every day. After putting up monster stats in his second season at Cerritos, he committed to Oklahoma. Oklahoma led him to the 2021 NFL Draft where in the fourth round on the third day the Patriots selected Stevenson. In addition, he worked on his academics and made the Dean's List while at Oklahoma.

## STEVENSON HAD CAREER LONG RUN

- Stevenson had a career-long 64-yard touchdown run in the second quarter vs. Washington on Nov. 5, 2023. His previous long was a 49-yard run vs. Detroit on Oct. 9, 2022, and his previous longest touchdown run was a 34-yard touchdown run at Las Vegas on Dec. 18, 2022.

## STEVENSON HAS FIFTH CAREER 100-YARD GAME

- Stevenson had his fifth 100-yard game in the 2024 season-opener with 120 yards in the win vs. Cincinnati on Sept. 8. He had a career-high 172 yards rushing at Las Vegas on Dec. 18, 2022. It was his second 100-yard game of the year and fourth overall. He has two 100-yard games of 160 or more yards. In addition to the 172, he had 161 yards rushing vs. Detroit on Oct. 9, 2022. He has two of the teams 14 games with at least 160 yards rushing. Only Curtis Martin and Jim Nance with three have more.

## STEVENSON HAS THIRD GAME WITH 9.0 AVERAGE

- Stevenson finished with nine carries for 87 yards for a 9.7-yard average vs. Washington on Nov. 5, 2023, the highest average of his career and the third time he had at least a 9.0-yard average. He had a 9.1-yard average at Las Vegas on Dec. 18, 2022 and a 9.0-yard average at Buffalo on Jan. 8, 2023.



## CITY OF ANGELS TO TITLE TOWN

- As part of the Patriots' rookie development program, Head Coach Mike Vrabel brought the 2025 rookie class to a Red Sox game and to the Celtics' practice facility. WR Kyle Williams, a Los Angeles native, quickly recognized the passion for sports in his new city of Boston and uses it as motivation: "It's huge," Williams said. "You see Patriots everywhere. You see Celtics everywhere. Just seeing the love this town has for sports, it makes you want to give back and compete harder."

## ROOKIE SCORES FIRST NFL TD ON A 72-YARD PASS

- Williams scored his first career touchdown on a 72-yard touchdown pass from QB Drake Maye at Tampa Bay (11/9/25). It was the longest pass play for New England since QB Mac Jones threw a 75-yard touchdown pass to WR Kendrick Bourne vs. Dallas on Oct. 17, 2021.





## JOURNEY TO THE NFL

- As a high school sophomore, football wasn't on Christian Barmore's radar. Barmore played basketball in high school until his junior year, when the football coach at Delaware Valley Charter High School convinced him to give football a chance. Moving to Neumann Goretti High School as a senior after his previous high school closed, Barmore became a highly-recruited prospect in just his second season of organized football, committing to the University of Alabama. Additionally, Barmore has faced plenty of adversity in his life, including the process of overcoming blood clots to return to the field in 2024. ## PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAMER RICHARD SEYMOUR SEES GREATNESS AHEAD FOR CHRISTIAN BARMORE

- For a defensive lineman, if Patriots and Pro Football Hall of Famer Richard Seymour is in your corner, there are few better compliments or endorsements.
- "I think he has a ton of ability, natural ability, and he plays hard," Seymour told the Boston Herald. "I think he's going to be a problem for (opposing teams) for a long time to come. Hopefully he stays healthy and continues on the path he's on. I think he has a really bright future."

## SECOND-MOST QUARTERBACK PRESSURES

- Barmore posted the second-most quarterback pressures for a first-year defensive tackle since 2006, according to Pro Football Focus. His 48 pressures in 2021 were two more than Aaron Donald had during his rookie season.

## FIRST CAREER 3-SACK GAME

- Barmore finished with his first career 3-sack game, all in the third quarter, at Denver on Dec. 24, 2023. He had two 8-yard sacks and one 9-yard sack of Denver QB Russell Wilson. He increased his 2023 total to 8½ sacks. He is the first Patriots player with a 3-sack game since LB Joshua Uche had a 3-sack game at Arizona on Dec. 12, 2022. The last defensive lineman with a 3-sack game for New England was Deatrich Wise Jr. on Sept. 25, 2022 vs. Baltimore.



## LOVE BEYOND BLOOD

- LB Christian Elliss has six adopted siblings. For the NFL's My Cause My Cleats initiative, Elliss represented "An Act of Love," the agency that his siblings were adopted through. Elliss has two kids of his own with one on the way, and he and his wife look forward to adopting a child one day as well.

## RUNS IN THE FAMILY

- Elliss has two brothers that also play linebacker in the NFL: Jonah (Denver Broncos) and Kaden (Atlanta Falcons). Another one of his brothers, Noah, played for the Philadelphia Eagles. His father, Luther, was a first-round draft pick by the Detroit Lions in 1995. As a defensive lineman, he was a two-time Pro Bowler in nine seasons with Detroit and Denver. He is currently the defensive tackles coach at the University of Utah where Christian's younger brother, Elijah, plays defensive end.

## ELLISS HAS CAREER-HIGH IN TACKLES

- Elliss set a single-game career high vs. Buffalo on Jan. 5, 2025, with a team-leading 13 total tackles. His previous high was 9 tackles at the Jacksonville Jaguars on Oct. 20, 2024, and vs. the New York Jets on Oct. 27, 2024. Elliss' tackle total was the highest of the 2024 season for any Patriots player. LB Ja'Whaun Bentley had 12 total tackles at Cincinnati on Sept. 8, 2024.

## ELLISS HAD A CAREER-HIGH 4 SPECIAL TEAMS TACKLES

- Elliss finished with a career-high 4 total special teams tackles vs. the N.Y. Giants (12/1/25) and finished tied with S Craig Woodson with 6 total tackles on defense. It is the most special teams tackles in a game for a Patriots player since DB Cody Davis had 4 special teams tackles vs. the New York Jets on Oct. 24, 2021. Elliss now has three games in 2025 with at least three special teams tackles. He had 3 at Miami (9/14) and 3 vs. Atlanta (11/2). Elliss has a career-high 15 special teams tackles. His previous high was 8 special teams tackles in 2024.



## DR. GIBBY

- LB Jack Gibbens revealed the nickname given to him by Mike Vrabel when the two were together at Tennessee. According to Gibbens, Vrabel has called him "Dr. Gibby" ever since his rookie season. This nickname came about as a result of Gibbens answering questions correctly while the coach was quizzing the team: "I had to tell him I didn't study medicine...He had to tell me it was a joke," Gibbens said.

## GIBBENS REACHES DOUBLE DIGIT SPECIAL TEAMS TACKLES

- Gibbens reached double-digit special teams tackles for the first time in his career. With Gibbens (10 special teams tackles), Brenden Schooler (14), Christian Elliss (15) and Marte Mapu (10), it is the first time since the 2011 season that the Patriots have had at least four players reach double-digit special teams tackles.





# PATRIOTS DEFENSIVE NOTES



## GONZALEZ EARNS 2ND TEAM ALL-PRO HONORS

- CB Christian Gonzalez earned second-team Associated Press All-Pro Honors for his 2024 season.

## ROOKIE OF THE MONTH

- Gonzalez was named the Defensive Rookie of the Month for September by the National Football League, becoming the fifth Patriots player to win a rookie of the month honor and the third defensive player to earn the award. Gonzalez joins QB Mac Jones (November of 2021), DE Chandler Jones (September of 2012), LB Jerod Mayo (October of 2008) and WR Deion Branch (September of 2002).

## GONZO'S JOURNEY

- Before his collegiate success, even the prospect of going to college seemed out of reach for Gonzalez. He didn't want his family to have to pay his college tuition, and as a sophomore, he was a backup quarterback on his high school's junior varsity team that went 1-9. He almost gave up the sport, but after his family's encouragement and transferring schools, Gonzalez's new coaches switched him to defense, and he quickly attracted the attention of colleges around the nation.
- To understand the athleticism of Christian Gonzalez, look no further than his family. His father, Hector, played basketball at UTEP and professionally overseas. Gonzalez's two older sisters were both on the Colombian National Team for track & field and were college All-Americans. His eldest sister competed in the 2020 Olympics, and his younger sister is a rising star in soccer.

## PATRIOTS SCORE ON DEFENSE FOR FIRST TIME IN 2024

- The Patriots scored on defense for the first time in 2024 at Miami (11/24) when CB Christian Gonzalez returned a RB Jaylen Wright fumble 63 yards for a touchdown that was forced by S Marte Mapu. It was the Patriots first fumble returned for a touchdown since LB Raekwon McMillan returned a fumble for a 23-yard touchdown at Arizona on Dec. 12, 2022. It was Gonzalez's first NFL touchdown. The fumble return is tied for the third-longest in team history.

## FRANCHISE RECORD IN DEBUT

- LB Harold Landry III was credited with 2½ sacks, his seventh multiple sack game, vs. Las Vegas (9/7) in the season-opener. It is the most sacks by a New England player in his debut. It is second to his career-high 3 sacks at Miami on Dec. 11, 2023, with Tennessee. His last multi-sack game was vs. the N.Y. Jets on Sept. 15, 2024, when he had 2 sacks.

## LANDRY III RECORDS MOST SACKS IN FIRST TWO GAMES

- Landry III finished with 1 sack in New England's win at Miami (9/14/25). He had 3½ sacks in his first two game, the most by any Patriots player in their first two games with the team. He previously had 2½ sacks vs. Las Vegas on Sept. 7, 2025. The previous record was set by DL Chris Slade in 1993, with 3 sacks in his first two games with the team.

## SPILLANE REGISTERS 15 TOTAL TACKLES

- LB Robert Spillane had his 19th career 10-tackle game after finishing with 15 total tackles vs. Pittsburgh (9/21). His 15 total tackles are the second most of his career. He had a career-high 16 total tackles in the last game of the 2024 season vs. the L.A. Chargers (1/5/25) when he played for Las Vegas. He has four 10-plus tackle games in 2025 and has 22 career 10-tackle games in his career.

## A REUNION WITH MEANING

- Spillane was originally signed by Tennessee as a rookie free agent out of Western Michigan, the first year Mike Vrabel was head coach of the Titans. In 2025, he reunited with the coach that took a chance on him and made his dream a reality, this time in New England. The day Spillane signed with the team in Tennessee, it was Mother's Day. On the day Spillane signed his contract in New England, it was his mother's birthday.
- "I got hired in 2018 on Mother's Day, and I got to call my mom in tears saying, 'I'm going to be a professional football player,' Spillane said. '[May 13] is her birthday, so I'm signing the contract on her birthday. She's a very important special woman in my life, and I just want to make her proud."



# PATRIOTS DEFENSIVE NOTES

## UNDRAFTED TO TOP OF THE LEAGUE

- Spillane has recorded over 100 tackles in each of his last two seasons with the Las Vegas Raiders: 158 in 2024 and 148 in 2023. His 158 tackles in 2024 set a Raiders single-season record and ranked third in the NFL. In 2023, Spillane became the only Raiders player to record 100-plus tackles, 3.0-plus sacks and 3-plus interceptions in a single season since 1987. Since the beginning of the 2022 season, Spillane has tallied 480 tackles, the second-most in the NFL among undrafted defenders since 2022. to TJ Edwards (485).

## THE WHY BEHIND THE NUMBER

- Spillane is the grandson of RB Johnny Lattner, the 1953 Heisman Trophy winner. Lattner secured the award in his senior season at Notre Dame, after he rushed for 651 yards (4.9-yard average) and 9 touchdowns, in addition to catching 14 passes for 204 yards. He had 2 touchdowns off of just 10 kickoff returns and saw some action on defense, recording 4 interceptions in the Irish's 9-0-1 campaign. Notre Dame finished second in the AP Poll in 1953 behind Maryland. Lattner played one season in the NFL with Pittsburgh after he was selected seventh overall in the 1954 NFL Draft. Spillane wears No. 14 to honor Lattner, who wore No. 14 at Notre Dame.

## EYES CLOSED, OPEN MIND

- During his introductory press conference as a Patriots player, Spillane mentioned that he does a lot of "eyes-closed training." Later on, he explained exactly what "eyes-closed training" meant and how it helps him in football. Spillane explained that he developed a style of training where he scouts out an area, whether that be a mountain trail or in a forest, walks it, returns to walk it with his eyes shut, then returns again to walk it backward with his eyes shut. When asked how this training came about, Spillane told the Athletic, *"I didn't really learn it from anybody, so it's from the ground up, self-taught,"* Spillane said. *"It's basically just a confidence drill. As a middle linebacker, you want to know where you are on the field at all times — within the positioning of the field, understanding the schematics, where the other players are around you. So, you close your eyes and take away the most basic thing you use to understand that. You've really got to rely on your instincts and your trust."*



## TWO STRAIGHT 100-TACKLE SEASONS

- LB Jahlani Tavai has registered 100-total tackles in each of the last two seasons with 107 tackles in 2023 and a career-high 109 total tackles in 2024.

## ASK AND JAHLANI RECEIVED

- Tavai starred in high school as a nose guard. He was undersized and did not attract the attention of many colleges. But after finding out one of the English teachers at his high school was the son of then-Hawaii coach Norm Chow, he reached out to the teacher, Cameron Chow, and asked if Cameron could tell his dad to scout his tape. Cameron followed up and passed along Jahlani's tape to his dad, and the very next day, Jahlani had a scholarship offer. According to Jahlani, his football career would have been over after high school if it wasn't for this connection.

## ONE AND ONLY

- Tavai is the only NFL player within the last decade to play at least 70% of the snaps on offense or defense and 70% of the snaps on special teams, a feat he accomplished in 2023. Among 252 players that played at least 40 percent of his team's special teams snaps in 2024, Tavai and Minnesota S Josh Metellus are the only players to have also played 80 percent of his team's defensive snaps.

## TAVAI SETS CAREER HIGH IN TACKLES

- DT Milton Williams finished with 2 sacks at Miami (9/14/25), including a 9-yard sack on fourth down with 53 seconds to play to seal the New England win. It is his second career 2-sack game. He also had 2 sacks at the L.A. Rams as a member of the Philadelphia Eagles (11/24/24).

## WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2025

- P Bryce Baringer has a team record 47.9-yard punting average and will attempt to keep that pace.

## 30 AND 30

- Baringer led the NFL and set a team record in 2023 with 38 punts inside the 20-yard line. Baringer became the second Patriots punter with back-to-back seasons with at least 30 punts inside the 20-yard line after finishing with 31 in 2024. Jake Bailey had 36 in 2019 and 31 in 2020.

## ONLY PATRIOT WITH TWO IN TWO

- Baringer has seven games in his career when he has had at least two 60-yard punts in the same game after a 71-yard and a 65-yard punt at Miami on Sept. 14, 2025. He is the only Patriots punter to ever have more than two games with at least two 60-yard punts in a game.

## FROM WALK-ON TO ALL-AMERICAN

- Baringer had an unconventional path to the NFL. He began his collegiate career by earning a walk-on spot at Illinois in 2018 as a true freshman, but due to being buried on the depth chart and the cost of out-of-state tuition, he transferred home to Michigan State as a regular student. Outside of a four-game stint on the Michigan State team due to injuries on the roster, Baringer did not have a walk-on spot available to him in 2019. After a year serving as the team's photographer to maintain access to the facilities to train, Baringer attended an open tryout with a new coaching staff at the Spartans and made the team, establishing himself as the Spartans top punter in 2020 and going on to have record-breaking seasons in 2021 and 2022. In 2022, he was named the Big 10 Punter of the Year and a consensus All-American by all five major associations.

## BARINGER SETS TEAM MARK

- Baringer had at least one 50-yard punt in all 17 games in 2023 to set the team record for the longest single season streak in team history (at any point of the season). Zoltan Mesko had a 12-game streak in 2011. Baringer extended his record to 27 games with a 50-yard punt after connecting on a 50-yard punt in the first 10 games of 2024 before the streak ended in the game vs. the LA Rams (11/17/24).

## RECORD BREAKING

- Baringer connected on a 79-yard punt in the second quarter vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 12, 2023 in Frankfurt, Germany, the fifth-longest punt in team history.

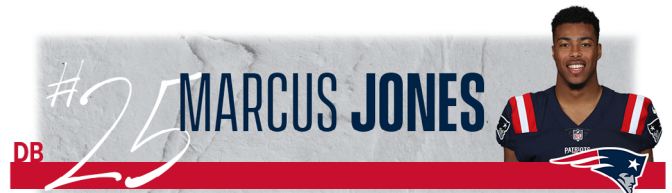

## WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2025

- CB Marcus Jones scored on a 48-yard touchdown reception vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1, 2022. If he scores on offense in 2025, he will join LB Mike Vrabel (8 touchdown receptions) as the only defensive player with more than 1 touchdown on offense in team history. Vrabel also has the most offensive touchdowns by an NFL defensive player with 10 in the regular season.
- Jones has returned three punts for touchdowns in his career. If he returns a kickoff for a touchdown in 2025, he will become the first New England player to return a punt and a kickoff for a touchdown and the first NFL player to do so in a season since WR KaVontae Turpin of Dallas in 2024.
- Jones handled kickoff and punt return duties as a rookie in 2022. He will look to become the first Patriots player to ever return a kickoff for a touchdown and punt for a touchdown in the same season and the first NFL player to accomplish the feat since 2024 when WR KaVontae Turpin did so for Dallas.
- Jones scored on offense, defense and special teams in 2022. He is the only player to score in all three phases in a single season since 1970. He is one of ten players to score on offense, defense and special teams during their NFL career.

- Jones finished second in the NFL in 2024 with a 14.8-yard punt return average (26 returns for 386 yards). He currently has the highest punt return average in team and NFL history with a 14.3 punt return yard average. His 17.3-yard punt return average in 2025 is second in the NFL to Chimere Dike of Tennessee with an 18.2-yard average. Jones's average would match the team record for a season set in 2020 by Gunner Olszewski.

## JONES TIES TEAM RECORD WITH 94-YARD PUNT RETURN

- Jones returned a first quarter punt 94 yards for a touchdown against the NY Giants (12/1/25) to tie the record for the longest punt return in team history. WR Julian Edelman had a 94-yard return for a touchdown vs. Miami on Jan. 2, 2011. Jones' previous best was his 87-yard punt return vs. Carolina on Sept. 28.

## FOURTH WITH TWO PUNTS RETURNED FOR A TD IN A SEASON

- Jones has now returned two punts for a touchdown in 2025 after his 94-yard return against the Giants. He returned a first quarter punt 87 yards for a touchdown vs. Carolina (9/28). Jones joins Troy Brown (2001), Irving Fryar (1985) and Mike Haynes (1976) as the only Patriots players to return two punts for a touchdown in a season.

## SECOND TOUCHDOWN ON AN INTERCEPTION RETURN

- Jones returned a second quarter interception 33 yards for a touchdown at Cincinnati (11/23/25). It is the second pick-6 of his career and second against Cincinnati. He had an interception that he returned 69 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter vs. Cincinnati on Dec. 24, 2022, as a rookie.

## PUNT RETURN FOR A TD AND PICK-6 IN 2025

- Jones now has a pick-6 and a punt return touchdown this season, his second season doing so in his career after his 2022 rookie campaign. He tied DB Nate Clements (2001, 2004) and DB Phillip Buchanon (2002-03) for the second-most such seasons of all time behind CB Deion Sanders (1990, 1997-98) who had three.

## JONES NAMED AFC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE MONTH

- Jones was named AFC Defensive Player of the Month for October in 2025 after recording 8 passes defended - tied for the most in the NFL - along with 20 tackles, 1 sack and 2 interceptions in the month. He is one of three defensive backs since 2000 with a tackle for a loss and a pass defended in four straight games. He helped the Patriots to a 4-0 record in October and played a key role in the defense that ranked fourth in the NFL in points allowed and ninth overall through the first eight weeks of the season.

- Jones has now qualified for the highest punt return average in NFL history.

## JONES SCORES ON OFFENSE, DEFENSE AND SPECIAL TEAMS

- Jones returned a third quarter interception 69 yards for a touchdown vs. Cincinnati on Dec. 24, 2022. He scored on a punt return for a touchdown, a touchdown reception and an interception returned for a touchdown to become the fourth player in NFL history to do so in a season, joining Frank Bacon (1920), Bill Dudley (1947) and Tommy Harmon (1947). Jones returned a punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets on Nov. 20 and scored on a 48-yard touchdown pass vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1 in addition to the pick-6 against the Bengals. The only other player in the Super Bowl era to score a 40-plus yard touchdown in each of those ways in their entire career is Deion Sanders.

## FIRST DB TO CATCH A TD ON OFFENSE SINCE 2000

- Jones, who made his first career start on defense vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1, 2022, also lined up on offense and scored on a 48-yard touchdown pass from QB Mac Jones on his first play from scrimmage in the first quarter. Jones became the first defensive back to record a touchdown reception on offense since 2000 when S Marcus Coleman of the New York Jets caught a 45-yard touchdown pass from QB Vinny Testaverde against Buffalo on Sept. 17, 2000. Jones caught 15 passes for 137 yards with one receiving touchdown during his college career. He scored on a 47-yard touchdown pass vs. Navy on Sept. 25, 2021. Jones joins LB Mike Vrabel (six 1-yard touchdowns and four 2-yard touchdowns from Tom Brady), LB Elandon Roberts (38-yard touchdown pass from Brady vs. Miami on Dec. 29, 2019) and LB/DE John Tanner (2-yard as the only pass from QB Jim Plunkett on Nov. 24, 1974 at Baltimore) as the only New England defensive players to catch touchdowns.

## FIRST PAT TO CATCH A TD ON FIRST RECEPTION SINCE 2019

- Jones was the first Patriots player to catch a touchdown on his first reception since LB Elandon Roberts caught a 38-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter vs Miami on Dec. 29, 2019. Jones's 48-yard touchdown on his first offensive play is the longest by a Patriots player on his first play since WR Stephen Starring caught a 73-yard touchdown pass from Steve Grogan on his first offensive play vs. Baltimore on Sept. 4, 1983.

## JONES RETURNS PUNT 84 YARDS FOR A TOUCHDOWN

- Jones returned a fourth quarter punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets on Nov. 20, 2022 with five seconds to play. Jones was the first player with a punt return for a touchdown in 2022. Jones' punt return for a touchdown is the first for the Patriots since Gunner Olszewski's 70-yard return at the LA Chargers on Dec. 6, 2020.

## LAST MINUTE GAME WINNER

- Jones is the sixth player in the NFL to record a game-winning punt-return for a touchdown in the final two minutes of regulation or in overtime since 1970, joining Patrick Peterson (Nov. 6, 2011), DeSean Jackson (Dec. 19, 2010), Brian Westbrook (Oct. 19, 2003), Tamarick Vanover (Oct 9, 1995) and Walter Stanley (Nov. 27, 1986).
- Jones' punt return for a touchdown with five seconds remaining vs. the New York Jets (11/20/22) marked the second-latest game-winning punt return for a touchdown in regulation since 1970, trailing only DeSean Jackson (no time remaining on Dec. 19, 2010) who returned a punt 65 yards for a touchdown in Philadelphia's win at the New York Giants.

## JONES' 84-YARD PUNT RETURN IS SECOND LONGEST GO-AHEAD TD IN 4TH QUARTER IN TEAM HISTORY

- Jones' 84-yard punt return for a touchdown is the second longest go-ahead fourth quarter touchdown in team history. The only longer return was the 91-yard missed field goal return for a touchdown by Ron Burton at Denver on Nov. 11, 1962.

## WEEK 11 AFC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Jones was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week by the National Football League for his performance in the Patriots 10-3 victory over the New York Jets in Week 11.

## JONES JOINS DEION SANDERS AS TRIPLE-THREAT

- Jones registered his first career interception in the third quarter at Arizona on Dec. 12, 2022. He had a 48-yard touchdown reception vs. Buffalo (12/1/22) and returned a punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets (11/20/22). The only other NFL player with a receiving touchdown, a punt or kick returned for a touchdown and an interception in the same season is Deion Sanders in 1992.

## WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2025

- S Brenden Schooler has led the Patriots in special teams tackles in each of his first three seasons with 14 in 2022, 13 in 2023 and 9 in 2024. He will look to become the first Patriots player in team history to lead the team in special teams tackles in each of his first four NFL seasons since 2000. He is currently second the team with 14 special teams tackles. Since 2000, Larry Izzo (five straight from 2001-05) and Matthew Slater (five straight from 2011-2015) were the only players to lead the Patriots in special teams tackles for at least three straight seasons regardless of their experience level before Schooler's current three-season streak.
- Across the NFL, there have been four players this century to lead the same team in special teams tackles in each of their first four NFL seasons:
  - Nick Bellore: 2011-14 - N.Y. Jets
  - Johnson Bademosi: 2012-15 - Cleveland
  - Justin Bethel: 2012-16 - Arizona (first five seasons)
  - Tyler Matakevich: 2016-19 - Pittsburgh
- Across the NFL, there have been five players this century to lead any team in special teams tackles in each of their first four NFL seasons:
  - Brendon Ayanbadejo: 2003-04 - Miami; 2005-07 - Chicago (first five seasons)
  - Nick Bellore: 2011-14 - N.Y. Jets; 2015 - San Francisco (first five seasons)
  - Johnson Bademosi: 2012-15 - Cleveland
  - Justin Bethel: 2012-16 - Arizona (first five seasons)
  - Tyler Matakevich: 2016-19 - Pittsburgh; 2020-21 - Buffalo (first five seasons)
- Schooler blocked a field goal in 2023 and a punt in 2024. If he records a blocked kick in 2025, he will join Chad Eaton (3 blocked field goals) for second in team history with 3 blocked kicks, behind the 6 blocked kicks by Richard Seymour (6 blocked field goals).
- Schooler would also join DL Chad Eaton (2 blocked field goals in 2000), DL Richard Seymour (2 blocked field goals in 2002), S Patrick Chung (1 blocked field goal and 1 blocked punt in 2010) and LB Shea McClellin (1 blocked extra point and 1 blocked field goal) as the only Patriots players with 2 blocked kicks in a season.

## PRO BOWL HONORS

- Schooler was named to the Pro Bowl on special teams in 2024 after leading the team with 9 special teams tackles. He was also named Associated Press All-Pro First Team, PFWA All-NFL and as an NFLPA Players All-Pro. Schooler led the Patriots in special teams tackles in each of his first two seasons with 14 in 2022 and 13 in 2023. Schooler had a career-high with 3 solo special teams tackles in the 2024 season-opener at Cincinnati on Sept. 24. It was the most special teams tackles in a game since S Cody Davis had 4 solo special teams tackles vs. the New York Jets on Oct. 24, 2021.

## SCHOOLER ROOKIE SPECIAL TEAMS ACE

- Schooler recovered his second fumble of the 2022 season on the punt return team when he recovered a muffed punt return by WR Chester Rogers in the fourth quarter at Cleveland (10/16/22). Schooler also recovered a muffed punt at Pittsburgh (9/18/22). Schooler had a team-leading 14 special teams tackles in 2022, including 11 solo special teams tackles.

## SCHOOLER RECORDS 1ST CAREER BLOCKED FIELD GOAL

- Schooler blocked a 49-yard field goal attempt in the third quarter vs. Miami on Sept. 17, 2023 for his first career field goal block. It was the Patriots first blocked field goal attempt since DB Cody Davis blocked a 58-yard attempt at the LA Chargers on Dec. 6, 2020 that was returned 44 yards for a touchdown by S Devin McCourty. In 2022, the Patriots had one blocked kick when DB Jonathan Jones blocked a punt vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 6, 2022. Schooler blocked at punt vs. Miami in the second quarter on Oct. 6, 2024.

## TIED FOR SECOND WITH 13 SPECIAL TEAMS TACKLES IN 2023

- Schooler reached double-digit special teams tackles in 2023 with 13 for the second straight season. As a rookie in 2022, he had a team-leading 14 special teams tackles. He is the first NFL player to begin his career with two straight 10-plus special teams tackle seasons since LB Grant Stuard with 11 special teams tackles in 2021 when he played with Tampa Bay and 11 special teams tackles in 2022 when he played for Indianapolis. Schooler finished tied for second in the NFL with 13 special teams tackles in 2023 and was named All-Pro as a core special teams player by the NFLPA.

## SCHOOLER SEES ACTION AT SAFETY; RECORDS FIRST-CAREER SACK

- Schooler saw action at safety in the second quarter at Chicago on Nov. 14, 2024. In 2023, he played in his first and only defensive snaps of his career on a Hail Mary attempt on the final plays vs. Buffalo (10/22/23) and at Denver (12/24/23). Schooler had his first-career sack in the third quarter on a 9-yard sack of QB Caleb Williams on a third-down play. He added his second sack of the year on a 7-yard sack of QB Tua Tagovailoa at Miami on Nov. 24, 2024 in the fourth quarter.
