2026 TRAINING CAMP PRESENTED BY NEW BALANCE

MEDIA SCHEDULE

Patriots rookies, along with a few select Patriots veterans, will report to training camp on Wednesday, July 22. The first day of media availability will be on Friday, July 24 when the remaining Patriots veterans report to camp. That day, Patriots Head Coach **Mike Vrabel** will be available to the media at 11:30 a.m. in the media workroom, followed by a few veteran players. The first public training camp practice will be on Saturday, July 25 at 10:30 a.m. The Patriots will host 13 days of public access at training camp practices this year, including three days of joint practices. TRAINING CAMP SUMMARY

Veterans Report to Training Camp on July 24; First Public Practice Set For July 25

The New England Patriots will open their 67th annual training camp with the first of 13 free public practices on Saturday, July 25, at 10:30 a.m. on the practice fields behind Gillette Stadium. A complete schedule of practice dates and times can be found in the accompanying column.

Admission to all public practices is free, as are parking at Gillette Stadium and access to the many fan activities surrounding the practice fields. General admission bleacher seating is available for thousands of fans on the west side of the fields, with additional seating located at the north end of the practice fields.

JOINT PRACTICE WITH TWO TEAMS

The Patriots will host a joint practice session with the Indianapolis Colts on Tuesday, Aug. 11 prior to the preseason game at Gillette Stadium on Thursday, Aug. 13. The Patriots will also host the Philadelphia Eagles for two days of joint practice sessions on Wednesday, Aug. 19 and Thursday, Aug. 20 prior to a preseason game on Saturday, Aug. 22.

PATRIOTS MEDIA INFORMATION

GENERAL MEDIA TRAINING CAMP POLICY

Practices throughout training camp are open to the media. In your coverage of daily practice sessions, we ask for your cooperation in observing the following practice policies:

1. Please do not report on non-conventional plays.
 2. Please do not take photos or report on any players who are rehabilitating on the lower practice fields.
 3. Live streaming of any video to the Internet or any other social media platform is prohibited.
 4. Video recording or photography of any kind (including from your phone) after the allotted camera access times is prohibited.
 5. For practices that are open to the public, media members may provide live coverage, including social media posts about practice activities, such as VIP visitors and notable individual plays. For practices that are closed to the public, no live reporting or social media updates are permitted. All coverage and practice-related content must be withheld until the practice has concluded.
 6. After practice, photographers and videographers are welcome to shoot any of the players who are engaged in media interviews or signing autographs. Photos with family members will require permission. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.
- If there are any questions regarding these policies during a practice session, please ask for clarification from a Patriots communications representative in advance. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

PHOTO AND VIDEO POLICY

Still photographers and TV cameras will be allowed to shoot a portion of each practice session. Times will likely vary. Members of the Patriots communications staff will notify all media when it is time to shut down. **Please do not use recordings of comments made by coaches during a practice session.** Photographer credentials will allow access to the north end of the field and in front of the ropes on the west sidelines. There will be no access to areas between the two fields or along the east sideline. We ask that you please adhere to the following guidelines at practice:

1. Please be respectful of the fans who are seated behind you. On the west sideline, we request that all photographers kneel in the areas immediately in front of the bleacher seating to minimize the obstructed views for our fans.
2. Please do not use photos showing personnel groupings or formations.
3. Please do not take any photos of the player family and guest area.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

TRAINING CAMP CREDENTIALS

A non-event photo identification badge will be issued to all approved media who regularly cover the Patriots. This photo ID will be required for access to all media-specific areas, including the media workroom, media tent and press availability areas. All others must register for a visitor's media pass with a member of the Patriots communications department in advance of arrival. To expedite the media check-in process, please remember to bring your outlet-issued photo ID. If you have any questions, please reach out to Julia Palin at jpalin@patriots.com.

Please do not post photos of your credentials online.

MEDIA PARKING

Enter the P1 entrance from Route 1, proceed past the security checkpoint and follow signs to the designated media parking lot (Lot 6B).

GAME CREDENTIALS

Sports editors and sports directors should have access to an individualized credential portal to submit all credential requests for their news affiliation each week. All entries must be submitted by Monday at 5 p.m. ET prior to that week's game. Approved credentials and parking passes will be issued on a weekly basis and can be picked up in person from the communications office. Please note, per the NFL's 2026 media access policy, there will be a limited allocation of 18 local media and broadcast television affiliates with field access, in addition to 12 for the visiting team. MEDIA SEATING AREAS

A media tent will be available to any media wishing to seek shade. The tent will be located atop the hillside in the north end zone between the VIP bleacher seating and the family tent area. Please show credentials for access to the tent. **Please Note: There is no media access to the VIP seating area or the family tent.**

MIKE VRABEL MEDIA AVAILABILITY

Patriots Head Coach Mike Vrabel will be available for the first time in the media workroom on Friday, July 24 at 11:30 a.m. Vrabel will be available to the media every other practice, throughout training camp, prior to that day's practice.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

At the request of media, the Patriots communications staff will only have two interview stations again this year, and we plan to bring up to six players to those stations after each practice. TV cameras will shoot from atop the hill near the media tent. We ask all reporters to please allow the cameras behind them unobstructed views to the players by standing to the side of each interview station or by kneeling/sitting in front. New England's Pro Football Writers Association representative, Andrew Callahan, will collect and prioritize all player requests from the media and provide to the Patriots communications staff. Any additional requests can be made through the Patriots communications staff. Please try to make all requests in advance so it can be communicated prior to each practice.

RAIN POLICY

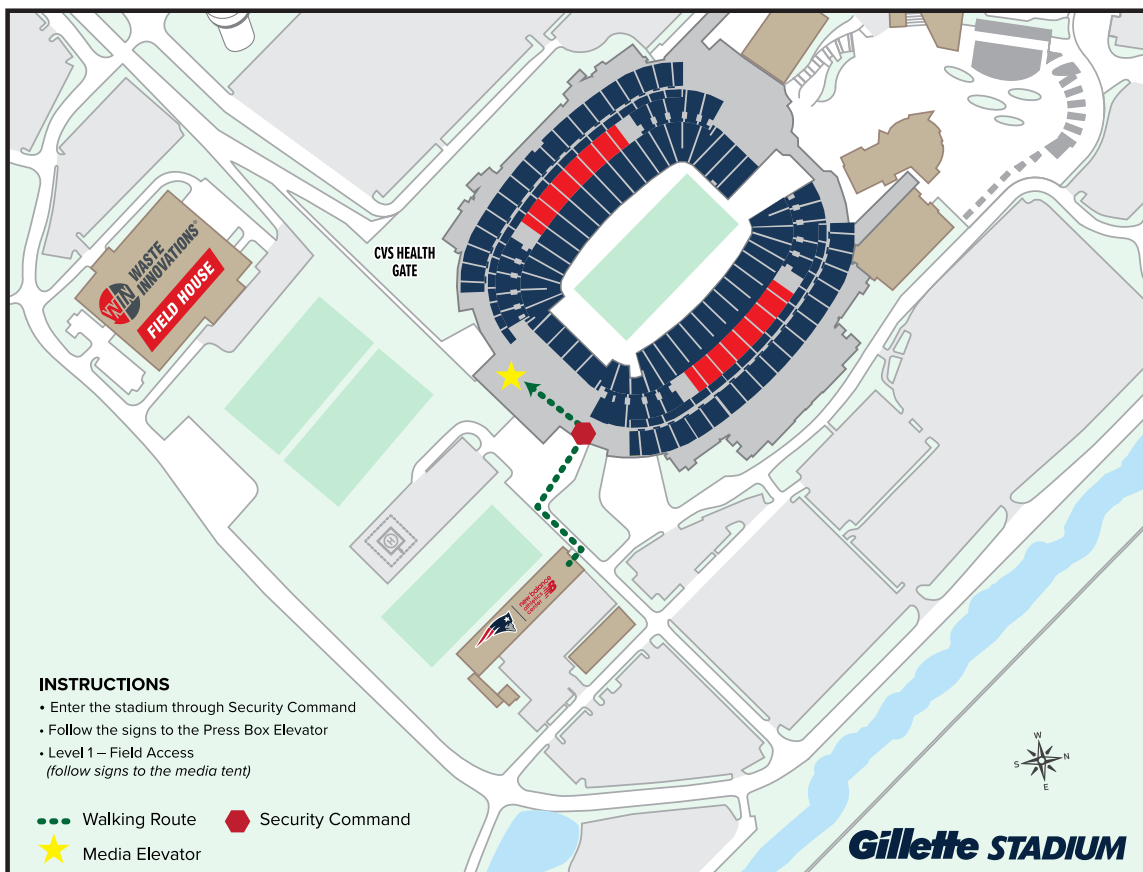
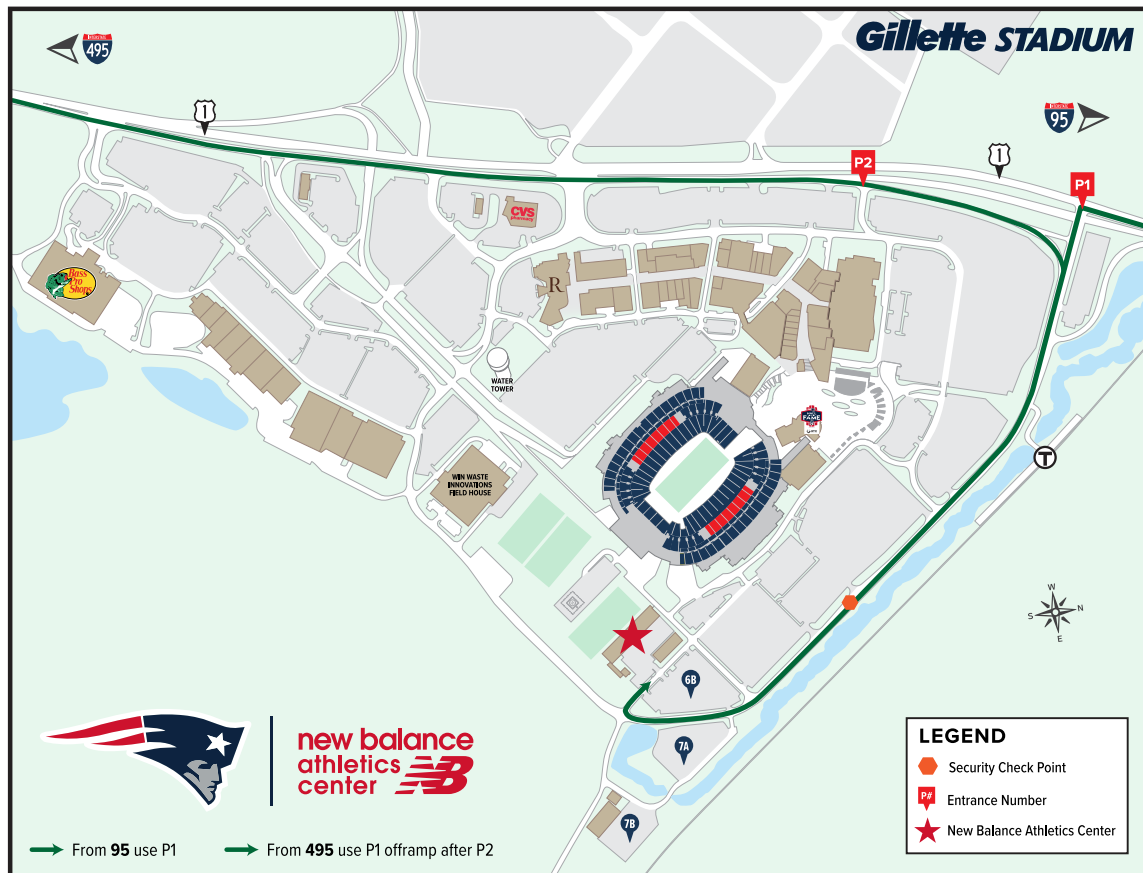

ROSTER REDUCTION DATE

PATRIOTS PROSHOP

The Patriots ProShop will be open daily on all days that the public has access to practice. The ProShop is located on the northeast corner of the stadium below the Patriots Hall of Fame presented by RTX. Fans attending training camp and parked on the west side of the stadium may access the ProShop via the staircase on the north end of the stadium. Times will vary depending on the daily practice schedule, opening at least one hour before each practice session.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

To ensure an enjoyable experience for all, fans entering Training Camp will be required to go through security screening and have all bags inspected by our security personnel.

Fans may bring their own collapsible chairs and strollers.

Video cameras and detachable lens cameras are not allowed. Photographs taken with cell phones and non-detachable lens cameras are welcome, but we ask fans not to shoot or post practice video of any kind.

While bags are permitted at Training Camp, we encourage fans to use clear bags for speed of inspection and entry.

Please refer to the Prohibited Items list below for items not allowed at entry at Training Camp:

- Animals, except service animals assisting those with disabilities.
- Any alcoholic beverages
- Beach balls
- Bullhorns, air horns and other noise makers
- Coolers
- Detachable lens cameras
- Drones or other forms of remote-controlled aircrafts
- Fireworks or pyrotechnics
- Flags will be allowed, however those over two feet in length will not be allowed.
- Helium balloons
- Laser pens
- Non-prescription or illegal drugs
- Selfie sticks
- Tripods
- Video cameras
- Weapons of any kind (including knives)
- Any other item deemed inappropriate by stadium management

Fans are reminded to please leave all such items appropriately secured in their vehicles.

Individuals with possession of a prohibited item(s) may be denied admission to training camp, ejected, and or prosecuted. Prohibited items that are discovered at Training Camp will be confiscated.

CONCESSIONS

The concession stands at Training Camp offer fans a variety of food and drink options.

PARKING

Parking is free throughout training camp. Tailgating is not permitted in the lots during training camp.

- P Bryce Baringer enters the 2026 season with a team record 47.9-yard punting average.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2026

- K Andy Borregales made all four of his 50-plus field goal attempts in 2025 as a rookie. The Patriots record for most consecutive 50-plus field goals is eight by Stephen Gostkowski (2013-15). The NFL record for most consecutive 50-yard field goals to start a career is Brandon Aubrey with Dallas, who made 16 straight 50-yard field goals (2023-24).



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2026

- WR A.J. Brown enters the 2026 season with four straight 1,000-yard seasons. He has at least 1,000 yards receiving in six of his seven NFL seasons. If he reaches, 1,000 yards in 2026 he will be one of seven NFL players to have seven or more 1,000-yard seasons in his first eight NFL seasons.

- Since 2019, Brown is tied with Ja'Marr Chase and D.K. Metcalf for the most 50-yard receptions with 15.
- Brown's 10 50-yard touchdown receptions since 2019 are the third-most, behind the 14 by Ja'Marr Chase and 11 by Tyreek Hill.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2026

- S Kevin Byard III led the NFL in interceptions in 2025 with 7 picks while with the Chicago Bears. If he leads the NFL in interceptions in 2026, he will be just the third player since 1970 to lead the league in two consecutive years, joining Everson Walls (Dallas in 1981-82) and Bill Bradley (Philadelphia -1971-72).
- Led the NFL with 7 interceptions in 2025 with Chicago and also tied for the NFL lead with 8 interceptions in 2017 with Tennessee. Byard joined Bill Bradley (Philadelphia – 1971-1972), Xavien Howard (Miami – 2018, 2020), Ty Law (New England in 1998 and N.Y. Jets in 2005), Ronnie Lott (San Francisco – 1986 and L.A. Raiders – 1991), Asante Samuel (New England in 2006 and Philadelphia in 2009), Darren Sharper (Green Bay in 2000 and New Orleans in 2009), Charles Woodson (Green Bay 2009, 2011) and Rod Woodson (Baltimore in 1999 and Oakland in 2002) as the only NFL players since 1970 to lead the NFL in interception in two seasons.
- If he leads the NFL in interceptions in 2026, he will join Ed Reed (Baltimore – 2004, 2008 and 2010) and Everson Wallas (Dallas – 1981, 1982 and 1985) as the only NFL players since 1970 to lead the NFL in interceptions in three seasons.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2026

- LB Christian Elliss had a team-leading 18 total special teams tackles in 2025. If he reaches at least 15 special teams tackles in 2026, he will be the first Patriots player with at least 15 special teams tackles in back-to-back seasons since Matthew Slater had 16 special teams tackles in back-to-back seasons in 2014 and 2015.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2026

- RB TreVeyon Henderson rushed for 147 yards on 10 carries for a 10.5-yard average at Tampa Bay (11/9/25). He rushed for 148 yards on 14 carries for a 10.6-yard average vs. Buffalo (12/14/25). Henderson has two of the team's eight games where a rusher finished with an average of at least 10.0 yards per carry and the only one to have two games with a 10.0-yard average in the same season. The only other Patriots player to have two games with a 10.0-yard average in their career with the team was Larry Garron (1961 and 1962). If Henderson has a game with 10.0-yard average in 2026, he will be the first Patriots player with three such games..
- RB TreVeyon Henderson recorded 911 rushing yards in his rookie season. If he records 1,089 rushing yards in 2026, he will become the fourth running back in franchise history to have 2,000 rushing yards over his first two seasons.

- Henderson set the Patriots rookie record with a 5.1-yard rushing average in 2025. The best two-year average for a Patriots running back to start his career was 4.9 by Damien Harris (2019-20).
- Henderson had four 50-yard touchdown runs in 2025. The NFL record for most 50-yard run touchdown in a career is 16 by Adrian Peterson.
- Henderson had four rushes of 50 yards or more in his first NFL season. Since 2000, 10 players have had five or more 50-yard runs through two seasons.

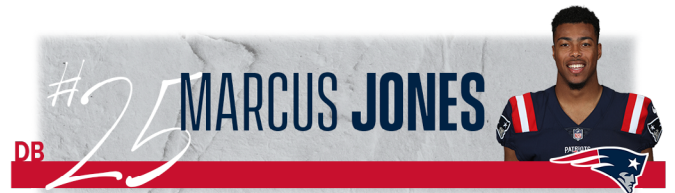

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2026

- TE Hunter Henry enters the 2026 season ranked third on the all-time reception list among New England tight ends with 259 receptions, fourth in receiving yards with 2,973 and fourth with 26 touchdown receptions. He needs 41 receptions to become the third New England tight end to reach 300 receptions, 27 receiving yards to join Rob Gronkowski (7,861), Ben Coates (5,471) and Russ Francis (3,157) as the only Patriots tight ends to reach 3,000 receiving yards and 4 touchdowns to join Gronkowski (79) and Coates (50) as the only Patriots tight ends with 30 touchdowns.
- Henry has logged at least 40 receptions in all five seasons with the Patriots (60 receptions in 2025), the second-longest streak by a Patriots tight end all-time to Ben Coates, who had 40 or more receptions in six straight seasons. If Henry has at least 40 receptions in 2026, he will match Coates for the longest such streak in team history.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2026

- CB Marcus Jones enters the 2026 season first in NFL history with a 14.3-yard punt return average (79 returns for 1,132 yards).
- Jones scored on a 48-yard touchdown reception vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1, 2022. If he scores on offense in 2026, he will join current head coach and former LB Mike Vrabel (8 touchdown receptions) as the only defensive player with more than one touchdown on offense in team history. Vrabel also has the most offensive touchdowns by an NFL defensive player with 10 in the regular season.
- Jones has returned three punts for touchdowns during his career, including two in 2025. If Jones returns a punt for a touchdown in 2026, he will join Julian Edelman (4) for the all-time lead in team history.



PATRIOTS WHAT TO LOOK FOR 2026

- Jones returned two punts for touchdowns in 2025. If Jones returns two punts for a touchdown in 2026, he will be the first Patriots player with two punts returned for a touchdown in at least two seasons and the first NFL player with two punts returned for a touchdown in back-to-back seasons since Darren Sproles in 2014 and 2015 with Philadelphia.
- If Jones returns a punt for a touchdown in 2026, he will join Julian Edelman (2010-12), Troy Brown (2000-01), and Irving Fryar (1985-86) as the only Patriots players to return at least one punt for a touchdown in back-to-back seasons.
- If he returns a kickoff for a touchdown in 2026, he will become the first New England player to return a punt and a kickoff for a touchdown. Jones has returned three punts for a touchdown throughout his career.
- Jones finished tied for first in the NFL in 2025 with Tennessee WR Chimere Dike with a 17.3-yard punt return average. That average also tied the highest single-season mark in Patriots history.

- Jones enters the 2026 season with a team-leading five punt returns of 60-plus yards, the most among all active NFL players.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2026

- QB Drake Maye enters the 2026 season in eighth place in team history with 6,670 passing yards and needs 3,330 passing yards in 2026 to become the sixth Patriots player to reach 10,000 passing yards.
- Maye enters the 2026 season with a team-best 69.8 career completion percentage.
- In 2025, Maye led the NFL and set a team record with a 72.0 completion percentage. If Maye completes at least 70 percent of his passes in 2026, he will be only the third NFL player with multiple seasons of at least a 70.0 completion percentage, joining Joe Burrow (2021 and 2024) and Drew Brees (2009, 2011, 2016-20). Additionally, Maye would be the second NFL player with a completion percentage of 70.0 or better in back-to-back years, joining Brees (2016-20).
- If Maye leads the NFL in completion percentage for a second straight season, he will be the first Patriots player to accomplish the feat and become the sixth NFL player since 1970 to do so.

- Maye passed for 4,394 yards in 2025. If he reaches 4,000 passing yards in 2026, he will join Drew Bledsoe (two) and Tom Brady (11) as the only Patriots quarterbacks with more than one 4,000-yard season. Brady is the only Patriots quarterback that has accomplished the feat in consecutive seasons (2011-15 and 2017-19).
- In 2025, Maye threw 31 touchdowns to join Tom Brady (seven) and Babe Parilli (one) as the only Patriots to have a 30-touchdown season. If Maye throws for 30 touchdowns in 2026, he will join Brady as the only Patriots players with 30 touchdowns in consecutive seasons. Brady threw for 30 touchdowns in consecutive seasons from 2010-12 and again from 2014-15.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2026

- S Brenden Schooler blocked a field goal in 2023 and a punt in 2024. If he records a blocked kick in 2026, he will join Chad Eaton (3 blocked field goals) for second in team history with 3 blocked kicks, behind the 6 blocked kicks by Richard Seymour (6 blocked field goals).
- Schooler had his third season reaching double-digit special teams tackles after finishing the 2025 season with 14 total special teams tackles. If he reaches at least 10 special teams tackles in 2026, he will be the eighth Patriots player with at least four seasons where he reached double-digit special teams tackles.

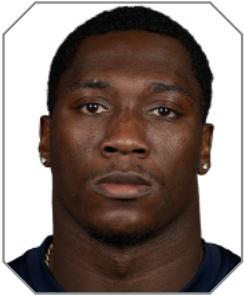
WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2026

- RB Rhamondre Stevenson recorded his first 1,000-yard rushing season with a career-high 1,040 rushing yards in 2022. He can become the third New England player to reach at least two 1,000-yard rushing seasons, joining Curtis Martin (three) and Jim Nance (two).
- Stevenson enters the 2026 season in fifth place in team history with 3,669 rushing yards and needs 331 yards to join Sam Cunningham (5,453), Jim Nance (5,323) and Tony Collins (4,647) as the only Patriots players to reach 4,000 rushing yards.
- Stevenson enters the 2026 season in fifth place on the team's all-time rushing list with 3,669 yards and needs 131 yards rushing to move past Curtis Martin (3,799) into fourth place on the all-time list.
- Stevenson enters the 2026 season in ninth place with 28 rushing touchdowns and needs two in 2026 to join Jim Nance (45), Sam Cunningham (43), Corey Dillon (37), Steve Grogan (35), LeGarrette Blount (34), Tony Collins (32) and Curtis Martin (32) as the only Patriots players with 30 rushing touchdowns.
- Stevenson enters the 2026 season with 186 receptions, the fifth-most among all New England running backs. He needs 14 receptions in 2026 to join Kevin Faulk (431), James White (381), Tony Collins (261) and Sam Cunningham (210) as the only New England running backs with 200 receptions.

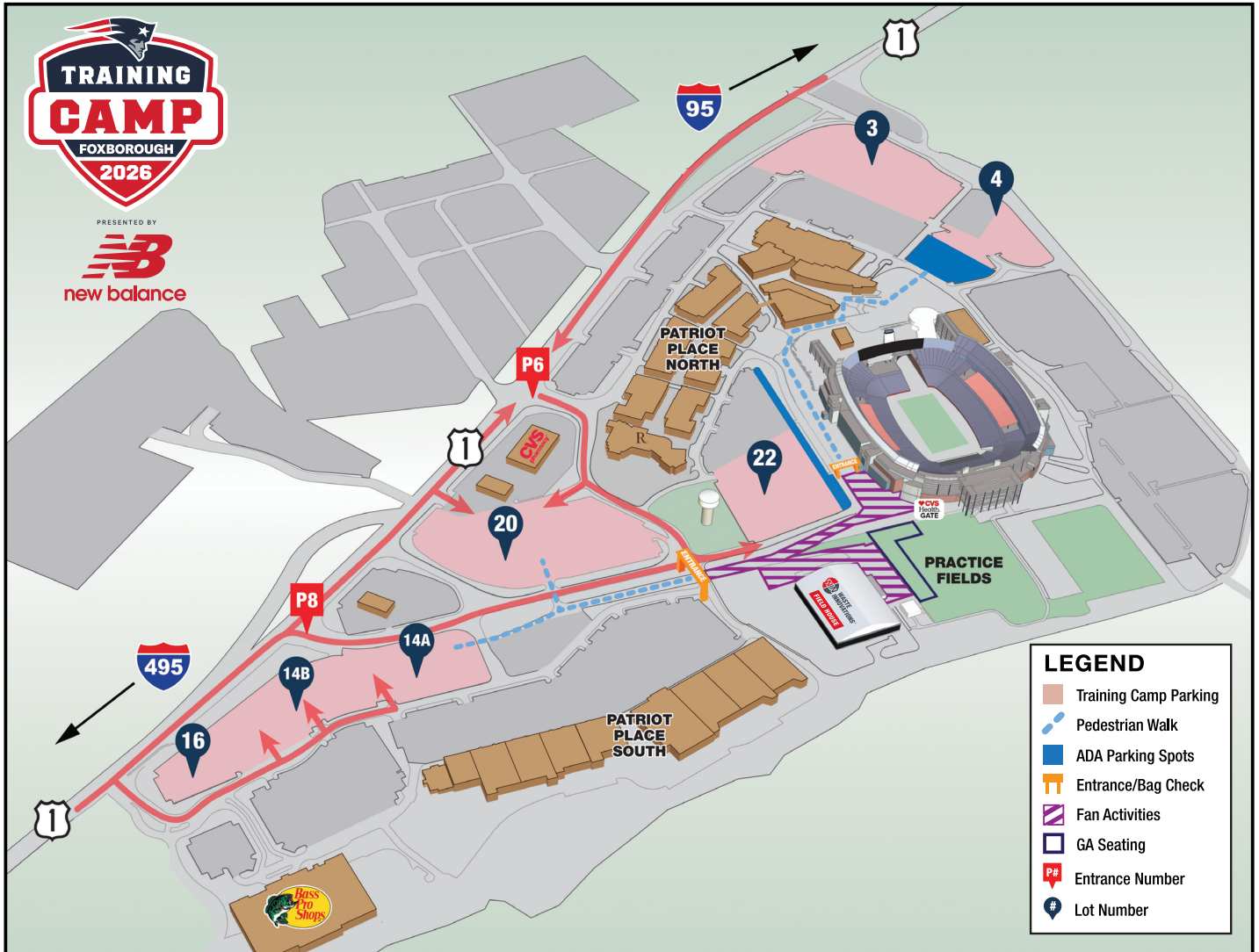
